





Vicar's Blog:

I guess that by now, I have preached a lot of sermons. I suspect that some folk reading this will have listened to a lot of sermons. I often wonder, of the sermons that I have preached, how much of any of them does anyone ever remember, and has it provoked any response/question or change in the way they have lived their lives? I seem to remember having read somewhere that if you preach on Sunday, then by Tuesday 80% of your congregation won't remember a word of what you said!

Some sermons though, stick in the mind. This is one I heard of indirectly. It was preached by a man called Juan Carlos Ortiz. Ortiz was the Senior Pastor in a large South American church. However, he was concerned about things that were going on in his church. It had become stale, wasn't moving forward and there were things happening among the people that he felt weren't honouring to God. On this particular Sunday, he had prepared his usual passionate sermon, and was preparing to deliver it, when he felt that God was speaking to him and telling him to scrap what he had prepared. He was having an emotional battle with this when he was called to the pulpit to give his sermon, so went to the pulpit, and stood there looking at the people. He stood there for a few moments, not saving a word and there became an uneasy silence, the large congregation was wondering what was wrong with their usually articulate Pastor. Eventually he said three words: 'Love one another' and stepped down. By now everyone was looking around. The worship band struck up a song to cover the gap and the congregation continued to wonder what was wrong.

A week passed. The next Sunday, everyone arrived at church waiting to worship God and to hear their Pastor preach. Pastor Ortiz stood in the pulpit and uttered three words: 'Love one another'. By this time people started to get unsettled - what was the matter. These three words were the sermon, not just for two weeks, but week after week. Some people left, dissatisfied, but others stuck with it and the 'penny' began to drop Love one another..... what did that mean? How should those three words change the way they lived and when those three words started to transform the lives of the people, Pastor Ortiz moved back to his more 'traditional' way of preaching.

Jesus commanded us to 'Love one another'. It was a command. That implies to me that He knew it wouldn't always be easy, and sometimes we would be tempted to choose not to love. For love is a choice, and at times we have to choose to love not just our friends, not just those who we like, or who are like us, but to love those we don't get on with, love those who have hurt us, even love our enemies.

All this shows me that it's not about having a lot of words - we just need the right words and to act on them. Every blessing



SUNDAY JUNE 16th. 11am at Reepham & Cherry Willingham Village Hall Find out about Human Trafficking in the UK

Human trafficking is modern day slavery. It's serious organised crime and it's big business. Criminals can only profit from the sale of drugs and guns once but they can sell a victim's services again and again. The easiest way to understand human trafficking is to break it down into three simple parts:

The Act: WHAT is done e.g. recruitment, transportation, transfer, harbouring or receipt of persons

The Means: HOW it is done e.g. threat or use of force, coercion, abduction, fraud, deception, abuse of power or position of vulnerability, giving or receiving of payments and benefits used to control a person.

The Purpose: WHY it is done—to exploit victims e.g. in prostitution, other forms of sexual exploitation, forced labour or services, slavery, servitude or removal of organs from a person. Children as young as three have been trafficked into the UK for sexual exploitation. *(Information from Hope for Justice www.hopeforjustice.org.uk)



Time Flies!

First I would like to congratulate Ian Fleetwood on retaining his seat in the County Council election and also to thank him for his help in building the youth shelter. I would also like to thank those of you who voted for me and for your support in nominating me or for delivering leaflets. It was very much appreciated.

I have also an apology to make. In my flyer I put round the village when I missed the deadline two months ago, I mentioned "the Bedroom Tax". One reader pointed out there is no such tax on the statute books. There is, however, a levy on those receiving housing benefits should they be living in accommodation larger than their considered need. In principle I have no objection to this but there will be people in the district who would like to live in a smaller home but there is none available. They will have to pay the levy. I shall say no more.

What is new: the parish plan should now on the web for anyone wishes to take a look, together with statistics for the ward collected from the 2011 Census. And we are still looking for people to help build the nucleus of a sports committee. We have made a start but another four or five members would be much appreciated. Please get in touch.

Dogs bite! I was bitten twice when delivering leaflets! Once in Cherry Willingham when stuffing a leaflet through a letter box and once in Southrey. The second incident was more serious. I pushed open a set of gates to find a letter box and a large Alsatian tried to bite me on my toe, then my shin and succeeded in biting me on my stomach. I was tired and did not notice a sign on the property boundary. Had I been a child or frail, the situation would have been worse. A few hundred yards down the road I was chatting to a dog walker, who had a small dog on a short lead. His dog had recently been attacked by a couple of other dogs, not so well restrained.

Why do I mention it? In the last couple of years a number people have complained to me that their pets had been attacked, either because a dog had got out from its garden through a hole in the fence or because the aggressor was on a long flexi-lead and the owner was not able to reel the dog in fast enough. Fortunately, as far as I know, there has been no serious damage done, but the victims owner's have, naturally, been distressed. My recent experience has shown me just how easily, unexpectedly and fast such an incident can arise.

Bus shelters. In the last month a number of people have phoned requesting a bus shelter(s) for Fiskerton and now that I use the bus more, I can see why. To be able to wait for the bus out of the wind and rain and to be able to sit rather than stand while waiting is a reasonable request to make. Unfortunately, bus shelters are not free. Cherry Willingham Parish Council had to pay for theirs. Grants were available to reduce the £4500+ each cost. Would a bus shelter be a benefit to you? If the answer is yes, why not have a word with your Parish Councillor and make your ideas and feelings known.




