

#### VICAR'S BLOG:

I have no doubt that all of you reading this will share my horror and revulsion at the kidnapping of over 200 girls from their school in Nigeria and the stated aims of their captors to sell them into slavery. My first response to hearing of the kidnapping was to disbelieve it – how do you capture 200 students from a school without anyone reacting very, very quickly? I realize that we are talking about a very different context and terrain, but it is shocking. It seems that these girls were abducted precisely because they were in school, receiving an education, and for the terrorists this is unacceptable – that also makes me horrified. Their poor parents and families must be distraught and feel totally powerless to do anything – they thought their children were safe and on their way to a different life.

Sometimes it's easy to become immune to the things we hear on the news, because we see so much sadness, but I have to say that this has made my blood boil. I think that's because I have benefitted from a great education, and probably whilst I was in school I never realized that there were millions of girls of my age who never had that opportunity and in fact were actively denied that opportunity. It's not just girls though, it's boys who are forced into armies, boys and girls who are living in abject poverty and girls, boys, women and men who are driven into slavery and trafficked by ruthless powerful people.

I guess we can sit back and believe that this is nothing to do with us, that its happening a long way away and that there is nothing we can do, but frankly, but let's face it, every time something like this happens, our humanity is diminished. We have to stand up for the powerless even if the only thing we can do is to sign a petition and join an outcry that *this is just plain wrong*. By doing that just maybe we can bring a glimmer of hope to a situation that seems hopeless and to people that may be losing any sense of hope. I am praying, praying for a good conclusion, praying that these young women will be returned to their families and will be able to continue their education – please join me in those prayers.

One other thing – we take our own freedom so much for granted – let's give thanks everyday for the quality of life we enjoy and the freedom it brings us. Every blessing,





<u>Planning matters and a Neighbourhood Plan:</u> I am not an expert on planning. In the three years I have been a district councillor I have attended all the WLDC training planning courses to allow me to sit on the planning committee as a substitute, but when I have done so I have realised just how much more knowledge many of the more experienced members have.

Unfortunately, even in this short time planning has changed. There is now a National Planning document that is very different to the planning structures that preceded it and officers now seem to have the power to decide which applications are presented to the planning committee and which are dealt with under delegated powers. As a district councillor, like residents and parish councils I can request that an application is put before the committee but strong "planning grounds" are need to do this. In the last few months I have successfully challenged one application on the grounds of visual impact. Fortunately, the Planning Committee agreed unanimously and the application was withdrawn.

Fortunately too, the rush to build houses has not seriously reached Fiskerton or Langworth yet but it is all around us.

900 new homes are planned in Louth, 200 in Branston, 450 in Scotter and it is likely some 200 acres of land will be up for development soon in Cherry Willingham. If these, together with all the 1,000s of new homes planned in Lincoln and West Lindsey happen the expressions "concrete jungle" and "escape to the country" will take on new meanings. Where will the country be? And no one seems to ask, "Where are all the new jobs, hospitals, police, parks or schools coming from?"

The new Planning Rules are not all bad. More attention is given to the disposal of surface water and alleviating flood risks than before. "SUD"s will soon be in place: Sustainable Urban Development should be law in the autumn and I have been told our planners request new developments meet the yardsticks now. As far as I can see SUDs require developments to store surface water run -off within the site with a view to the water being discharged to existing water courses when safe to do so. I could be wrong but the experts on the Witham Drainage Board seem happy with what they have seen.

There is one problem, in Ringwood, Dorset, my old home town, a planning application for 125 houses has been submitted- with a brilliant plan for flood protection. But it was flawed. An old school pal of mine pointed out that the plan was fine when the soil was dry, water tables low and infiltration rates high, but after a period of prolonged heavy rainfall the plan would be useless.

The only protection I can see for villages like ours is through a **neighbourhood plan.** We cannot stop development but we can have some say in where it will go. As a prelude Langworth is working towards its Parish Plan and Fiskerton has already gone down the route. Neighbourhood Plans are more complicated and expensive to prepare and require full commitment from the Parish Council and a lot of hard work from a number of residents. Cllr S. Curtis, Chairman of WLDC Planning Committee has suggested to me that getting a plan in place should be considered **URGENT**.

Thursday, June 19<sup>th</sup>, the Village Hall Fiskerton: Rob Lawton, a WLDC Planning Officer and expert on Neighbourhood plans will be advising the village on how to proceed. In the past Neighbourhood plans have been expensive and Rob will be advising us on how to keep costs down. Could we for instance work with our neighbouring villages to save money? All ideas are welcome.
