Getting technical: the solar farm.

One resident has queried whether glare may be a possible side effect from the solar farm. I have raised the issue with both the planning officer and Mr Good, who forwarded my query to the installer. The planning officer and the manufacturer have said glare will not be a problem. The installer provided a list of reflectivity figures and an assurance that the panels are designed to absorb sun light rather than reflect it, which makes sense. I am happy that there is likely to be less glare from the panels than if the area was covered with houses. The question, though, does raise some interesting points for the future. Certainly, less fertilizer, chemicals, pesticides and weed killers will be spread on the land. Which could be of benefit to us, and one keen rambler has suggested we may even see skylarks and lapwings returning to the area. We may even see a return of the bee and we might, once again, see butterflies when out for a walk. Who knows?

The Central Lincolnshire Growth Plan Growth Plan:

Why do I mention it when it would appear Fiskerton was little affected. The reason is money.

- 1) Some 85% of the Community Infrastructure Levy collected in Fiskerton and Langworth will go straight into the communal chest, and the majority of which will be used for building the new bypass and
- 2) The cost of the project. You and I as council tax payers have paid out the best part of £200,000 on the project. Of course Lincolnshire needs a plan for the future, but how could the councillors and officers have got it so wrong? I would suggest those involved with the plan took no further part in future planning the process.

As an "Immigrant from Dorset" I have seen what was a poor area raise its wealth levels through an appropriate "growth plan" but the basics that worked in Dorset seem to be missing from the plan submitted.

Money again, one of the perks of being a WLDC councillor is that I was given a seat on the East Midlands Councils Regional Employers Board. Two issues recently discussed were the minimum living wage and Unison's pay claim of £1 per hour extra across the board. If anyone would like further details please phone me. My reason for mentioning it here is simple, there is money about in Local government, it is how it is spent that is the problem.
