#### Vicar's Blog!

I am writing this on the day after the night before.... last night I was out Street Pastoring, so I am recovering from a 3.45am bedtime and processing some of the events of the night before, which were a mixture of entertaining, funny, sad and slightly hairy moments. If you have ever been in town late at night, then you will probably understand what I mean.

One of the things that I am hugely encouraged by when I am out street pastoring is the team work. I have a strong belief that we were created to live and work in community, and so when that works, we are at our best. So, the fact that I can meet with 4 or 5 other Street Pastors who I don't know, (because I am the 'new kid on the block'), and that we work effectively and in support of one another, is exhilarating. The fact too that we can work as part of a much bigger team, supporting Evening Wardens, the Police and Emergency Services and those who work in and outside the Clubs and Pubs of Lincoln, all 'doing our bit' means that the system works and hopefully that people are cared for and kept safe.

Teamwork and community is a theme that runs through the Bible. When God created the world, and when Jesus was born into it, I don't think He ever had the intention that His church would divide itself up into all sorts of groups that never relate to one another. Paul described the church as the Body of Christ, and went on to explain that everyone has gifts given by God in order to express and extend His Kingdom and His Kingdom has no boundaries or divisions, all are welcome. The thing is, we are human, and as human beings we all have different preferences about the way we do things, and we all think in different ways, and so we have developed different denominations that do things in slightly different ways, that reflect those preferences. Yes, I am an Anglican but, the Anglican church does not have sole province on all matters Christian, as an Anglican I am part of the body of Christ and must work alongside Christians of other denominations – that is a key part of my work here as a Christian Minister and as a Street Pastor and something I have been seeking to do – to work out what it is we do best to together and what it is we do best separately, as we work to our strengths – that, for me is how we can best express both our unity and our diversity as Christians and as human beings.

## Nettleham Medical Practice and Cherry Willingham Branch Surgery January 2012 News

#### **New Clinical Computer System**

The practice is excited to be moving to its new clinical computer system in May 2012. The new system, called Systmone, has many new facilities which will help improve our care to you. One of the new features in the system is the ability for us to share information with the local district nurses, OOH and the walk in centre, with patient consent. This is a major step forward, reducing duplication of work, increasing safety and making sure a patient's latest records are shared by more of the teams who support them.

Whilst we shall try and make the migration as smooth as possible, there will inevitably be some disruption whilst staff and GPs become fully trained in the new system. More details will be given nearer the time.

#### **Controlled Drug Collection**

Some of our patients have prescriptions for controlled drug medication such as Morphine. These medications have to be treated differently in the dispensary and are governed by very strict legislation. To improve our management of these particular drugs, from the New Year when a patient or a patient's representative comes to collect these medications from the dispensary at either practice they will be asked for ID. This is so that the dispensers can be 100% sure who is collecting the medication. We would request that anybody collecting any of these medications bring some form of ID with them so that the medication can be issued without delay.

In order to enable our doctors and staff to be kept up to date Nettleham surgery will be closed for training at 1pm on the following afternoons. Emergency help is still available by calling 111.

#### **Patient Participation Group & Voluntary Driver Scheme:**

We would still like to encourage more patients to join our virtual Patient Reference Group. The purpose of this is to have a large group of patients that the practice will contact by email a couple of times each year to ask for their opinion on its services etc.

If you are interested then please complete one of the join up forms at reception or contact Nicola Lamming at the practice for more details.

The driving scheme continues to flourish with more and more patients making use of the offer of a lift to and from their appointments at both surgeries.

We are looking for people to volunteer their services so as to expand the team, based in all areas covered by the surgery and it would help if you had a reasonable knowledge of the whole area. You need to be over 25 with at least 3 years driving experience and ideally a clean licence. There is no upper age limit. You will need to own or have access to a 4/5 door vehicle. Sometimes the patients use support buggies to assist in their getting around and these would need to be put in your car between the patient's home and the surgery.

It must be pointed out that this is a voluntary service and that each new driver must be CRB checked before they can start to work for the scheme. The CRB check is paid for by Lincoln County Council and each driver is allowed to claim 45p per mile for every mile they do in the carrying out of their duties. There is a set rate for each trip. It would be explained how to complete the necessary paperwork and how the scheme works before the start of your employment.
