I am sure that you, like me have been following the dreadful pictures on our news screens this week of the after effects of earthquake and Tsunami in Japan..... and as if there that weren't enough to cope with, the subsequent race to avert a nuclear catastrophe at Fukushima Daiicha. It must be a living nightmare. We have, of course, been praying for those whose lives have been devastated, and we also need to think about how we can respond in practical ways. It will take years and possibly generations to restore whole communities and no doubt they will need the helping hand of the global community for a long time to come. We are reminded again, I guess, that there are things we cannot control. Nature is one of them. We can channel the power of nature in some way but when it reacts like this, there is no stopping it. Anyone who saw the force of water sweeping everything before it would realise that nothing could stop that power from doing its worst.

Being in control is something that I think as human beings we enjoy. It is good to feel 'in control' and yet there is so much we cannot control. Over the course of the next few weeks Easter will be upon us again and we will remember the death and resurrection of Jesus. This is, for me as a Christian minister, the pinnacle of the year. It reminds me that me that Jesus is someone that people tried to control but couldn't. He was subject to the authorities and rulers of the time and they did their best to stop Him in their tracks, they thought they had controlled Him by putting Him to death on a cross and yet, three days later the Bible tells us that He appeared again, resurrected from the dead, and subsequently appeared to over two hundred people. Controlling God, is not in the privilege of humanity and neither is the control of nature.

The Environment Agency responded to 20,000 reports of environmental incidents across England and Wales last year. Incidents we deal with are often reported to us by members of the public. The sooner we can act, the better the chance of reducing the impact on people and the environment. So, if you notice any of the following please contact us:

- Land or water pollution.
- Illegal fishing, fish in distress or dead fish.
- Blocked rivers or streams. This could increase the risk of flooding.
- Large-scale illegal dumping of waste. Small volumes of fly-tipped waste should be reported to your local council.
- Incidents at waste sites such as landfills, scrap yards, waste transfer stations etc.
- Illegal abstracting of water from watercourses.
- Collapsed or badly damaged river or canal banks.
