Vicar's Blog

Until a couple of hours ago, I was stumped for a topic for this month's blog. However, the events of the last few hours have been such that there is one topic now on my mind, and that is 'generosity'. Last night I guess that many of us watched Comic Relief on the TV. I didn't see it all, but was astonished to discover when I listened to the news this morning that over £75 million had been raised. That is an incredible amount of money and speaks much of the capacity of people to respond generously when they see a need. Some of the videos that were presented to us last night were hard watching and it's shocking to know that people live in such dreadful conditions, die from disease eradicated in the richer parts of the world and in some cases, are sold as commodities. Clearly, the needs are not just thousands of miles away either....

A few weeks ago, someone gave me some money. It was £20. I decided that instead of spending it on myself I would try to do something useful with it. So, I advertised a Comic Relief Bake Off, and spent it on flour, eggs etc to make cake. It was fairly last minute, but many others also pitched in and made cakes, people turned up and gave generously. The result was a bake off that raised £405. More amazing generosity – thank you! This illustrates something that I believe is fundamental in God's world – it is to do with 'investment' – take the small seed of an idea, a vision, sew it, put time into it, invest in it, get people involved in it and it grows, sometimes exponentially. That, for me, is a principle of God's Kingdom. The Bible is littered with characters who sewed the seed of a vision and it grew beyond their wildest expectations, because God took something small and grew it with them. Jesus spoke about needing faith as small as a mustard seed – why that small? Simply because when we exercise faith we do it in small steps – we step out in faith, God takes that and then stretches it, and as we invest in our faith, it
