The Bishop of Lincoln writes.....

At the start of this month, those of us who live in the Lincolnshire county council area will be casting our vote in the local elections. Those of us in the other parts of the diocese will be doing so in 2014.

We are fortunate to live in a democracy - something we should never take for granted. Yet in recent years we have seen a decline in the number of people who exercise their right and responsibility to vote. Turnout in the election of our first Independent Police Commissioner in November was only 15%

Whether we are due to vote this month or not, this is a good time to remind ourselves of the words of St Paul's in his letter to the Ephesians:

"You are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone."

As disciples of Jesus we are called continually to assess and reorder our lives according to the values of his kingdom. We do so not only as citizens of earth, but also of heaven. So then, when we have the opportunity to vote, we have an obligation to take seriously our responsibility to engage with the urgent issues of our time; to recognise that each of us has the capacity to make a difference; to do all we can to bring about the coming of God's kingdom for all the people of our diocese.



PARISH COUNCIL MEETING – 25th January, 2013

The most important piece of news received at the meeting was:

- ➤ The Post Office in the village hall. Representatives from the Post Office are coming out to discuss the possibility of the Post Office Closing. It really is a USE IT OR LOSE IT SITUATION! Opening hours are: Monday 9.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m, Tuesday 9.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m. and Thursday 9.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m.
- > The Clerk was asked to contact:-
 - (1) LCC Highways provision of footpath to bus stop at Short Ferry, road and drain repair works along Ferry Road, kerb height leading to flooding at 25 and 29 Ferry Road, potholes on Lincoln Road and The Crescent, scheduled footpath works on Reepham Road not having been undertaken, condition of grass verge on Chapel Road
 - (2) WLDC re the provision of additional dog waste bins
 - (3) WLDC Planning Enforcement Officer re repairs to the fence on the open space, Holmfield
 - (4) LCC Traffic Enforcement Officers re cars parking on footpaths on Ferry Road residents are reminded that vehicles parked on footpaths are a danger to pedestrians, especially those with buggies/prams and wheelchairs/mobility scooters. £60 fines can be issued to owners of such vehicles.
 - (5) Witham Third Internal Drainage Board re repairing the top of the river bank
 - (6) Acis re provision of 'No Turning' notices on the cul-de-sac on Holmfield
- The grass contractor for the coming year will be Veolia Environmental Ltd.
- ➤ Planning permission has been granted for a single storey extension to the activity room at the Old Hall, Chapel Road.
- The village web site has been updated and is easier to access. You can visit it at www.fiskerton-lincs.org.uk
- Councillor Fleetwood reported that
 - (1) Cherry Willingham parish council have presented their Community Plan CW2020 and can be seen on their website;
 - (2) LCC have been awarded an extra £6.5 million to fill potholes these need to be reported quickly and efficiently. He is lobbying to get repairs on Ferry Road from the village towards Applegarth.;
 - (3) The bus service and stop at Short Ferry needs to be utilised and the level of service maintained;
 - (4) LCC is trying to keep statutory services running and trying to keep taxation down. There has been a 0% increase over the last three years;
 - (5) More bus shelters are being installed in Reepham and Cherry Willingham quality bus shelters keep people using the buses.
- District Councillor Darcel reported that
 - (1) the Parish Plan questionnaire is to be delivered by hand and is very close to being put on the web site. There is another Parish Plan meeting on 25th April;
 - (2) WLDC Planning most issues are settled by officers' delegated powers;
 - (3) the Bedroom Tax coming in shortly will affect villagers;
 - (4) the District Council tax has risen 1.5%;
 - (5) the Council Tax Benefit Support is changing slightly;
 - (6) there is a new flooding issue at 22 Water Hill he has contacted Tony Adams and will contact Mr. Good;
 - (7) that new dog waste bins should be installed

I hope you have received my hand delivered edition together with the supplementary questionnaire for the parish plan. Going over old ground, this page is all about making things happen.

The youth shelter is progressing well in spite of the snow and our teenagers are working hard on Sunday mornings. The shelter is a result of their efforts and encouragement and help from several adults. Doris has been a real brick and while an OAP, like me, she is unlikely to use the shelter, she has seen the need and made the effort to make it happen and the "labour force" is beginning to enjoy satisfaction from their work.

We need similar input for a ball kicking area or for a proper playing field. If we as a village want something to happen, we, the village, have to make the reality and that requires active helpers and not just a few ticks in boxes on a petition or survey sheet. If you could help or lead a team, please give me a call. We need doers not arm chair generals.

