'You must be joking!'

That was the response of a friend of mine recently when I announced to them that I was about to start my training as a Street Pastor. What's a Street Pastor? Well basically the Street Pastor Movement was initiated in London by Revd Les Isaacs in 2003 as a response to the crime and violence on the streets. He mobilised folk from his church to get out onto the streets and to meet people, offer support and help and be around when people were coming out of pubs and clubs to help keep people safe. Those involved are over 18, volunteers and members of churches of any Christian denomination and believe it or not, the oldest Street Pastor is 83!

Out of the vision of one person has now come an international movement. Street Pastors have been out on the streets of Lincoln on Friday and Saturday nights for four years now and are going from strength to strength. and now I am going to join them! I guess my friends response was something to do with the fact that it involves being out between 10pm and 4am on a Friday or Saturday night, and it involves dealing with people who are rather the worse for wear after a night out, but I have always believed that being a Christian means rolling your sleeves up and getting involved, and here is an opportunity to do that.

On another note vision the ability to see beyond what is, and see what could be. I am always struck that out of one person with vision, can come a whole change in perspective, can come action that changes the lives of many, many people. People with vision often see simple solutions to difficult problems and they are able to motivate others to join in. I believe that Jesus was a man with vision – He had a clear view of what people could become and encouraged people them to follow Him to see that work out in their lives. We should celebrate people with vision, since they are those who will get us through some of the difficult issues that beset our world.

Also the children from our Primary School will be singing at the opening.


Other events will be taking place across the two weekends. There will be visiting organists at various times, the local group 'Spirit' will be performing on Saturday 17th.

Neutered!

Voters in Fiskerton & Langworth have been effectively neutered.

In future Local Elections voters in what was the Fiskerton & Langworth ward have been effectively silenced. Cherry Willingham will decide our councillors.

The Boundary Commission has decided to hive 200 electors from the Fiskerton & Langworth ward to the Bardney ward and merge the remainder with Cherry Willingham and Reepham.

The simple arithmetic of the change is that there are currently some 3800 voters in Cherry and only 1500 in the reduced area of Fiskerton & Langworth. While there will still be three councillors covering the new combined ward your next district councillors will be chosen by the larger Cherry vote.

If next time round you are voting on political issues it will make little difference. If you are more concerned about local issues in the village your vote will have little weight. However, if I wanted to vote blue, green, yellow or red I would still prefer to vote for a candidate directly accountable to Fiskerton.

Needless to say, I am unhappy. Unfortunately, the four parish councils involved and the three district councillors have all been ignored and it will be an uphill struggle to keep our identity.

The proposed Community Plan is now more important than ever in making sure our views are heard and that our community grows and prospers as we would wish.

Personally, I would love to see more facilities for the younger generations and the Community Plan is key to this.

To help make things happen why not contact either Mr Scott, Mrs Smithson or myself, and join the Steering Group being set up by the Parish Council to formulate some initial ideas on the Fiskerton Community Plan.
