PARISH COUNCIL 4th November, 2013

ØThere is unanimous support for the solar farm proposals from members of the parish council following the exhibition in the village hall. Any planning application would of course need careful consideration.

ØRemedial works costing £341 excl VAT are to take place in the play area – new shackles on swings and replacement turf and mats. Councillor Wall is to get prices for replacing the hinges on the double gates.

ØCouncillor Wall also agreed to get prices for hedging on the open space on Holmfield to replace the broken fence

ØRoad from Short Ferry to Fiskerton - LCC Highways reported that

- (a) Ferry Road does not meet the criteria for any sort of speed limit,
- (b) given current funding levels it is unlikely that a footway/cycleway would be built along Ferry Road and
- (c) the areas where the edges are damaged and failing are on the list of desirable future works but there are higher priorities across the network. Potholes are to be filled in as required.

ØDistrict Councillor Darcel -

- Ø Reported that Mr. P. Good had offered to pay for lighting on the teenage shelter if he gets planning permission for the solar farm. Councillor Darcel proposed putting in solid wooden seating and is to apply to WLDC for more funding. He also felt some sort of door cover was needed and offered to do sketches and costings; he would consult with relevant agencies, e.g. police, WLDC.
- Ø Reported that two groups in Cherry Willingham are looking at alternate library plans the parish council in the new and extended Co-op and another group to keep the library where it is but turned into a community hub
- Ø Asked if the Parish Plan should be turned into a Neighbourhood Plan as any village development would bring in a greater infrastructure levy
- Ø Suggested that monies should be put aside for purchasing the Paddock if planning approval is given for housing on the barn area

OCouncillors reported on a meeting they had had with the Church Commissioners' Agent. WLDC had changed their planning guidelines re farm land and are willing to let the barn area be developed. The Church Commissioners wondered if the parish council would be prepared to accept building houses on part of the Paddock with the rest being given to the village as a public open space. The Parish Council had not been happy with these plans but had felt that if they did not agree, the Church Commissioners would continue to use the land as at present or just leave it as a field and the village would still not be able to use it. They had asked if there was any possibility of purchasing the field. Councillors will wait to hear the the Church Commissioners' response, but in the meantime, District Councillor Darcel was to talk to representatives at WLDC.

I am not sure if this will reach you before or after Christmas, but either way Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. It is going to be an exciting one for Pat and me, I hope we will be Grandparents to twins early in the year and what could be better news than that!

This last month has brought several new items that have been on the agenda for a while closer to the boil.

It would seem we are to get two bus stops in the village, the pavement re-surfacing is all that is likely to be done for a while, the Church Commissioners are looking at plans for the old farm buildings and Paddock. If we want to keep the space for the village we may need to come up with some money. I am exploring ways this might be done at West Lindsey. The residents at Short Ferry Caravan Park are still struggling to form a residents association and would still like a proper footpath to the bus stop and a shelter so they can wait for the bus in comfort. Speed calming measures would seem to be more difficult. The "experts" don't seem to think we have a problem with speed in the village. Langworth had similar problems in Barlings Lane, but has managed to get new, more effective signage by offering to make a contribution to the cost of the work. It is the same with cars parking on verges or on the pavement. Again, in Langworth, where the problem is possibly more acute than here, the parish council is frequently told "there is nothing you can do" yet in the Echo some residents in Lincoln are upset because they are fined for parking on the pavement. One suggestion from a Langworth Parish councillor is that West Lindsey brings in a suitable bylaw to give the village some teeth.

The village Youth Shelter, I don't know if I mentioned this last time, but if the solar park goes ahead, Mr Good has kindly offered to arrange for the installers to fit a solar lighting panel to the roof.

Bonfire Nights. Yet again my phone has been ringing as a result of the very loud fireworks that have been let off over several nights this month. I don't think anyone would want to stop the enjoyment of others but it is the noise people find upsetting and the fright it causes their pets. I do not know what the answer is but perhaps if you are hosting a display you might consider going for more sparkle and less bang.

Money: Hampshire County Council, according to the Southern Echo, have slimmed 35% of top management jobs in the 3 years till the end of 2013 and saved £Ms. While this is unfortunate for the top managers who have lost their employment Front Line services have not been cut. If the same approach had been adopted here the libraries would be un scathed and the day centres for those with "special needs" would still be open and the pot holes filled.

In West Lindsey, when our income is going down, our management costs are going up! At least we now know why the council was building up a cash mountain last year. Perhaps I should be called Scrooge but I would rather see my council tax spent on services, or reduced, rather than on more directors. For a small organisation I would have thought West Lindsey has more than enough senior management already.



POLICE NEWS:

British summertime has now officially finished, which signals the start of dark nights and cold weather, we need to be vigilant in the care of our neighbours especially those who are more vulnerable, just popping in from time to time can be enough, keeping our eyes open to whether papers are still stuck in the letterbox or the curtains are shut when they are normally open, small things like this can often save a life.

Another option is to join the nominated neighbour scheme covered in the last edition.

It is not just the vulnerable that need to take care in these darker nights; here are our top tips for your safety:

If you are leaving your house unattended make sure you fit timer switches so that it looks occupied, draw curtains and blinds so your items are not in view of windows. Leave a radio on, this will also help to keep pets calm. Use a door chain so that you can see who is there before opening the door fully, it is also a good idea to have a good light outside your main entrance this way you can see who is outside from the window, do not be worry about leaving people at the door while you go to another window if you can not see, if it is someone you know they will be prepared to wait for you to come to the door.

If it is a workman who wants to come into your home always ask for identification, if you are not sure ask for a number to ring to check their identity before letting them in.

Distraction burglary isn't common, but we all need to be aware of it. This is where criminals call at a house posing as officials or asking for help with something such as a lost pet or a glass of water or pretending to be from an official company. They then make up a story to get inside to steal whatever they can find. Some work alone, but often they work in groups of two or more, usually one person will knock at the door with a convincing excuse that seems genuine or urgent, the talker will persuade the victim to let them in and will keep you occupied whilst another will sneak in and search the house to steal cash and valuables, they can be men, women or children and smartly or casually dressed, as we have said this is not common but we all need to be aware to protect our property. If you suspect a bogus caller do not hesitate to call 999, don't let them in and don't get into conversation with them. Don't worry if they are genuine the Police would rather attend a false alarm than not be called to a distraction burglary.

If you are using a bicycle or motorbike ALWAYS wear High Visibility clothing. Hi Viz waistcoats cost very little and could save your life.

Park your car in a well lit area and remove all valuables and SATNAV holder marks. Look for the safer car park signs; this means the car park has passed minimum standards for safety and security.

If walking, stay in well lit areas and be aware of who is around you. If you feel threatened or at risk, knock on a neighbour's door or enter a public area.


