

# Vicar's Blog

The post- Christmas season gave me a few days to be a bit of a couch potato and watch some TV. On one evening I was glad I did – because I came across a programme that I haven't seen before called DIY SOS. For the uninitiated, this is a programme where a team of builders, electricians, plasterers and designers turn up to the property of someone who is in need of help, and transform their home into the living space that they need. On this occasion the work was done for Julie Jones, a mum of 8 children. I was very taken with her story. She had a best friend called Caroline, who had 5 young children. Caroline was diagnosed with a brain tumour at the age of 45, just after that diagnosis, her partner died suddenly of a brain haemorrhage. Caroline, sadly didn't pull through. and asked her friend Julie to look after her children. She had three children of her own, was a lone parent, working and now had the prospect of 5 more children to care for, which she resolved to do. She adopted the children and took them into her 3 bedroom detached house. Her boys, who were in their mid-late teens were as impressive as their mum – accepting and loving the five bereaved children as part of the family. It was amazing to hear them all speak and share their love and commitment and they shared their life together.

I think the dominating thought in my head as I watched this programme was that 'love makes such a difference'. I guess that Julie could have made a different choice — she could have decided that 8 children was just too much, but she made the choice to love and in doing so, to sacrifice the things she might have hope and dreamed for herself. What an amazing example of compassion and care. I was moved to tears and I have no doubt that I wasn't the only one. The builders left her with a dream house, where the children had space, with a kitchen to sit round the table together and a bedroom for her to relax in; the older boys were catered for too....

We can get so caught up in things sometimes that we forget what is important. Love has a transforming power about it and when we give it, or receive it, it changes us for the better. We might not all be called on to take on five children, but we can offer love and care to a neighbour or friend in small and simple ways that just express love, care and appreciation.

Where does love come from? Well, simply, the Bible tells us that God is love and whoever lives in love lives in God. Important to remember I think that love isn't a fluffy and woolly sentimentality, it is a choice and sometimes a tough and sacrificial choice, but making that choice does and will change lives.





By the time you read this, we will be just about ready to start work on the youth shelter. The end product will look very different from the original proposal, it will cost more and require more work to build but I am sure it will prove a much better amenity for the village, long term.

So if any builders are out there and would like to help, please phone me.

The project will be written up and publicised by West Lindsey and if someone wishes to take lots of photos- that would be great. One thing that has been stressed by the planners is that the area will need lighting, so some extra money will need to be found from somewhere.

One of the star points of the results of the Parish Plan survey was that the great majority of residents wanted to see the Manor Paddock be returned to open space and used for sports, as it has been for much of the time since the war.

To make it happen, someone somewhere will need to put a small amount of cash on the table, just to get the ball rolling! Could this be an opportunity for any spare cash the Parish Council has in the kitty?

In Cherry Willingham there is talk of turning the library into a Library and Community Hub, some thing I am sure many of us will find very useful. It will cost serious money, but with all the different grants and matched funding schemes available it is something a number of residents are hoping will happen.

If Cherry can do it --- So can we, it would be great to have a some sports facilities in the village. even if it is just somewhere where our ever growing band of youngsters can go and kick a ball.

Lastly, Short Ferry residents need a pavement from the pub to the bus stop. Noel Robinson at Highways, Lincolnshire County Council, has told me it is on the Council's wish list. To make it happen we need to make sure it gets to the top of the wish list, so the more letters the Short Ferry residents send in, both to the Parish Council, to County Cllr Ian Fleetwood, and the Highways Department at LCC the better.

# Immobilise Property Database

Immobilise is a property database used by Lincolnshire Police and many other police forces across the country to check for stolen property.

Users can create a profile for FREE and add their property to the database. If the user is unfortunate enough to become a victim of burglary or theft then the user can change the status of the property to "stolen".

If Police recover the item and check the item against the database it will show up as being stolen and can be returned the rightful owner. Visit www.immobilise.com for more information.
