

All Souls' and All Saints'

As autumn arrives we prepare to celebrate the festivals of All Saints' and All Souls'. These are celebrated in the churches of our Benefice on November 1st and 2nd respectively. This year both will be celebrated on November 1st the nearest Sunday to both dates.

Through baptism we become members of Christ's church and Christ's family. All Saints' Day celebrates men and women in whose lives, the church as a whole has seen the grace of God at work. It is an opportunity to give thanks for that grace. It is a time to be encouraged by the example of the saints and to recall that sanctity may grow in very ordinary circumstances as well as in the extraordinary crises of human living. Mother Theresa will be remembered as someone who fits into these categories.

All Souls' Day is a day of commemoration of the faithful departed. It allows us to remember, with thanksgiving, before God, those people that we have known directly, perhaps those who gave us life or who nurtured us in faith.

We always celebrate All Saints' Day at Greetwell Church because this church is dedicated to All Saints' hence the title All Saints' Greetwell. This year there will be services of All Souls' at Cherry Willingham, Fiskerton and Reepham.

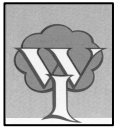


Gardening Club:

Village Hall news October 2009

There are ongoing problems at the Hall. In September all the rooflight flashings were ripped off and stolen; presumably someone hopes to sell them for a quick profit. Repair and replacement costs were almost £3,000 which we are hoping will be covered by the insurance.

There have been complaints from people hiring the hall that youngsters outside are making a nuisance of themselves with rowdy behaviour, and using offensive language when challenged. The CCTV camera shows figures clambering around the roof. The police are aware and have asked that all such incidents are reported to them. Unfortunately it has also been necessary to ban a small number of youngsters from entering the hall after they were seen accessing inappropriate sites on the public computer.

The good news is that lots of bookings have been made for parties and events and there are many positive comments about the facilities available. Have you considered having your party there? Do come and have a look round, the rates are very reasonable.

Police News **Welcome to the Police News for this month.**

With Bonfire night on the way I thought it would be an opportune time to mention again (and make no apologies that it is the same as last year) the legislation in relation to fireworks.

- The fireworks the Act makes it an offence to throw or set fire to a firework in the street and also makes it an offence to make a bonfire in the street to the obstruction, annoyance or danger of residents.
- Section 80 of the Explosives Act 1875 also makes it an offence to throw or cast a firework in a street or public place. The Highways Act of 1980 also covers the discharging of any firework within fifty feet of the centre of a highway.
- We now use the Firework Regulations 2004 Act. This prohibits any person under the age of 18 from simply possessing any firework in a public place except what the act calls a category 1 indoor fireworks such as party poppers or sparklers.
- This act also allows Officers to issue fixed penalty tickets for offences such as Throwing Fireworks.
- For this offence the Police can now issue an £80 Fixed Penalty Ticket, which has to be paid with 21 days. Failure to pay would mean a summons and ultimately a court case.

Just remember that fireworks themselves can be dangerous and cause annoyance and fear to many of our residents and pets. No one wants to stop people enjoying fireworks in safety in their back garden, but use them sensibly.

I would also like to give timely reminder also, not to let your youngsters go out of your house with eggs and flour or the shops to sell these products to the youths in the village with Mischievous night not to far away. Also be aware of where your child/children are going and with whom they are going around with.

Now the dark nights are drawing in can I remind parents to make sure that their children have lights for their bikes and that they wear either something reflective or something bright to make sure that they can be seen in the dark. I regularly drive around in the evenings and early mornings to see paperboys/girls zig-zagging across the road delivering papers. The lamplight is simply just not enough to make sure your child is seen. Adults please also remember that you need to be seen too!

If there are any schools or clubs which would like to borrow reflective vests for the children to wear if they are out and about on an organised activity we have 50 children's vests and 6 adult ones here at Nettleham Station. You can telephone us on 07944 776 801 and if no one else has booked them for that time, you are welcome to borrow them at no cost.

Please remember when reporting a crime please report them directly to Lincolnshire Police on 01522 882222 where your crime will be recorded by a dedicated call-taker.
