# Vicar's blog!

Its been a very odd few weeks – Easter (nothing odd about that –for me anyway!) two bank holidays including the royal wedding. That was funny too! My Mum was staying with me – she was transfixed by the wedding and didn't speak for 4 hours on the morning of the wedding in case she missed anything – it was on all day so we watched the highlights followed by the highlights of the highlights and, in the end it was a day I enjoyed, spent with my lovely Mum, enjoying the occasion.

Another impressive 'performance' I think was given by the Bishop of London as he delivered his sermon. I have preached a few sermons in my time, and I suspect that very few will go down in the annals of history! The research suggests that by Tuesday of the week following the preaching of a sermon only a very small percentage of your congregation can remember anything about it! # Local Election Result

Chris Darcel Writes.....

I would like to thank everyone who voted for me in the recent election. I just scraped in with a tiny majority. As yet I am very much the new boy and finding my feet but one thing I have learned is the importance of local issues to people in this ward and living in the ward I have no escape! My address is No 3, Holmfield, my Telephone No is 750411 and my email is <u>chris@darcel.entadsl.com</u> should anyone wish to contact me on District Council matters.

#### There are two new issues I would like to bring to your attention.

- Crime. Apparently, Fiskerton is being targeted by thieves from Nottingham. The police arrested one young man in Reephan last week, making a getaway after being seen acting suspiciously on the Chapel Rise Estate. If anyone is interested forming or extending the existing Neighbourhood watch schemes please contact me
- 2) Possible councillor/ward changes to reduce the number of councillors in West Lindsey from 37 to 36. In itself this is a reasonable proposition as some wards are tiny. However, it is also planned to combine Cherry Willingham and Reepham with Fiskerton and Langworth. The combined ward would then have 3 councillors as opposed to 2 for Cherry and Reepham and 1 for Fiskerton and Langworth.

The two areas are very different and this change will make it difficult in future elections for rural areas like ours to have a voice.

# <u>Summary of Annual General Meeting – 16<sup>th</sup> May, 2011</u>

- Councillor C. Scott was elected to continue as Chairman and Councillor A. Cooke to continue as Vice Chairman. Mr. R. Wall and Mr. S. Canner were co-opted onto the parish council. Planning Committee members are Councillors C. Scott, A. Cooke, B. Patchett and Mrs. M. Howard, Play Area Inspector is Councillor R. Wall and Police Liaison Officer is Councillor A. Cooke.
- District Councillor C. Darcel was congratulated on his recent election success and welcomed to his first meeting as District Councillor. He informed the Council that he is to meet with a representative from LCC Highways to discuss a comprehensive list of works to be done, including the provision of a hard standing at the bus stop at Short Ferry. He reported that a horse and rider had been frightened by a motor bike on the bridleway. He also observed that Police cover is changing and he felt that there is a need to extend the Neighbourhood Watch Area. There are proposals to amalgamate the District Councillors for Cherry Willingham, Reepham, Langworth and Fiskerton and he would keep the Council informed.

- Risk Assessment details, Assets List and Audit Return Statement of Assurance were considered, AGREED and completed where necessary.
- Flood Mitigation Scheme we are still waiting to hear from WLDC as to when the scheme is to be handed over.
- Planning permission has been granted to:
  - 1. Application for proposed extensions at The Old Hall, Hall Lane and 48 Ferry Road.
  - 2. Application to carry out workovers and extended well tests for hydrocarbons at disused air field, Reepham Road.

# CHERRY WILLINGHAM LIBRARY

Exciting news for people who like to explore our heritage. A new web site called 'Lincs to the Past' has recently been launched which ' will serve as a cultural gateway to collections held in the county's museums including marriage certificates, birth certificates and images of artefacts. There are over 500,000 images available including a timeline of available records going all the way back over 2,000 years. Residents of Lincolnshire will be able to browse through their ancestors lives' and piece together their family tree.' Subjects available to browse include a burials, maps and a convicts data base! You can view artefacts from the Tennyson collection, world war II memorabilia and also look at parish records. To access these and loads more go to www.lincstothepast.com

This is particularly useful if you have limited time available to browse or if you wish to reserve brand new or obscure titles. So if you have been putting off learning how to surf the net, click the mouse or learn to email then come along and our computer buddies will guide you through the jargon.