Back to the youth shelter, so far it is myself who has been the biggest beneficiary. It has given me the chance to reflect on my own teenage life. It is just over 50 years ago that I was eighteen, and I had already left home to go to college. The stress levels in the Darcel household must have fallen dramatically the day my parents drove me nearly 200 miles to deliver me to site.

I "got on well" with my parents but as a "teenage know all" I must have driven my Mum and Dad mad. All my school chums had a similar escapes and for those of my friends who were not interested in academic studies there were almost unlimited career opportunities available to take them away from home. I can see the need for an extra set of walls for our youngsters to escape too.

This is not the page to talk about elections but so far I have received some very interesting feed back that I would like to mention.

- * Would better footpaths to Cherry Willingham and Reepham mean parents sending their children to school in Cherry will lose their free bus pass? It could be expensive for them or a long walk for the children.
- * Lack of wheel chair access to buses. Many buses on the No 15 route are "old retired stock". They are not accessible to wheel chairs. We have the raised pavements, where are the buses? The "non" pavement from Short Ferry to the bus stop is also a problem. I thought there was legislation to give those in wheel chairs equal access to just about everything.
- * The approach road to the Parade in Cherry. I can quite see that responsibility and ownership of the 10 yard strip between the highway and the shops is complicated but two of the biggest organisations in the county are the main players so why is nothing happening?
- * The new bypass, I have been told by an expert that it will be next to impossible for cyclists and pedestrians to cross the road to get to Lincoln. If you get chance- have a look.
- * Helplessness. Why bother to vote? Nothing happens. Whether you make representations to the Police, the County Council, the District Council or the Parish Council, everything is always someone else's responsibility and nothing gets done. My frustration is waste, both financial and the incinerator to take our black bin waste. You try finding out the figures!

RE: Introduction of Dog Control Order in Cherry Willingham

Cherry Willingham Parish Council is moving towards introducing a dog control order across the village, which will come into effect from 1 June 2013. The present bye-laws regarding dogs on leads and the removal of dog mess are now out of date and need to be replaced. The Parish Council, working with West Lindsey District Council, and the legal department of Lincolnshire County Council, has compiled the following public notice which will appear in the next edition of Cherry News:

"Cherry Willingham Parish Council has made the following dog control order as authorised by sections 55 and 56 of the Clean Neighbourhood and Environment Act 2005. Within the parish boundaries of Cherry Willingham all dogs must be kept on a lead whilst in public places. This means all public roads and rights of way within Cherry Willingham. A map showing the areas affected is on the website. Alternatively the map can be seen at the Parish Office. If your dog defecates in a public area within the parish boundaries then it is the dog handlers' responsibility to pick up the faeces and either take them home or put in one of the dog bins situated throughout Cherry Willingham. There is an exemption for guide dogs only.

All dogs are banned from the Laburnum Drive playing fields and the St Pauls Avenue Play Area. A map showing the areas affected is on the website. Alternatively the map can be seen at the Parish Office. There is an exemption for all guide dogs and assistance dogs.

Failure to comply with any aspect of this dog control order will result in the issue of a fixed penalty notice which may lead to prosecution, which in turn may result in a maximum fine of £1000."

As some residents of Fiskerton walk their dogs in Cherry Willingham, I would be most grateful if you could publicise Cherry Willingham Parish Council's intention to introduce this dog control order.

POLICE NEWS: Summer Time Crime Prevention

Open windows and doors may let the fresh air in but they also allow easy access and provide tempting opportunities for thieves who need just seconds to walk or reach in and take purses and other valuables from tables and worktops. Don't give thieves an open invitation.

A determined burglar can get through the smallest of open windows.

So, whenever you go out - no matter how long for, make sure you shut all windows and doors. Try to follow the guidelines below to reduce your risk of becoming a victim of burglary or theft:

- 1. Lock all windows and doors and remove the keys to a safe place when you leave the house, even if just for a few minutes.
- 2. If you are at the rear of the house or in the garden always ensure the windows and doors at the front of the house are locked.
- 3. Do not leave valuables in sight or reach of any open windows.
- 4. Lock all downstairs windows at night.
- **5.** Put away and secure all gardening equipment and children's bikes etc. after use.
- **6.** Use good quality locks on garages and sheds.
- 7. Ensure both locks and hinges on shed and garage doors are working properly and do not need repairing (ensure screws on latches and hinges cannot be undone easily from the outside.
- **8.** Ensure you know what make and model your gardening tools are for identification purposes in the event that they are stolen.
- 9. Mark up gardening equipment with your postcode. This should be done overtly with paint, paint pens or permanent markers where possible to make them less attractive to thieves as they are harder to re-sell.

10. Make this summer one you remember for the weather - not for the crime!
