#### Letter from the Rectory.



In Mel Gibson's controversial film, 'The Passion of Christ' one powerful scene portrays a bloodied and weakened Jesus, on the way to crucifixion, falling beneath the weight of his cross before his mother Mary. Through their shared pain and suffering Jesus looks up at his mother and says, 'behold, I make all things new'.

Mel Gibson is quoting Revelation 21:5, where the risen, glorified Christ speaks from the throne of heaven, but his use of artistic licence reveals Gibson's grasp of the truth, Jesus is not a victim but the victor. The resurrected Christ changes the cross from an instrument of torture into a symbol of victory. The victory of the cross makes all things new. Through the cross we enter into new life and a new relationship with God and with one another. Through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ the old order has passed away and a new order, a new light, a new life, has come into the world.

God calls each one of us to share in this new life.

The true meaning of Easter, the gift of new life, is so easily lost amongst the gifts of chocolate eggs, bunches of flowers and pretty cards. The spiritual message of Easter is often forgotten by the distraction of the DIY stores, garden and fitness centres that encourage us to focus more on the redecoration and reshaping of our physical lives.

During this holiday season take some time out, set aside some time for spiritual reflection and prayer on the true meaning of Easter. Look beyond the hype and pressures of commercialisation to the real message of this season. But if you do, be warned, it could change your life. Jesus Christ is still making all things new.
