

A Christmas Poem




Guerrilla Knitting, Grochet and Graft Weekend

With the theme......

'Life In and Around a Country Village'



Saturday and Sunday May 17th. & 18th. St. Clement's Church, Fiskerton







During the weekend we hope to make knee blankets which will be given to local charities. To take part in this, come along to Church with pre-knitted squares and help us to sew them into a blanket.

Instructions for a square: Double Knitting Wool, size 9 (3.75) needles. Cast On 41 stitches and (plain) knit 70 rows . Cast off leaving a good length of wool. The squares can be any colour you like and you can join colours if you want to use up wool.

Needles and wool will also be available in Church so you can sit and knit a square or two whilst you are there.

Come along and display your Knitted, Crocheted or Craft Items in St. Clement's Church anytime between 2pm & 7pm on Friday May 16th. How you do this is up to you and we are happy for you to be as creative as you like with your presentation.

Please bring whatever you need with you.

Unlike proper guerrilla knitters, we do not wish your wonderful work to be anonymous so please include a card with your name, for display.

This weekend is the second weekend of the **West Lindsey Open Churches** Festival

Guerrilla Knitting, Crochet and Craft comes to Fiskerton.....

Guerrilla knitters are people who knit or crochet items and then use them to decorate public spaces, leaving their work there for a period of time for people to enjoy.

They are usually anonymous.

Now we know that there are a lot of good knitters in Fiskerton – and the surrounding area – and we would like you to knit or crochet an item – or several items – or a whole scene – to represent......

'Life in and around a Country Village'

This can be any aspect of rural life. Just to give you a start with ideas.....

- clubs and societies
- outdoor activities like hunting, shooting and fishing, walking, cycling
- countryside jobs such as farming, the blacksmith etc.
- events like fetes and fun days
- village sports football, cricket
- anything to do with nature, the river, the woods etc.

Or anything else which inspires you and fits into this theme.

Then bring it along to our public building, St. Clement's Church, for display (see opposite)

Sadness and joy.

<u>Sadly</u> my good friend Barry Beeby passed away at Christmas, and it is not only his family who will miss him. Barry, a retired lecturer at Nottingham University, has been a keen player in archaeological life of the city. Most important to us in the village though, it was Barry's eagle eye that spotted the WLDC/LCC plan for an open windrow compost application on the airfield. Without Barry, many of us in the village would have been plagued by unpleasant smells and increased levels of asthma attacks. Barry was also very helpful in investigating the planned mega dairy at Nocton. Again, this village would have been affected.

<u>Joy</u>, Pat and I have just been rewarded with the addition of twins, which trebles our number of grandchildren and we are delighted.

So where to start with the news.

<u>The rave</u>. What a to do? As yet the youngsters still have no glass in the windows and hopefully that will be sorted shortly, but what a sorry state of affairs. It would seem that such parties are run as a business venture. Village halls are hired out deliberately for the purpose. I have asked the new police commissioner to make sure the matter is investigated thoroughly and will keep you posted.

<u>Hawthorn Road</u>, the other cause of excitement was the meeting in Reephan last Friday. The planned road closure of Hawthorn Road hit a nerve with a great many residents. In my own household I am not bothered, I hardly ever use that route to Lincoln, my wife, however, is a frequent user. When I delivered flyers round the village two out of three people I met were unhappy.

It was the meeting that I found interesting. It seemed to me more thought, consultation and more alternatives should have gone into the planning process and the options evaluated not just for cost today but for perhaps the next 50 years. The long term impact on pollution and carbon footprint had not been considered. These and many other important issues were raised by a number of well informed speakers from the floor. I was disappointed that the County Council representatives did not make some effort to say "we hear what you say- we will see what we can do". They have been running the design for years and I am sure if they had wanted, last minute changes could easily be made. It would just need a little bit of midnight oil and a willingness to accept that they had paid insufficient attention when consulting the village. In local government the piper tells the payer the tune. If you are in sympathy with the Cherry/Reepham/Greetwell residents please sign the epetition.

Future activities

The next newsletter will invite anyone interested in the work of the group to attend a meeting to discuss "what next" such as parish walks leaflets.

To date the group hasn't managed to find someone to take a lead on field walking to record archaeological finds but it looks as though we may be able to join in with a neighbouring group in the future.

