LETTER FROM THE VICARAGE:

Easter Day is very early this year in fact it's the earliest the day has actually fallen since 1913 and as I write this letter we are rapidly approaching the mid point of our Lenten Observances. It is truly significant this early date of Easter, both in the life of the Church as well as in the life of the Vicar, and I will explain the latter after the former.

Easter comes upon us rapidly and that is in itself significant for it reminds us of the very first Easter Day and the Easter Days of the very Early Church. Jesus in a few short years of active ministry finally sets his sights on Jerusalem and the Easter Liturgy of the Church picks this up beautifully. Soon we shall be celebrating his triumphant entry into the holy city, and the days following Palm Sunday reflect both the coming of the Cross and the glorious Resurrection. The liturgy does this by concentrating our minds on the Passion of Christ which is why traditionally on Palm Sunday we abandon a sermon and instead have the reading of the entire Passion Narrative from one of the Gospels. We do this to set the scene to remind all in Church of the whole event and then in the days following we focus our minds in prayer and reflection on the final days of our Lords human life with us on earth.

The Early Church placed huge emphasis on this Holiest of times, especially in the first years when the second coming of Jesus was expected imminently, Easter Day was the day for entry into the Church and those who were to be baptised were prepared in readiness for that glorious day. The day when our Lord conquers death and the day when through Baptism so do we. For it is through our entry into the community of the faithful that we rise with Christ into the promise of salvation history.

Easter is the time when we truly say alleluia! He is risen, and we say this in the liturgy because through baptism we ourselves engage in the blessing of Christ's Resurrection. Being born of the Spirit through Baptism into the lords body is what we celebrate on Easter Day and that is why it is so supremely important that every baptised person comes to Church, it is a day of obligation, because if you are not in Church on that day you cannot truly claim to have responded to the call of the Spirit within you. Easter Day is your opportunity to say yes I believe in the Lord Jesus, surely we can give him one day of our lives in return for all that he has given us.

This then leads me to why Easter day is significant to me personally, it just so happens that as the Church celebrates its true birthday the day of new life for all, so too does the Vicar, well at least sometimes!! The last year Easter Day fell on my birthday was in 2002, and the next time this will occur will be in 2013, and the point of me telling you is simply this, birthdays are always very special but Easter Day itself far surpasses them, you can wish me a happy birthday the next time it falls on Easter Day but don't wait until 2013 until you come to give thanks to God for the blessing of the day of Resurrection which brings new life and a new beginning to us all.

May each and every one of you have a Holy and Spirit filled Easter.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS Summary of meeting – 21st January, 2008

Ø A WLDC Street Force Warden gave a brief talk on the Street Force warden scheme. The scheme has been set up to tackle environmental crime, such as fly tipping, dog fouling/control, littering, graffiti, noise, etc., and promotes a partnership with PCSOs. Offenders can be interviewed under caution and fined and/or taken to court. Anybody wanting to report an offence should ring WLDC on 01427 676676. The Warden is to check that if dog bins could be emptied more often.

Ø The Clerk was asked to contact

- 1. LCC Highways, Anglian Water, WLDC Environmental Health and the Environment Agency concerning the continuing problem with flooding throughout the village.
- 2. WLDC to ask if the road sweeper can clean around The Crescent and if the Chapel Road sign at the end of The Crescent can be repaired
- 3. LCC Highways re potholes on Blacksmith Road
- 4. LCC Street Lighting Section about a lamp not working on Priory Drive
- Ø LCC Street Lighting Team are prepared to install a free-standing lamp post along the bottom of High Meadows, providing there is no objection from the residents of that road
- **Ø** The requests for speed reduction measures and for a footpath/cycle path from Fiskerton to Cherry Willingham are to be added to LCC Highways' lists for investigation
- Ø Veolia ES (UK) Limited will continue to cut the grass in the village
- Ø Play area: Following a meeting with EON re electrical safety measures, warning signs will be put up in the area close to the electricity pylon. All funding is now accounted for. It is hoped that work will commence in February.
- **Ø** Planning permission has been granted for an application for extensions and alterations to existing private dwelling at the Forge, Blacksmith Road
- Ø WLDC is proposing to provide bulk bags of sand and sandbags for use in times of flooding emergencies. It would need to be stored and managed by parish councils. Councillors are investigating where such equipment could be stored and who will look after distribution. If anyone is aware of a facility where sand and sandbags could be stored (undercover) then please contact the Clerk.
- Ø District Councillor Mrs. Davidson welcomed senior citizen bus passes being valid nationally; however, due to financial restraints, it is likely that a time restriction from 9.30 a.m. to 11 p.m. will apply in Lincolnshire. She is trying to find out whether an exception can be made in the case of the 9.03 a.m. bus from Short Ferry.
- Ø The problem of finding a village playing field will be discussed at the Annual Parish Meeting.
- **Ø** <u>Date of Next Meeting</u>: Monday, 17th March, 2008. The Parish Council meeting will start at 6.45 p.m. followed by the Annual Parish Meeting at 7.30 p.m.

A PLAYING FIELD?

It has been suggested that one matter that needs discussion at the Annual Parish Meeting is the possibility of providing a new playing field for the village. The Church Commissioners have decided not to lease the old playing field to the Parish Council for this purpose.

Some of the questions that need to be addressed are -

- 1. Where can a new playing field be located?
- 2. Can a playing field with football and cricket pitches be viable without a sports club to use and run it?
- 3. Who is willing to try and form a sports club? Would a sports club be prepared to take the lead?
- 4. Can the village afford this type of facility? If so, how will the finance be raised to get it off the ground and, more importantly, how will the on-going costs be met?

THE NEW PLAY AREA

A new play area, youth shelter and sports wall have been provided in the grounds of the village hall. It's a bit of a tight squeeze but the annual fun day and other outdoor events should still be able to take place without too much difficulty, especially with the support of the Scouts.

Parish Councillor Neil French (01522 753432) has agreed to 'look after' the new facility, so please let him know if you see any problems. The Parish Council hopes that the area does not attract vandalism and that the children and youngsters of the village take ownership of the facility and help Neil to keep it safe, tidy and well maintained.

The Council has consulted Eon regarding the power line that runs along the back of the grounds of the Village Hall. I deally, the Parish Council would like to bury the cable but this would cost an awful lot of money. The equipment has been sited according to Eon's safety standards with appropriate notices that state - Danger! - No climbing - No kite flying. Finally, thanks to all the children who gave their advice on the equipment that should be provided and particularly the School and Pre-School Group for testing it once it was provided!
