An 'incident' happens on one side of the world and within minutes recorded images are broadcast globally, often before the media can react. A group of friends meet in Lincoln, not a pre-arranged meeting at a particular place and time but a spontaneous gathering 'drawn together' through mobile phone 'texting'. The power of instant communication.

In this age of the Silicon chip, technology is now developing Nano Memory which uses individual molecules to store data. Confused? Imagine all the books in the British Library stored within an area the size of a twenty pence piece. Imagine human and computer interaction, carbon and silicon amalgamation; tiny computer implants enabling the deaf to hear and the blind to see.

This is not science fiction but a part of the technological revolution that is shaping the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. For you who cry 'it's a young persons thing' sorry, the 'silver surfers' are proving equally adaptable, skilled and proficient within the 'dot com' world. How are we to respond? Yes, this revolution presents moral and ethical challenges but the answer is not to bury our heads but to write in the silicon (John 8:3-11) and engage with technology, to see and make sense of our world. It is already affecting the way we communicate the Gospel, as 'blogging' and 'social networking sites' globally share information, understandings, and beliefs. The collage of God pieced together in cyberspace!
