An Interview with our new Priest In Charge by Mac Lyle of Reepham

Christened Penelope, inevitably shortened to Penny. First saw the light of day in Heanor, Derbyshire in 1958 - work it out for yourself. Isn't there a rhyme that goes: 'Derbyshire born, Derbyshire bred...no, perhaps we'd better not go down that road!

Penny went to school at Eastwood just down the road from Heanor, which is famous as the birthplace of D.H.Lawrence, the author best known for his somewhat steamy novel, 'Lady Chatterley's Lover'. Penny strongly denies that her upbringing in this area had any effect on her behaviour, before or after ordination.

She completed a four-year teacher training course at Bedford, emerging with honours and all that stuff. For some reason she fancied a job in Lincoln and was taken on to the staff at Lincoln Christ's Hospital school where she remained for 19 years, rising to the dizzy heights as Deputy Head. The phrase 'glutton for punishment' comes to mind!

Time for a change, said Penny, so she moved to Lincolnshire County Council as Head of Pupil Services, During this period Penny commenced preparations for ordination which took place at St.Wulfram's, Grantham, in 2006. Penny went south to Boston where she served as curate for 4 years at Holy Trinity church - not the famous stump - before being appointed as our new Priest-in-Charge.

Penny hopes to see more people in church, especially families and young people. 'If they don't come to us, we'll have to go to them' says Penny, so look out! If any older members of her congregations nod off during her sermons, Penny has promised to wake them gently!

The lass likes watching cricket, makes an annual visit to Wimbledon, and enjoys all kinds of music - she recently took two godchildren to an open-air pop festival which surely must be beyond the call of duty!

Penny has been inspired by people who manage to keep their faith intact despite adversity. I believe we in Lawres Deanery will be inspired by having Penny amongst us.

3. LCC Highways re the condition of Ferry Road, especially from Ridings Close to Hall Lane > PCSO Parker reported that the Simple SID speed monitor will soon be in use - Councillor Fishwick is to be the 'keyholder/go-between' between the Council and the Police. Residents are also encouraged to keep a home contents log (which could include photographs, serial numbers, dates of purchase and purchase price)

> A dog waste bin has been placed at the end of the houses on Lincoln Road .

> In an effort to stop vehicles parking on the grass area on High Meadows, LCC and Acis are looking at a scheme to replace some the existing verges with a footway construction

 \succ Parish Councillors are looking into ways that the village web site can be used more, including the possibility of setting up a forum

 \succ Flood Alleviation Scheme - Public Liability insurance for the area of the ponds will cost the Parish Council an extra £130/year

> Windrow site - The Parish Council again discussed the site and noted the withdrawal of the plans which might/might not be re-submitted at a later date. They noted the strong feeling against the proposals and agreed to keep a watching brief. It is hoped that there will be a link to the Windrow on the web site

> Damage to Play Area - the Play Area Inspector is still waiting for information from the suppliers of the area, Record RSS

 \succ The planning application to erect three dwellings (terraced format) at the former nursery unit on Ferry Road has been withdrawn

> Chinese Lanterns - a letter has been received from the NFU outlining their policy calling for an outright ban on the sales of Chinese Lanterns. Their reasons are: (a) these lanterns are mostly constructed from bamboo, wire and paper which, when lying in grassland pasture, can be chopped into small pieces and incorporated into animal food, i.e. hay or silage. Ingesting the wire can kill animals slowly and painfully. (b) fire risk - both to animals and standing crops. The NFU states that some venues have already stopped the use of these lanterns by their guests. The Parish Council notes their comments and has sent a copy of their letter to the Village Hall Management Committee for their information


