Vicar's Blog!

I've done it again! Sometimes my days seem to be plagued with a need to search for things – that feeling of 'I know I put it somewhere, but where is it; or the last time I saw it, it was in that drawer, but it's not there anymore'. These events usually occur about 5 minutes before I am due to leave the house - they are immensely frustrating, time consuming and sometimes make me feel that life is out of control! I can always tell when it's time to take stock and just spend a morning in the house tidying up and getting the house back into shape – it's the point when I can't find a clerical collar – these are the bits of white plastic that clergy put into their shirt to complete 'the uniform'. I must have about 12 of them that I keep in the drawer (you get a new one every time you buy a new shirt!), there are days, however when I open the drawer and there are none there – then it's time to stop, put everything back where it is supposed to be and get life in order!

Jesus talked about 'lost' things. He told some stories about lost sheep, a lost coin and a young man who rather lost his way in life. Those three stories were told to illustrate a point, a rather more serious one than me losing my clerical collars! There was a woman who lost a coin. In the day in which Jesus told the story, coins were used to comprise the head-dress of a woman who was to be married, and there were ten in all. Coins would be saved over years, and therefore to lose one was to lose something of great worth - the coin meant far more than its actual worth as money - it was a symbol of something much greater than that. So, she searched and searched until she found it – when she did, there was great rejoicing! Something of great significance has been found. Likewise, the lost sheep: sheep were of great value. Pasture in Judea was quite scarce, not the green fields that we are used to, occasionally a sheep from the flock would wander away and become lost. The task of the shepherd was to bring all the sheep back into the fold and so if any were lost, he would go and seek them out, and return them. Every sheep was of great value, and when they were brought back, there was great rejoicing in the community.

The point? Simply this – no matter who we are, where we come from, what our past or present is, what 'issues' we have, how bad we feel, whether we love God, whether we don't, God has embarked on a relentless and patient search for relationship with each of us. That for me is what the whole Bible is about - a God who seeks us out because He loves us.





Something completely different!

There are two documents on the web that I would like to suggest are worth a look. The West Lindsey District Council Annual accounts and the Central Lincolnshire Growth Plan.

Both are on the WLDC web site. Both are easy to find from the WLDC home page and the latter is in a report given to the Policy and Resources Committee last Thursday(the paper on CILs - Community Infrastructure Levy). The meeting was web cast.

If any readers are curious the WLDC annual accounts make very interesting reading. Particularly when compared to previous year's reports. While large documents, they are not as detailed in some respects as I would like but much can be gleaned from them.

My concerns are the rising costs of providing top staff pensions, of providing cultural services, the district council's building budget and the fact that there is so little of the council tax we pay coming back to Fiskerton or Langworth. That to me is a major issue. It is repeated in the Regional Growth Plan. Gainsborough is the main beneficiary and in many ways this is justifiable, but in the document Fiskerton and Langworth get nothing. If we are quiet we will never receive things that have been established as being important to the village.

These include traffic calming measures, a sports facility, youth club and keeping Manor Paddock an Open Space. Your voice is important but so is your help too.

To get traffic calming devices, the village will have to put money on the table, to fund a youth club for perhaps 6 hours a week would cost £3000p.a. for the hall hire alone and there would be other costs to be paid for as well, and several volunteers would be needed to run the facility. Goodness knows what it will cost for a sports facility or getting The Paddock back into use as an open space.

It may mean paying more on our precept and a bigger commitment to time and involvement from residents and a broadening of the role of the Parish Council but I think the village is well worth the effort. One thing is certain, we will see little back from the plan to build 43,000 houses in central Lincolnshire. Having a Parish Plan will entitle us to just 15% of the Community Infrastructure Levy raised from future developments taking place in the village. A Neighbourhood Plan would entitle us 25% of the funds raised so where is the rest going?

Back to the teenage centre, at the moment the teenagers are often blamed for the untidiness behind the village hall, and I would be the last to say they are blame free. They are, however, approachable and generally responsible. But there is a new generation coming up, 10 and 11 year olds who have energy to burn and not much to do. They are usually unsupervised and looking for fun and excitement. Just like us years ago. If they can build a fort in the bushes with pallets from the scout hut or jump up and down on a sofa until it is broken they will do so with little regard for the consequences. It would be considered great fun.

Could an adventure centre with fort, wigwams, trampoline, skate-board ramp and graffiti wall be part of the answer? Suggestions would be most welcome but so would help in getting a result.


