

Vicar's Blog:

Towards the end of the summer I had a couple of weeks off and was able to enjoying doing what I never make enough time to do – read. One of the books I read was called 'The Hiding Place', by Corrie Ten Boom. It's a powerful read, since Corrie was imprisoned by the Nazi regime for hiding and protecting Jews, during the second world war. Her sister died in the camp, Corrie survived. Her Christian faith sustained her throughout that period and through the rest of her life. In the book she tells of the very poignant and moving experience of meeting one of the chief guards who kept her captive in the concentration camp. After the war was over she was preaching at a church service on the subject of forgiveness. As she left the pulpit and came down to the centre of the church, she noticed a man coming toward her with his hand extended and a smile on his face. She recognized him as the chief guard in the concentration camp where she and her sister had been incarcerated and where her sister had died. The guard's face was beaming in response to her preaching. "Fraulein," he said, "how grateful I am for your powerful message. To think that Jesus has forgiven my sins and washed them away." Corrie Ten Boom found herself paralyzed as the guard thrust his hand out toward hers.

She could not raise her hand from her side. She writes, "Even as the vengeful thoughts boiled through me, I saw the sin of them. . . . and yet I could do nothing about it. I could not feel even the slightest spark of love or charity. And so I breathed this silent prayer. 'Jesus, I cannot forgive him, please give me your forgiveness.'" And with that prayer she was able to lift her hand from her side and touched the hand of the man who had persecuted her. "From my shoulder," she writes, "along my arm and through my hand passed a current from me to him . . . and in that moment I discovered that it is not on our forgiveness any more than on our goodness that the world's healing depends, the world's healing depends upon God. When our Lord tells us to love our enemies, he gives us, along with the command to do it, the love itself"

Peter once went to Jesus and asked him how many times you have to forgive someone..... the answer was simple, keep forgiving. We often confuse forgiving with forgetting, or excusing the act that has wounded us – and sometimes we are terribly wounded. It takes great courage to forgive, but too it is an act of God's grace worked in us and through us – so necessary in a complicated and broken world. .

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Please be advised that these are notes of the meeting taken by the Clerk and cannot in any way be regarded as the official minutes of Council proceedings until they are approved and signed at the next meeting. PARISH COUNCIL/ANNUAL PARISH MEETING – 15th September, 2014

The Clerk was asked to contact: (1) LCC Highways about realigning the school crossing patrol sign and road fingerposts at the junction of Chapel Road/Ferry Road and clearing the footpath of weeds around The Paddock; (2) Acis about a broken 'No Ball' sign at The Crescent

- Councillors adopted the update to the Financial Regulations recommended by the External Auditor, Grant Thornton
- A stainless steel memorial plaque is to be provided at the bus shelter in memory of Mr. David Welsh. His son donated £1000 to the village in memory of his father and this money was used towards the purchase of the bus shelter.
- Neighbourhood Plan – future meetings are to be held on 22nd September and 21st October – the latter being a cheese and wine evening showing progress so far. These meetings are open public meetings and it is hoped residents will support these important meetings, as the Neighbourhood plan could affect the village for many years to come.
- Teen Shelter - investigations are ongoing as to steps to be taken to tidy up the area, the Council feels that progress needs to be expedited. Cllr Wall informed the meeting that following the recent ROSPA Play Area Inspection, the area near to the teen shelter had been classed as a medium risk due to surface litter there which further supports the need for progress with the Teen shelter.
- Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership has launched a Community Speed Watch Initiative to help curb speeding throughout villages. The Parish Council is applying for permission to purchase a speed monitoring device and four mounts so that the device can be moved around the village. It is hoped that these mounts will be near the entrances to the village with one in the centre.
- The Parish Council is registering with the Information Commissioners Office under the Data Protection Act.
- Safety concerns have been made over the proposed multi-user bridge on Hawthorn Road. The bridge will be discussed by LCC Planning on 6th October, following a site inspection on 1st October.

FISKERTON PARISH NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN :

Neighbourhood Plans will become part of the planning application and approval process in the near future and parishes without a Neighbourhood Plan will have less control of development in their area. Fiskerton Parish Council's application to form a Neighbourhood Plan has been accepted by West Lindsey District Council and the Parish Council has formed a Neighbourhood Plan subcommittee to take it forward. The planning group consists of Robert Wall (Chairman), Bill Roberts (Vice Chairman), Pam Smith (Secretary), Paul Forman, Stuart Canner, Barry Canner and Chris Darcel (West Lindsey District Council). We have already had several meetings and formed a draft plan for the Fiskerton area as a discussion document.

WLDC will require evidence of consultation with parishioners in the formation of the plan and if WLDC approves the plan it will then be put to the parishioners as a referendum to accept or decline. 50% of those that vote must vote to accept the plan for it to be approved so obviously getting people in the Parish involved is very important. **Our next meeting is on Mon 22nd Sept. and we are organising a Wine and Cheese event in the Village Hall on Tuesday 21st Oct. at 7.00pm.** All parishioners are invited and we intend to show you the provisional planning done to date, to answer questions and listen to your valued comments.

