

VICARS BLOG:

Over the last week, in its weekly cycle of prayer, the church has given thanks for the apostle Barnabas, known as the 'Son of Encouragement'. Barnabas first comes onto the scene in the Bible early in the book of Acts – the account of the birth of the early church and the subsequent challenges it faced. He is noted in a passage which tells of how the early church started to come together by sharing their possessions, holding things in common and giving to the poor. Barnabas sold a field and brought the money to the apostles to buy what was needed. Later on Barnabas accompanies Paul on his various journeys and then continues in ministry on his own, to be 'the encourager'.

I note this, because the Diocese of Lincoln is asking its parishes to think about 'what they might hold in common'. For many years we have thought about 'our parish', or 'our village', now we are being encouraged to ask how we might work better together, what we can hold in common, what we might share and where we can support one another. The term that the Diocese have asked us to use is 'mission communities' - how can we build mission communities, to both build the church and serve our communities? This includes, how we work with our ecumenical partners, not just how we work as Church of England Churches.

Of course, this involves a risk. It is a natural human reaction, when we are asked to work together, to hold onto what we have because that is what gives our security, and yet, what we learn from scripture, one example of which is in the life of Barnabas, is that when we give up the things we hold onto, God grows what we have given.

These are exciting times in our Diocese, much is happening watch this space! Every Blessing

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Please be advised that these are notes of the meeting taken by the Clerk and cannot in any way be regarded as the official minutes of Council proceedings until they are approved and signed at the next meeting. PARISH COUNCIL/ANNUAL PARISH MEETING - 19th May, 2014

- A minute's silence was held in memory of the late Chairman, Kipper Scott, who had served this community for over 30 years
- ➤ Elected Officers for 2014/2015 were: Chairman A. Cooke, Vice Chair R. Wall. Planning Committee Chairman, Vice Chair, Councillors Patchett, Canner and Mrs. Howard. Play Area Inspector R. Wall. Police Liaison Mrs. M. Howard.
- Alan Brown, LCC Area Highways Officer explained in great detail the limitations he has in the way of funding and manpower all County Council departments and services are being cut by 40% over a ten year period. His priorities had to be carriageways over footways but the investment in the services did not keep up with the demand. He offered to come to regular parish council meetings will attend next in early November.
- ➤ The Clerk was asked to contact: (1) LCC Highways re resurfacing the road at The Close; (2) LCC Footpaths re obstructions on public footpaths between St. Clement's Drive and Nelson Road; (3) RoSPA re including teen shelter in their annual inspection.
- Councillors are very concerned about the area in and around the teen shelter. The glass has been replaced but the whole area is covered in rubbish. Councillors are to look into securing the rubbish bins so that they cannot be knocked over and will aid the youngster to keep to area tidier.
- > The footpath from Short Ferry to the bus stop has been completed.
- Repairs to the play area have brought the area back to a low risk area. Councillor Wall is to get quotes for repairing the hinges on the double gates so that they can be closed
- ➤ The insurance was agreed for the year 2014/2015 and includes the new bus shelter. The Clerk is to look into obtaining a memorial plaque to go on the shelter.
- Lark Energy is hoping to start building the solar farm in June. They will shortly be coming to assess the village hall and scout hall for possible provision of solar panels and all village projects are hanging on the results of this survey.
- District Councillor Darcel reported that the first Neighbourhood Plan meeting is to be on 19th June, 2014. He feels there is a continuing problem with the behaviour of some young people in the village. He had attended the County Council AGM where a petition had been received from 3,500 local residents to keep Hawthorn Road open when the Eastern Bypass is built.
- Date of Next Meeting: 30th June, 2014 in the village hall at 7.30 p.m.

Fiskerton's near miss.

An election for a parish councillor! Cows on the river bank and noisy lorries on Chapel Road have all been hot topics in the last few days.

With the announcement of a vacancy by the Parish Council as a result of Cllr Kipper Scott's sad passing, a number of residents felt it would be appropriate for the village to hold an election to choose Kipper's successor.

Kipper donated years of his time to the village, both as a councillor and chairman of the parish council, and it was Kipper's agreement to the Parish Council's holding an EGM that gave the village its chance to voice concern over the proposed open windrow composting site on the airfield.

The idea of an election seemed fine until the possible cost was counted. The cost of holding one election for one parish councillor, who would again have to be re-appointed next May would be...... nearly £2,000.

While an allowance for such an occurrence would be made in the parish budgets the consensus view of those keen on the idea was that the money, nearly £2,000, might be better spent in other ways. In the Parish Plan a number of residents wished to see the Paddock retained as an open space, more sports facilities in the village and speed calming measures on the approach roads to the village and by the school. Others wished to see bus shelters. The Ferryside residents raised a petition in the cause. £2,000 would be a handy down payment for any of these projects.

In spite of the cost, a number of residents felt that as a matter of principal the election should be held. It was a tough call but having an election next May has one advantage. It gives you time to think about standing for the council. Being a parish councillor is unpaid but there are rewards and it is great to put something back into society. Next May will also see the creation of the "Greater Cherry Willingham" ward which will elect three district councillors to West Lindsey. If you would like to have more say in how your affairs are run in the district why not stand to be one of these three new district councillors.

Cows on the river bank. This has to be the topic of the month. And there is little I can say that is helpful. The riverbank is owned by the Environment Agency. The grazing has been let on a long term lease to the owner of the cows. The Estate's Manager is sympathetic to those who would prefer the cows not to be there and has promised to contact me again when he has explored the situation.

Noisy Lorries. Just recently more lorries than usual have been speeding through the village. The problem has been in Chapel Road, with lorries travelling to Reepham. This brings three problems, safety, vibrations and noise. A forty ton lorry travelling at perhaps 50 mph is far, far worse, than the same weight lorry travelling at 30 mph. If anyone knows who owns the lorries or to whom they are contracted, it may be a polite request could reduce the problem.

The Councillor's Initiative Fund. I have still some money left to spend. If you know of a worthwhile project please let me know as soon as possible.





Upcoming Sports Events

LINCOLNSHIRE POLICE: Drink and Drug Driving Report a Drink Driver - text DRINK to 80800

Lincolnshire Police launched their summer drink and drug drive campaign. 1st June 2014 Members of the public will be able to report a drink driver they know using a short code SMS text service. Simply text the word DRINK to 80800 with details of the vehicle, where the person will be drinking and when. Police officers will use the information to stop, arrest and process the driver through the Courts. This is only to be used for non-emergency cases. If members of the public see a drink/drug driver actually

driving, they should treat it as an emergency and call 999.

With a long hot summer forecast drivers are reminded that police will be carrying out roadside checks at all times of the day including the mornings. With the use of FIT (Field Impairment Test) officers will be testing drivers for the effects of drugs as well as drive during this campaign.

Whilst the numbers are slowly falling there are still an unacceptable number of deaths and injuries on our roads linked to drink and drug driving. This operation will not target one section of the community but be spread across the entire driving population to get the message out that drinking and driving is not tolerated.

In a recent Government THINK road safety survey around a quarter of respondents (24 per cent) in England and Wales thought they knew someone who drove when over the legal limit which is similar to previous surveys. Men are far more likely to be drink drive casualties than women and younger road users are also disproportionately likely to be involved — around one third of those killed or seriously injured were aged between 16 and 24, almost 80% of whom were male.
