#### **BISHOP'S LETTER**

#### "It's not on any map: true places never are" (from Moby Dick)

Maps are marvellous. The current exhibition of maps at the British Library in London is attracting large crowds, and Mike Parker's **Map Addict** is proving to be a bit of a best-seller.

Why? What is it about maps which we find so compelling? Well in part the answer lies in the stories they tell about how people past and present have seen their world. They highlight the things that mattered most to previous generations, and today they facilitate travel and communications in ever more sophisticated ways.

But they remain artificial. They try to present in two dimensions what is essentially a three-dimensional world. Fascinating though they are, they only work when we apply to them our three-dimensional experience of the world around us so as to see in our mind's eye the hills and valleys on the flat map as they really are.

Adding a further dimension to what we see, hear, feel and touch day by day is what faith in God is all about. So many people lead two-dimensional lives with little sense of that something more which transfigures reality and transcends what is otherwise ordinary and everyday.

Rudolph Otto, a famous theologian of the last century, used the word "numinous" to describe that idea of the Holy which we discern with the eye of faith. Living by faith is three-dimensional living. Why settle for a mere map when you can experience the real thing? Why settle for life in two dimensions when Jesus offers us life in all its fullness (John 10:10)?

#### PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

## Summary of meeting - 17<sup>th</sup> May, 2010

- The Chairman welcomed Mr. P. Good to talk about his plans for a composting centre on the airfield. He went through the points raised by Mr Darcel's letter and Mr Good did his best to clarify any issues. He reassured the Council about the number of lorries and that he did not foresee a significant peak in the summer months as Mr Darcel suggested. Mr Good also agreed to measures such as keeping paths maintained, not turning compost when breeze is blowing directly at the village, instigating a speed limit on the new track and, if it proved necessary, installing speed bumps on the track. The Clerk was asked to contact Primetake and ask if they were aware of the plans. She was also asked to write again to LCC Planning and Waste Disposal, sending them a copy of Mr. C. Darcel's letter and asking if they could bear these subsequent points in mind when making a decision.
- Plood Mitigation Scheme. The draft legal scheme had been prepared and was outlined by the Chair. The Parish Council will work in co-operation with Mr. Good who has agreed to undertake maintenance work on the ditches a letter is to be drafted stating that an annual inspection of work is to be done by the farmer with the Parish Council making a contribution. When the legal agreement is finalised, Mr. T. Adams will contact Anglian Water to look at footage of the drains to see what needs to be done and how to do it. Following that, all riparian owners will be invited to a meeting which should lead to their agreement for work to be done and hopefully paid for by the grant WLDC has received. As they have received the full grant of £96,000, the Parish Council has withdrawn their grant application. Mr. Adams is to fill in the planning application and forward it to the Parish Council for signing. Although behind schedule at the moment, it is hoped that the works will be finished on time. Villagers asked if they could write to WLDC Planning supporting the scheme the Clerk will put a notice up when the planning application is to be submitted.
- District Councillor Mrs. Davidson was congratulated on being re-elected. She reported that the Conservatives had retained control of WLDC although the leader had not been re-elected. WLDC is in the process of drawing up a strategy on gypsy/traveller sites but no applications had been made for sites.
- **Ø** Parishioners were reminded that the Parish Council had agreed to cut the grass on the open spaces, not maintain complicated planting schemes.

#### Correctly connected, rivers protected

When we think about river pollution, we might assume it comes from places like factories, farms and industry. Yet in many cases the pollution in our rivers comes from a much less obvious source - our homes. Incorrect plumbing could mean that waste water from dishwashers, washing machines, sinks and even toilets is flushed directly into a local river. These 'misconnected' pipes are a common cause of pollution to rivers and streams. The Environment Agency have a duty to investigate such incidents, and are encouraging you to check your drains.

The property owner must fix any misconnected pipes. It is often simple and cheap to sort out the problem. If you do not fix a wrongly connected pipe, you could face a fine of up to £20,000. #### **Nettleham & Cherry Willingham Surgeries**

We are delighted to say that all the building work at Nettleham has now been **New Waiting Room:** completed and the waiting room was officially opened by Mally Daubney, our former Practice Manager on Tuesday May 19<sup>th</sup>. We are absolutely delighted with the results and are grateful for the numerous compliments from patients.

**Appointment System:** We constantly review and monitor our appointment system to try and find the 'best fit' for everyone. We acknowledge that it has not been easy for patients recently to make a routine appointment and we apologise for this. We have now introduced a new system for patients wishing to be seen on the same day with an acute problem. Anyone who telephones the surgery to request a same day appointment will be given the opportunity to come to the practice at 11.20am to a 'Sit and Wait' clinic. All of these patients will be seen by a GP that morning. To avoid long waits these appointments are strictly for single new problems which can't wait until another day.

Bowel Cancer Screening Programme: The NHS Bowel Cancer Screening Programme for people aged between 60 and 69 was launched by NHS Lincolnshire at the end of December 2009. This means that within the next two years everyone in the County in this age bracket will be invited to undergo bowel cancer screening.

Those people that wish to take part will be sent and easy-to-use testing kit directly to their homes which they then post back to a laboratory for testing. Anyone who has an abnormal test result will be given an appointment to see a specialist nurse in the endoscopy units at one of the local hospitals to discuss further
