Vicar's Blog:

New Year Greetings! 2012 looks as though it may shape up to be quite a spectacular year as the Queen celebrates her 60th Jubilee and then comes the Olympics – I don't think I ever expected to see an Olympics in these islands in my lifetime, so I am looking forward to a special treat! So here we are again at the start of another new year. A year in which I trust you will experience love in your life. I say that because in these times when things are rather uncertain it seems to me that knowing, experiencing, giving and receiving love is absolutely fundamental to our wellbeing as people. As a Christian Minister, I speak a lot about love, because the Bible tells us that God is love. I know that some people find that difficult because of the activity of people toward one another in the Old Testament, but, some of the most wonderful writing in the Bible is about love embodied in the sacrifice of the one whose birth we have just celebrated, Jesus. The apostle Paul wrote a wonderful letter to the church in Corinth. This was a church struggling with division and Paul was imploring them to live in a more excellent way. He described love as 'patient and kind; it does not envy, it does not boast nor proud; it does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.' You may recognise these words because they are often used in a marriage service and they hold up a picture, not only of the delight of love, but the fact that sometimes, loving someone is tough and requires hard work! Love does bring delight and pleasure, but conversely it can bring heartache and pain. Losing someone you love is one of the most difficult experiences of life. I am a great fan of the Christian writer Henri Nouwen, and he suggests that to live a life untouched by sorrow and grief is to live an unloved life. At some points in our lives, we have to take risks, and loving someone always carries the risk that one day you may lose them.

God took the risk of losing a Son, Jesus, part of his very self, in order to save humanity. He did it to express His love for us. I find that amazing and life transforming, transforming because I believe that God took that risk for me and it changed me, because when love crosses our path it changes us for the better. I didn't earn that and neither do I deserve it, but it was an act of grace, and grace is a gift, given freely by God.

So, as we enter this new year, I pray that you might experience the abundance of God's generous love for you and trust that it will change your life as it did mine.

Not so much to write about this time,

There are several items I would like to mention though,

One is the Fiskerton Village Parish Plan.

The steering group will be distributing our questionnaire around the village just at the end of January. Prior to this, we would be grateful if representatives from community groups, local organisations, village hall users, the school, church, WI and any interested individuals etc, come to a pre release briefing in the village hall mid January. Draft copies will be available to any interested by email or on paper and on the Fiskerton Web site from 20th December.

Please take time to add your suggestions and help us find out just what services and facilities we residents, young, middle aged and elderly, would like to see in the village. If you have any queries please phone my self on 750411 or Mr Kipper Scott on 750121.

Quite rightly, I have heard some suggestions that the plan is just a wish list. It is, but without knowing what is in the wish list, and how many people might make use of the suggestions, how can anything ever be achieved? The new village hall is a fine example of what can be done, - if the community wants to make the effort.

The money for the new build did not grow on trees, but dedication, hard work and matched funding helped raise the necessary cash. There are other facilities that could be achieved in a similar way. If we make use of the new "localism bill", which is now law, it should be easier to get results than it was for the parish seven or eight years ago when the new hall was built.

Second is **District Councillor Surgeries**. My predecessor held frequent surgeries in the village hall, if anyone would like me do the same please let me know.

In a way I would be much happier for people to just continue to email or phone me with their concerns on District matters.

There is a good chance I will not have a quick answer but I do follow queries up and I will be very pleased to call round to discuss any particular issue you may have.

Third, Wednesday 14th December was when the boundary changes became law.

What annoys me is not that the Local Boundary Commission carried out its review but as far as this village was concerned it was done in secret. When I found out and responded my comments and those of my neighbours were completely ignored.

I have tried to get the merger with Cherry Willingham reversed, emailed all the MPs and much else. No one seems to care. What annoys me is, it is my vote. I value my vote.

It is not there to be played with by the Boundary Commission, the town hall or local political associations. If changes are to be made to my vote I want to be consulted.
