# 'Cutting through the stuff'

Last week I attended a development day for Church School Governors run by the Diocese of Lincoln Board of Education. It was an excellent day, although rather overwhelming at times. Overwhelming because the days of school governors just popping in for a chat, are well gone. Now the task is to monitor and steer and challenge and read copious amounts of information sent out by the Department for Education – and that presents an issue for many of us who want to serve our schools and local communities. Sometimes I feel overwhelmed by stuff. So it needs someone or something to 'cut through the stuff' for us and take us to the heart of it all. On that day, it was a brilliant presentation from a Headteacher and Chair of Governors who told a story, a story of how they had set a new school up, a story of how they had set the vision for the school and how they had found ways of cutting through the 'stuff' and made the task of the Governor less overwhelming and more focussed. I came away feeling that actually I could do it, that it just needed me to focus on the right things...

Focusing on the right thing is key to our wellbeing. I have been listening recently to some talks by Archbishop Justin Welby. I expect he is a rather busy man faced with what must seem like intractable difficulties. However, he gives me a sense that he is a man who knows what is most important and where to focus – 'seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness says Jesus *and then all things will be added*' for that is what 'cuts through the stuff'. Focus on God. We are doing that in our villages over the next 40 days as we launch **40 DAYS OF PRAYER.** 

Christians in our villages (from whichever church) praying together from 31<sup>st</sup> October with Communion together on 30<sup>th</sup> October. Please join in. # PARISH COUNCIL- 16<sup>th</sup> September, 2013

- ➤ The Clerk was asked to contact LCC Highways about the condition of the roads throughout the village and towards Short Ferry to include an email of complaint received from a local resident
- ➤ District Councillor Darcel offered to look into enforcement measures to tidy up the building sites in front of The Close and 18 Ferry Road.
- ➤ Councillor Fleetwood reported that LCC intend to carry out road repairs around the end of the year he asked that residents let him have specific details of repairs needed and he will look into them ifleet@barlings.demon.co.uk.

He also reported that

- (1) LCC hope to have a static library service in Cherry Willingham and the mobile library service will be smaller and manned by one person;
- (2) plans for the eastern bypass are available for viewing and commenting on on-line.
- ➤ The Environment Agency have surveyed the river bank and concluded that it is providing the required Standard of Protection
- LCC Footpaths are hoping to widen the public footpath from Corn Close towards Hall lane and lower the hedge
- The planning application for the storage container on the airfield near the memorial has been withdrawn
- ➤ During the RoSPA play area safety inspection, several items had moved from low to medium risk; necessary remedial repairs are to be made to lower the risk
- ➤ District Councillor Darcel is to continuing to look into lighting measures for the teenage shelter and replacing broken windows
- An application for a bus shelter opposite High Meadows is being processed. LCC is prepared to consider a grant application in future years for further bus shelters in the Parish.

# INTRODUCING THE JOURNEYMAN PROJECT

The Vine Community Church has partnered with the national charity Worth Unlimited to form Worth Unlimited Lincolnshire in order to set up and run the Journeyman Project. This project had a very successful pilot year on land in Cherry Willingham and has now moved to a larger 2 acre plot of land in Reepham, on the south side of the railway line. The objective of Journeyman Project is to run a self-sustaining Market Garden onto which we will take young people who are not in employment, education or training (NEET). These young people are then helped to get the skills needed to obtain employment, an apprenticeship or a full time course.

Dog walkers who use the footpath round the edge of the field in Reepham can watch the progress of the vegetable growing and we hope that everyone will look out for our vegetable sales and support this local charitable project by buying our fresh produce. Well, we are just off on our holidays as I write this, but we will be back by the time the Parish News is delivered.

So, as I do not know what will be topical in 14 days time, I am writing about the local elections to be held in May 2015. Both the District Council and the Parish Council will be holding elections for members. Putting something back into the community in which you live is rewarding and you can make a difference as to how the future unfolds. Why not think about standing?

One thing is certain if you sit on your hands the world will pass you by.

Both elections are important. In the Parish Plan survey a number of key issues were raised, from keeping Manor Paddock an open space, a MUGA( Muliti Universal Games Area), footpaths to Cherry Willingham and Reepham and from Short Ferry to the bus stop and bus shelters in Ferry Road and at Short Ferry. All of which are affordable and achievable and the prime driver has to be the Parish Council. The Parish Council is responsible for administering the Parish Precept. This is the money that is added to your council tax bill that comes straight back to the Parish Council to be spent in the village.

Last year the precept was about £15,000 and this spring the council voted to reduce the precept by £1000. Spread over nearly 500 homes in the village, not all of which pay council tax, this represents a saving of just over £2 per year per household. I expect a number of readers feel this is a definite move in the right direction and at first sight I would agree totally.

Except we cannot rely on charity: if we want bus shelters and many residents in the village rely on the bus service, we have to pay for them. £1000 per year with matched funding from various sources would quickly pay for two extra shelters. It would be the same for the MUGA and for Manor Paddock or road calming measures in Ferry Road. To me, I would be happy to spend £2 per year on any of the above. I might not use the bus much now but who knows about next year.

With the District Council Elections this ward will be merged with Cherry Willingham. In the two and a half years I have been a councillor I have learnt this is worse than I originally imagined. Firstly with three councillors, all likely to be chosen by the larger Cherry vote, how do voters in Fiskerton or Langworth decide which of the three is pulling their weight for the village? They can't. Neither of the two existing Cherry Willingham councillors nor the Cherry Willingham Parish Council wanted their ward extending but we did not make enough noise to resist the change and three seat wards suit the big political parties. With a smaller cake to go round councillors will look after their home vote first and Fiskerton and Langworth will lose out even more. The only way small communities can get even a fair slice of the cake is by having accountable representatives who are prepared to stand up and be counted.

### **Nettleham Police Team**

What a glorious summer we have had, but the nights are drawing in and Halloween and Bonfire night will soon be upon us.

Most of us like a good bonfire and fireworks display, so check out the fireworks codes below to ensure your party goes well with the right type of flashing lights.

#### Fireworks Code for Children

- Fireworks will scare your pets, so keep them safely indoors.
- If you are given a sparkler, always wear gloves.
- Always hold sparklers at arm's length.
- When a sparkler goes out, DON'T TOUCH IT. It could still burn you, so put it in a bucket of water, hot end down.
- You have to be 18 years old before you are allowed to buy fireworks in the shops.
   NEVER PLAY WITH FIREWORKS.
- They are dangerous and can hurt you.
- Never go near a firework when it has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode.
- Only adults should light and hold fireworks.
- When you are watching fireworks, always stand well back.
- Never give sparklers to a child under five.

#### **Fireworks Code for adults**

- Only buy fireworks marked BS 7114.
- Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box.
- Follow the instructions on each firework.
- Light them at arm's length, using a taper.
- Stand well back.
- Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode.
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them.
- Always supervise children around fireworks.
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- Never give sparklers to a child under five.
- Keep pets indoors.
- Don't set off noisy fireworks late at night and never after 11pm.
