I even got a day off this year something which has never happened before!! But I must admit I was a bit lost not having anything active to do so I fitted in a little training for a race I am running soon by completing an 8 mile run around Ambleside. Who says the vicar is past it!!!!



Police News

Welcome to this month's Edition of Police News. I'd like to start this month's edition by sending out a reminder about the use of mini motorcycles, gopeds, etc, on public roads and in public areas. These areas also include public footpaths, etc. There has been a lot of media attention recently about this issue, and I think it is an important one that needs raising again, and people need to be aware of. In a nutshell if you take any motorised scooter, whether it is a mini motorcycle, a goped, or anything similar, onto a public road or into a public area then it falls into the same category as a normal moped or motorbike. That means you will need a license to ride it, you will need to have insurance for it and an MOT if required. You will also be required to wear a safety helmet, and have the vehicle taxed. It also comes under the same requirements as a normal moped or motorbike in relation to lights, etc. It must have proper working lights, front and rear, as well as fully working brakes, legal tyres, etc. They would also come under the Road Traffic Act, and therefore anyone found contravening the requirements can be prosecuted, as a moped or motorcycle rider would. You also run the risk of having the vehicle seized and having to pay a hefty fine to get it back, or having it crushed!! The only place you can ride these vehicles in on private land, and with the permission of the landowner.

August saw the start of a new drive by officers at Nettleham police station to crack down on people who park cars that completely obstruct the footpaths. Many do it with the best of intentions by trying to keep the roads clear, but in doing so make it impossible for pedestrians to pass. For the more minor offences we will warn and advise motorists that their actions are illegal and request that vehicles are moved. For the more blatant offences, where drivers park cars knowing they completely block the footpath, there will be no warnings and £30 Fixed Penalty Ticket will be issued. We will of course try to be sympathetic to the needs of the community and businesses alike, and not take a zero tolerance approach, but there seems to be a noticeable increase in the number of offences being committed, which cannot be allowed to continue. This will continue for the foreseeable future.

Over the past few months Jackie and I have received reports about youths being on school premises in an evening when the school is closed. Teenagers and parents alike need to be aware that whilst the school is closed permission to enter school grounds, which includes playing fields, etc, is withdrawn (except in an emergency). There are specific offences relating to being on school premises, including causing a nuisance for example, which can be enforced if necessary. Some schools have excellent CCTV systems in place, which cover most areas of the schools, and we can use these to identify anyone recorded within school grounds without permission, and commence proceedings against them.

- Ø The Parish Council is still trying to get the problem of flooding within the village addressed by all responsible agencies. Progress is slow but things do seem to be happening, we will keep you posted.
- Ø A report on Crime Prevention measures for the village hall has been sent to the Village Hall Management Committee
- Ø Planning permission has been granted for applications to erect a single storey side extension at The Paddocks, Nelson Road and to construct a boundary wall with iron railings and gates at Five Mile House, High Street.
- Ø A new type of sandbag has been designed, they are lighter and easier to store WLDC are hoping to set aside monies to help householders purchase these bags details to follow
- Ø Ferry Road resurfacing; another 500 metres will be resurfaced in LCC's 2009/2010 budget. Councillor Fleetwood was asked that traffic lights be installed during works to keep the road open
- Ø A vacancy has arisen for an Echo Correspondent. If any villager is willing to cover village activities, they should contact the Lincolnshire Echo and inform the Parish Council.
