A Quiet Reflection on the discernment of a calling!!

When God speaks people listen:

But people, having heard, do not always respond. I can recall many a lecture in my time which has kept me on the edge of my seat, I have truly engaged with it and felt the power of the words being given to me. Once the lecture is over, I may reflect on the presence presented by the speaker, share a few thoughts with those around me, and then promptly move on to the next lecture. I may well have learned something from that lecture but very rarely have the words of another person ever really challenged me to make a difference to the way in which I live my life.

People speaking is one thing, God speaking is quite another.

Being called by God is such a wonderfully uplifting concept, but it is also a very troubled one, for God does not call us to be comfortable, or to be contented, God always calls us into him and out of ourselves.

The Prophet Isaiah at the point of his calling said:

'Here I am send me.'

Within the response of the prophet to the divine, we see so much of what calling is all about. 'Woe is me', how often have we said those very words, often when God speaks people withdraw into themselves, which is of course exactly the opposite of what is asked for, calling is by its very nature a request to come out, to be noticed to become something other than that which we were before.

A calling from God is thus not so much a gift but a request, it is very much a request to respond to challenge, to risk and to change,

What is the point of being forgiven and cleansed if those who are called do not seize upon the moment and come forth into the presence of the power of God.

At the point of the conversion of St. Paul we see a member of the church being called into action, upon his calling from the Lord Ananias had to take the risk of approaching a man whom he feared greatly, Ananias responded to the call placed his trust in his faith ignored the danger and came out of himself and into the power of the Lord.

God, when he calls, changes lives but only if those who hear have the courage to respond, it is at the point of response that those being called into the Lord's service find themselves today.

Ministry within the Church is evolving, more and more people are being called to respond and it is therefore a time for great rejoicing in the Church.

Change within the Church of Christ is not directed by expediency, by fears and uncertainty about finance, nor should change in the Church ever be made simply for the future of the Church itself; for the Church does not merely exist to fulfil a function, it is to be a living and vibrant reality within the life of humanity, to promote to teach and to give guidance to the children of God, being called out of ourselves and into God, means that we as disciples of today are called to respond bearing in mind the cost of God's calling.

Jesus revealed the cost of discipleship to St. Paul and revealed it powerfully through the simple action of sending Ananias.

The sight of Paul was only restored not by the power of God but simply through the faith of a simple follower of Christ.

Those of us called today must recognise that our calling is not simply to fulfil a role but rather to allow that role to change our lives and the lives of others.

Being called by God is not a gift but a request, may all who are called to serve seek to respond to that request by coming out of themselves and into God. It is only through our response to the divine to the call of Christ within us that we will ever be able to find the strength we need to act like Ananias and to boldly take the challenge and the risk of faith. May we upon hearing the call of God have the faith to respond to it, fulfilling that first commandment, to Love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul and with all our mind, and to love our neighbour as ourselves.

Thanks be to God for calling us out of ourselves and into the power of his love.



Police News

Welcome to this month's Edition of Police News.

At a recent meeting of the areas Neighbourhood Panel only one new priority was decided on for the next three months. Thankfully, none of them are in **Fiskerton**, which still remains one of the lowest crime areas in the division. The new priority is as follows, 1) ASB in Cherry Willingham on and around the playing fields on Laburnum Drive.

Despite none of the priorities being in **Fiskerton** we will still continue to patrol and monitor all areas of the village, and recognise that there has been anti social behaviour in the past. At present there are very few incidents of anti social behaviour in the village, however we are aware of some instances around the village hall where graffiti has been daubed on the walls. We will continue to monitor this area in an effort to identify those responsible and take the appropriate action where necessary. Can I also remind parents that you have a responsibility to ensure you know where your children are and what they are up to? Simply burying your head in the sand and claiming ignorance is no longer acceptable, and you may be asked to explain why you weren't aware what your children were up to or where they were? We've also had problems with youths around the Scout Hut, causing problems and shouting obscenities at the Scouts and Scout leaders, and also some damage to the school. The same names keep cropping up, and their parents will be informed, but in the meantime if you see or hear of any problems in **Fiskerton** then please let me know. Remember, all information passed will be kept strictly confidential.

