THE ORIGINAL LOVE STORY A Reflection On Christmas

One of the greatest theologians who ever lived, Karl Barth, was asked to be a guest lecturer at the University of Chicago Divinity School. At the end of a captivating closing lecture, the president of the School said that Dr. Barth was not well and was quite tired. He thought that Dr. Barth would like to be open for questions, but that it should not be expected . Then he said, "Therefore, I will ask just one question on behalf of all of us."

He turned to the renowned theologian and asked, "Of all the theological insights you have ever had, which do you consider to be the greatest of them all?

It was the perfect question for a man who had written literally tens of thousands of pages of some of the most sophisticated theology ever put into print. The students held pencils, ready to take down the insight of the greatest theologian of their time.

Karl Barth closed his tired eyes, and he thought for a minute, and then he half smiled, opened his eyes, and said to those young students, The greatest theological insight that I have ever had is this: "Jesus loves me, I know this, because the Bible tells me."

The Gospel of Jesus Christ is the greatest love story ever written! I wish with all my heart that everybody could read it that way, but I'm afraid to say that I meet people every day for whom it reads more like a used car contract. Somehow in the midst of all those beautiful love verses, they hear only clauses and conditions and not the promises.

So I thank God that Christmas comes around once a year to remind us that God isn't in the business of keeping books and tallying ledgers, nor is God concerned about our status or position in life. If God were concerned about any of those things, then I tell you, the Christ of God would never have been born into such disagreeable circumstances as we find in the second chapter of Luke.

No. Christmas is the beginning of a classic love story with all the right ingredients: infatuation, pursuit, risk and relationship. Christmas is a crossing of paths. Christmas is where we find the Christ of God intersecting with humanity! Christmas is our first best meeting with the God who has loved us from the very beginning. I tell to you that if it weren't for Christmas we might never have known the intensity of the love that God has for us.

True love accepts everyone for who they really are; God chooses to love us precisely because we are subjects of the human condition, not because of a favourable bottom line on a social and moral profit and loss statement. Like us, Mary and Joseph had nothing to commend them but their humanity. God's love is completely and thoroughly inclusive.

Peace begins with the knowledge that God loves and accepts us just as we are. It begins with Christmas! Christmas is the living promise that we are never ever alone. No matter where we are in life, no matter in what circumstances we find ourselves, no matter how far we might stray away, or how unfaithful we are, God, the supreme lover, will pursue us in love for eternity! It's a love that never stops shining. May God bless each of you and those you love this Christmas!

New Burglar Alarm: St. Clement's Church

It is hoped that the alarm on the Church roof will be fitted on Monday December 12th. Included in the system are wireless PIR detectors, an external voice enhanced sounder and strobe lights. If the system is activated, a planned response is triggered.

So should it go off in the depths of the night (or indeed at any time) there is no need for anyone who hears it to do anything. A course of action will be automatically carried out.

However, we would ask that everyone continues to be vigilant. The alarm will work 24 hours a day, but should you see or hear anything unusual or suspicious during daylight hours, please let the police know on their NEW non- emergency telephone number: 101 or textphone 18001 101

It is likely that there may be a few teething problems to start with and we apologise in advance if you are woken during the night, but please remember you do not need to do anything - all will be taken care of - and as fast as possible!

Ward changes the final Local Boundary Commission document has been lodged with Parliament and will be accepted or rejected mid December. The recommendation was that a reduced Fiskerton and Langworth ward will be merged with Cherry Willingham and Reepham. Personally, I think it is basically wrong to merge smaller villages like ours with larger conurbations. Voters in Fiskerton and Langworth will effectively loose their vote. Cherry Willingham will decide who our councillors are. The only options now are to petition our MP, Mr Edward Leigh, MP, edwardleigh4constituents@msn.com or leighe@parliament.uk, or write to the Prime Minister to persuade them to reject the proposal. Or go for a judicial review.

"30 Day centres to close" One last thing, do you remember the Echo headline in mid October, "30 Day centres to close" well this is causing distress to several of our residents. These centres are for the seriously disadvantaged members of our society, people with severe learning and physical handicaps. The very people we should be protecting most from the spending cuts. They can neither look after them selves nor shout their corner. Some, even less fortunate individuals, are too severely disadvantaged make use of day centres and they too, and their carers, should see their budgets protected.

To see the scale of the problem, please Google Lincolnshire County Council's Budgets (page 24 of the Budget) and see if you agree with me that the axe should fall elsewhere.

If you agree with me, please let me know any ideas you may have on how we can protect support for these less fortunate members of our society.

Nettleham Medical Practice & Cherry Willingham Branch Surgery:

Cherry Willingham Surgery: We are aware that it has been difficult at times to obtain a convenient appointment at our branch surgery at Cherry Willingham. We are committed to maintaining a branch surgery at Cherry Willingham, although many other rural practices now have closed their branch surgeries. The number of appointments at this site is limited and we would encourage all patients who have their own transport to attend our Nettleham Surgery wherever possible to leave more appointments available to those Cherry Willingham patients without easy transport.

Medication Reviews: Over the last few months, we have been changing the way in which medication reviews are undertaken in the practice. Historically all patients on repeat medication have had a review date printed on their repeat prescription slip and would be expected to make an appointment with a doctor around that date in order for the medication to be reviewed. Now, the doctors review the clinical records of patients with medication reviews about to expire, and then patients are contacted by a receptionist by telephone or letter to make an appointment for any blood test or other monitoring required prior to the medication review. This will ensure that all tests are carried out in advance of the appointment and should ensure that your review is fully comprehensive. For some patients it may be decided by your doctor that all the monitoring has been completed for that year and the medication can be updated without the need for a face to face appointment, saving you time.

Monthly Early Closures for Training 2011: In order to enable our doctors and staff to be kept up to date Nettleham surgery will be closed for training at 1pm on the following afternoons. Emergency help is still available by calling 111. Tuesday 13th December 2011