There is also still the possibility of a special project to do some woodland archaeology if a funding bid is resubmitted and is successful.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS: 16th. December 2013

Please be advised that these are notes of the meeting taken by the Clerk and cannot in any way be regarded as the official minutes of Council proceedings until they are approved and signed at the next meeting. Official minutes are available at http://www.fiskerton-lincs.org.uk/html/meetings_minutes.html

- There is unanimous support for the solar farm plans from members of the parish council as long as the following conditions were met: 1. It needs to be well landscaped so that, for instance, it cannot be intrusive from the bedroom windows on the nearby new estates. 2. Wildlife refuges must be maintained and created where appropriate. 3. Footpaths and bridleways need to be well maintained and not to the legal minimum. If their routes are altered, this should be made very clear with maps provided. 4. Fracking should not be allowed. In addition it was felt that the community should receive long term benefits from the project, e.g. a large financial contribution made which would enable community projects in the future.
- > The Clerk was asked to contact Mr. R. Wills, senior LCC Highways officer, informing him of the lack of substantial highways works throughout the village; also asking what the criteria is for upgrading the road network from C-class to B-class. She was also asked to report a loose kerbstone outside 17 Church View Crescent
- ➤ District Councillor Darcel is looking into 1. getting Community Grant funding towards installing solid wood seating in the teenage shelter together with associated flooring; 2. WLDC taking over ownership of the open spaces on Holmfield and 3. the condition of the site at Short Ferry
- ➤ Councillor Fleetwood reminded all that anybody can report highway defects online www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/highways and any highway issues should not be reported to District Councillor Darcel but should be reported to him ifleet@barlings.demon.co.uk. He reported that LCC Highways budget is to be drastically reduced in two years' time and is encouraging all parishes to upgrade their road network.
- \triangleright The precept for 2014/15 has been set at £15,000.
- ➤ All villagers are reminded that reports/requests to the parish council should be <u>signed and dated</u>; anonymous requests/reports cannot be dealt with.
- ▶ <u>Date of Next Meeting</u>: 3rd February, 2014 at 7.30 p.m. in the village hall

<u>HAWTHORN ROAD</u>: Following the overwhelming objection shown against LCC's plans to close Hawthorn Road, shown at the public meeting, an online petition has been started at:

As this link is rather long you can visit <u>www.change.org</u> and search for "hawthorn road" or email <u>loucarder@gmail.com</u> and you will be sent a link to the petition.

Alternatively, for those without access to the internet, there are copies of the petition available to sign at local post offices, newsagents and pubs.

The online petition has attracted over 700 signatures in just over 72 hours but we want to keep this going to obtain as many votes as possible ahead of the public inquiry on 4th February where the petition will be presented. If we can reach 3000 signatures then LCC would be forced to review the objection contained within the petition, which is the closure of the existing Hawthorn Road and associated non-motorised user bridge scheme. A Facebook site has also been set up called 'Hawthorn Road Closure'.

Energy suppliers can offer lower energy prices to a collective contract made up of thousands of customers. The more people that sign up, the lower the energy prices that could be offered. People who have never switched energy supplier and are on a standard tariff are likely to make the greatest savings.

The scheme is easy to join by registering your details at www.west-lindsey.gov.uk/switch

Alternatively residents can call 01522 782067 or register at their local council.

In West Lindsey, residents can also visit the council offices to register. Opening times at the Guildhall, Gainsborough are Monday and Tuesday, 8.30am-5pm, Wednesday 8.30am-3.30pm, Thursday, 8.30am-6pm, Friday, 8.30am-4.30pm

Once the registration deadline has passed on Monday February 17, the tariff of the lowest bidding energy supplier will be offered to residents. Residents are then able to choose to accept the offer or not. People on pre-payment meters can also choose to switch.

Once registered, there is no obligation to switch. When the auction has been completed customers will receive an offer letter by email or post if registration was made 'offline'.

Customers then have four weeks to confirm they wish to switch supplier by following the instructions in the offer email or returning a signed form by post.

Cllr Jeff Summers, leader of West Lindsey District Council said: "We are encouraging as many residents to choose to make the change to the Lincolnshire Energy Switch scheme and to work with iChoosr for a community switch here in Lincolnshire.
