VICARS BLOG:

On the Sunday after Easter our readings in church focus on the events after the resurrection of Jesus, where Jesus spoke to his disciples both as individuals and as a group. The Bible tells us that he actually appeared to over 500 people after the resurrection. One of the individuals He appeared to was Thomas. I came across this article by Archbishop John Sentamu about Thomas, so I thought I would share it with you

"Let me introduce you to Thomas. He could be like somebody you know – blunt, nobody's fool, calls a spade a spade, unlikely to be taken for a ride. The Thomas I'm thinking of was actually one of the bunch of men and women who joined Jesus on his journeys from time to time. But he could easily be one of our contemporaries.

Like the other Jesus-apprentices, Thomas was shattered when the Master was killed. His hopes had been raised earlier when it looked as though everyone might join the new movement to change the world. Then it all seemed to go disastrously wrong. The campaign began to disintegrate and Thomas feared the worst. He was right.

The crucifixion of Jesus of Nazareth was a catastrophe for his disciples. So when, shortly afterwards, some of them jabbered excitedly to Thomas that they had seen Jesus again after his death, he ridiculed them. You could understand it. Once bitten, twice shy. Being a belligerent pessimist is easier and less painful than being trustful. Thomas was uncompromisingly honest. He had to be sure and he was right. As Tennyson said, "There lives more faith in honest doubt, believe me, than in half the creeds". So Thomas, 'doubting Thomas', as we have nicknamed him, laid down some impossible conditions before he would believe that Jesus was alive again. First, he had to see Jesus for himself. Second, he had to touch the scars where crucifixion nails had been hammered into Jesus' hands and the spear wound in his side. Then and only then, would he believe.

That's exactly what happened. Jesus appeared to the disciples again and this time Thomas was with them. Go on Thomas, do it! Look! Touch the wounds and turn your doubts into trust. The Bible doesn't actually say that Thomas took up the offer to touch, but it does say that he responded dramatically, saying to the risen Christ, "My Lord and my God".

So don't let your doubts put you off. They are just a step away from trust. When you are on your own, have a word with God on the quiet and ask him to give you the gift of being able to trust him. Of course, you have to mean it and you have to persevere."

With thanks to the Archbishop. It's a reminder I think that the followers of Jesus were just like you and me, but that God can make a difference in all of our lives. Every blessing,

RE COMMUNITY WILDLIFE GRANT

Please find the enclosed copies of Lincolnshire County Council's Community Wildlife Grant. This grant is open to Parish Councils, charities, community and voluntary groups for grant applications that meet the following aims;



- encourage local community involvement with nature conservation projects
- promote, improve and protect bio-diversity
- promote access to and enjoyment of the countryside.

The grant has proved very popular in recent years for small scale local environmental projects. Grants have been awarded for tree planting, woodland improvement, hedge laying, nature area creation, repair of dry stone walls, hedge planting, access improvements, leaflets and information boards and involving communities in wildlife.

As it is the Queens Diamond Jubilee we would look especially favourably on grant applications from Parish Councils working with local farmers to plant 60 oak, ash, sweet chestnut or walnut trees within existing gaps in hedgerows. Trees must not be planted under power or telephone lines or on a roadside verge. If volunteers from the Parish or the farmer volunteered to plant and look after the trees the grant would pay for the entire cost to purchase trees and protection.