Over the past few weeks there have been a number of thefts in the area, particularly in Nettleham, North Greetwell, and Bardney. The thefts have been during the hours of darkness, and the items that have been targeted are stone garden ornaments. Some of the items that have already been taken are quite heavy and would clearly need two people and a vehicle. So far no one has seen or heard anything suspicious, giving rise to the possibility that those responsible are taking great care not to disturb anyone. If you have the facility to secure your items i.e. concreting them to a slab, then please consider it. Alternatively, you could mark your ornaments in such a way that should they be stolen they can be identified as yours. I know that some people have put a small dab of paint on them somewhere discreet, or even scratched something on the base.

In relation to speeding, we will also continue to monitor the traffic flow through the village by carrying out random speed checks in an effort to slow people down. These will continue to be monitored for the foreseeable future and the appropriate action taken where necessary.

3. MMR Catch Up Campaign

You may know that there has been a rise in the number of measles cases in the UK recently. We now know that a second dose of MMR is needed to give full immunity and that it is sensible to give this both to children and teenagers. This is because immunization rates fell back following the scare a few years ago about a possible link between MMR vaccine and autism, this has now been refuted. PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Summary of meeting – 15th September, 2008

- Ø The Clerk was asked to contact
 - a) LCC Highways about having the hedge around the Manor Farm Paddock cut back and the condition the grass area on The Crescent is left in after grass has been cut.
 - b) WLDC about the broken name plate for Plough Lane
 - c) The Police and Road Safety Partnership to undertake speed traps/checks along Chapel Road
- There is a problem with a villager putting a large amount of dog waste in a plastic carrier bag outside the dog waste bin on Chapel Road, this is then being spread elsewhere buy youths. Dog owners are reminded that, under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act, 1966 it is an offence not to clear up after a dog has fouled. Waste should be put inside the dog bin, not left outside. This order covers most roads, footpaths, grass verges, playing fields, parks and other public areas in towns and villages in West Lindsey. Anyone found guilty of an offence under this act can face a fine of up to £1000.
- Ø All public footpaths have been cut. Footpath 119 (from High Meadows towards the airfield) would require a Legal Order to alter its line; this will be investigated and resolved subject to the availability of resources to undertake Legal Order work.
- Ø The meeting was informed that the Quad bike track is still in use, in spite of having their request to appeal the Planning decision rejected. Councillor Mrs. Davidson will inform WLDC Enforcement Officer that the quad bike track is still being used even though an enforcement notice to stop has been issued. The Clerk was asked to write to that department asking for them to arrange police action.
- Ø The request for a change of bus stop site from outside Tanya to nearer Hall Lane will be considered by the appropriate authorities at a later date. Six bus stops are to be made more accessible to travellers, and will include timetable boards and specialist raised kerbs; two will also have solar lights.
- Ø The Flood Warden reported that sandbags are to be used at our discretion where we see fit and to whom we deem as a priority. If bags are used, they will be replaced, hopefully at no cost. In the event of a flood, the Environment Agency would contact the Flood Warden who would then co-ordinate the situation the Environment Agency has given him a list of residents classed as vulnerable.
- Ø Planning permission has been granted to the following:
 - a) a development to carry out workovers and extended well tests on the disused airfield
 - b) an application to construct a new bunded area, security fencing and to carry out an extended well test for hydrocarbons at the Reepham Well.
 - c) an application for single storey extension at Swallow Grange, Nelson Road.
- Ø A decision was reached to pass on information concerning any planning applications that would affect the villagers. These will now be announced in the Parish News, with further information and comments being sent to WLDC Planning Department.
- Ø Discussions are in hand at WLDC to provide free green bins to pensioners
- **Ø** Date of Next Meeting: Monday, 27th October, 2008 7.30 p.m.
