Letter from the Vicarage:

Vicar on the move!!

Following my announcement on the 21st December, most of you will know by now that I will be leaving the Benefice soon. For the last few years I have been doing quite a lot of work for the Diocese in the field of vocational discernment. This began with an invitation to become a vocations advisor, helping people who were seeking to discover for themselves what God was asking them to do with regard to ministry and service in the Church of England. I really enjoyed this work and had the pleasure of helping a number of people as we explored their call together.

Some time later Revd. Cn. Angela Pavey announced that she was moving on and that a new Diocesan Director of Ordinands would need to be found. In the meantime I was asked if I would be the Acting DDO until a new appointment was made. This I willingly agreed to and although interviews were held quickly and the new DDO - namely the Revd. Dr. Jeffrey Heskins was appointed I found myself continuing as Acting DDO for a total of 8 Months. I learned so much in this time and applied myself so fully to the task that I soon began to realize that perhaps this was where my own ministry was heading.

Once Jeff was safely in post as the new DDO he kindly appointed me as his assistant and we have worked together ever since. I now feel that God is indeed calling me more fully into this specialized ministry which is why I have decided to leave the benefice of South Lawres and the Diocese of Lincoln, to take up my new role as the DDO for Canterbury. I look forward to engaging in this exciting development to my ministry and also look forward to continuing at least in part to be a Parish Priest. As along with my Diocesan responsibilities I am also to be appointed as Priest-in-Charge of the parish of Thanington, St. Nicholas and St. Faiths.

This is a small parish on the outskirts of Canterbury with a nicely re-ordered Church. It comes complete with its own adjoined Church Hall and I will be living in the vicarage which is just next door. No doubt there will be many challenges to face along the journey ahead of me but I know that God will be with me in that journey, as I continue to serve him both as a parish priest and in my new role as the Diocesan Director of Ordinands.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Ø The Clerk was asked to inform LCC Highways about the following highway matters:

- o The condition of each end of Blacksmiths Road, especially at its junction with Lincoln Road
- the condition of Ferry Road from no.23 to Corn Close
- \circ $\;$ the condition of the road adjacent to the bus stop at Short Ferry.
- Ø The earth works in the play area will take place when conditions are right for seeding, possibly towards the end of February 2009.

Ø Flooding issues:

- Anglian Water is in the process of resolving issues with an emergency overflow that services their system and highway drainage in High Street.
- Morris Homes are still being pursued re issues regarding resolution of drainage problems on the Chapel Rise estate.
- WLDC officers are looking into the problem of surface water flooding to the east of the village
- Ø Community Emergency Plan: Unfortunately, as there has been no response to the request for assistance from the village, the Parish Council cannot instigate an effective emergency plan and all the Parish Council can do at this stage is support villagers with the provision of sand and sand bags should the need arrive.
- Ø The Doorstep Crime Co-ordinator is to be invited to a future parish council meeting, to discuss how the No Cold Calling Zone scheme could best be implemented. In addition, the Co-ordinator of the First Contact Scheme will also attend a future meeting.
- Ø The Freedom Of Information Act 2009 Model Publication Scheme was formally adopted by members of the parish council. This publication scheme commits an authority to make information available to members of the public as part of its normal business activities. Information will be placed on the Parish Noticeboard and in the Parish Office.
- Ø Mr. Barnaby Patchett was co-opted onto the Parish Council.
- Ø Date of Next Meeting: Monday, 2nd February, 2009 7.30 p.m.

"Working hard for you" - Meg Davidson's New Year Message January 2009

May I wish all of you a very happy New Year. It is a privilege and a pleasure to serve as your representative on West Lindsey District Council.

A sad point in the year was when Langworth Post Office closed its doors for the last time. The people of Langworth can hold their heads up high: they put up a very good fight. I think that we can take comfort from the recent announcement that the Post Office Card Account is going to continue. For a long time, it seemed certain that this was going to go, bringing with it the prospect of yet more post office closures. I am convinced that the government could not face another Langworth!

Another closure battle has been raging during 2008: the microbiology laboratory at Lincoln County Hospital is set to close and all samples are to be sent to Scunthorpe, over 30 miles away. This is of such concern that the Health Scrutiny Committee, which I rejoined this year, has used its ultimate power and referred the matter to the Secretary of State for Health.

2008 saw a change in political control at West Lindsey District Council. At the local elections on 1st May Conservatives gained 4 seats from the Liberal Democrats and took control of the Council. Since then, the new Conservative administration has been working hard to deliver on its election promises.

- **Concessionary bus passes:** in July the restriction on using bus passes before 9.30 am was lifted and all day use restored.
- Flood prevention grants: a scheme has been put in place for victims of the 2007 floods to obtain up to 50% of the cost of flood protection devices for their homes.
- **Green bins:** charges are scheduled to be scrapped for pensioner households from April 2009.



This year my Councillor's Initiative Fund grant went to help pay for play equipment at Fiskerton. I am delighted to see the play area installed and in use. This is a much needed amenity for the village.

My next two Saturday morning surgeries will be on 24^{th} January and 21^{st} March 2009 at Fiskerton Village Hall, 10.30 am – 12 noon. If you have an issue you would like to raise, come along and I will do my best to help. No appointment needed, just drop in.