If you feel strongly about the future structure of our village please contact any of the above planning committee members, come to our meetings/events and get involved.

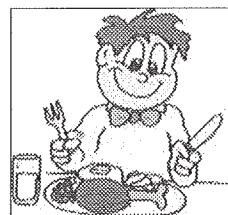

Well this summer has been the best I remember and I am just sorry it is drawing to an end. And with very few council meetings in August it has been quite a break. But it is back to business in earnest now!

Hawthorn Rd is a major issue for me. Not everybody agrees but I will find losing one of my two current routes to Lincoln a pain, especially as I have become a fan of the new super Tesco store. By the time you read this it will be difficult to influence events but even at this late hour you could petition your County Councillor Ian Fleetwood. clhri.fleetwood@lincolnshire.gov.uk

Otherwise there are number of issues I would like to mention.

Firstly, I have been contacted over dog fouling on grass play areas, on the Crescent and in Holmfield. Mums are fed up with their children bringing the muck indoors on their shoes after running about on the grass. Open space grass areas are consider to be the same as pavements and footpaths, so please keep an eye on your dog.

Second, bonfires. Fortunately, bonfires are a rare occurrence today, but smoke and smuts polluting the gardens downwind can be a problem. The experts at West Lindsey suggest that letting the cuttings dry out and encouraging a fast burn with a well ventilated bonfire will cause less smoke than using an incinerator and, they say, please make sure there is no washing out on the line next door!

Third, hedges growing over pavements. In High Meadows and on the Holmfield, corner of Chapel Rd, the hedges are becoming a pain for pedestrians and residents have complained to me! There is little I can do other than pass the complaint on to the Parish Council, which I have done. Hedges over growing foot paths on Lincolnshire County Council pavements, as on Ferry Road leading down to Five Mile Lane are easy. Just a phone call to LCC and the job was done(this time)..

Four. A pair of heavy duty maroon handled branch loppers have vanished from outside my home. I was side tracked from my hedge trimming and by the time I had returned to the task the loppers had gone. I saw our PCSO at a coffee morning at Langworth and mentioned the event. The PCSO pointed out there are dozens of "street salesmen" who are really just out to look for easy pickings and to spot homes where the owners are on holiday. The only safe people to buy from on the door step will have a Police "Pedlar's Licence" and it is worth asking to see their copy.

The coffee morning in Langworth piggy backs use of the village hall with the post office, which saves costs, and often a dozen or more residents pop in. Coffee mornings do happen in Fiskerton too. Apparently, at the Church on Tuesdays and the Carpenters Arms on Thursdays. I have not been but now they are on my list! If you would like to volunteer your services we could explore the option of running one in the village hall now and again.

Five. Appointments to see a Doctor. In the last few years I thought getting an appointment to see a doctor had got better. This last week I have discovered different. If you, or someone elderly you know, have a problem making an appointment, please let me know. Is it a big problem in the village? I can see that for some elderly residents making any phone call could be difficult and some automated procedures could prove quite frightening. Without knowing the numbers I can say little.

Lastly, "Fiskerton Tots" a creative play group for mums and the under 4s, have their first meeting booked at 10.30am Monday, 3rd November in the village hall. If you would like further details please contact Victoria, 01522 753509 or Lisa, 01522 751204.

What a surprise- I have not mentioned anything I intended to say- so be thankful for small mercies.

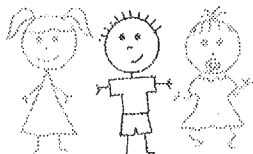

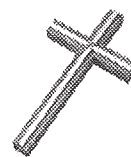

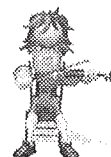

"Families Working Together is Lincolnshire's response to the Government's Troubled Families Programme. We will work with families in Lincolnshire to help reduce crime and anti-social behaviour, non-attendance at school and worklessness.

The aim of the project is to address family problems in a joined-up way. This is done through a dedicated Key Worker.

If you know of families who may be involved in at least two of:

- Youth crime and/or anti-social behaviour;
- Non-attendance at school;
- * Claiming out of work benefits

Then please refer to us! The latest referral form and more information about FWT can be found at the Lincolnshire County Council website (please note that this service is voluntary and the family must consent to the referral)

Some families often need support from many different organisations. For example a member of a family could have problems finding a job, setting up routines for their children or managing the family budget.

Families Working Together (FWT) is about supporting families to find ways of making positive changes to their lives that will help solve these problems.

Support time depends on the needs of individual families, as all are different and will need different levels of support during difficult times.

This opportunity is being offered to a limited number of families in Lincolnshire, giving them the chance to make changes they need to make.

Your family would have its own dedicated **Key Worker** who will help you shape the support you want.

We know it works because it has proved successful in other places around the country and there has even been a similar scheme here in Lincolnshire which has made a difference to families.

Traditionally, different organisations have looked at meeting different needs for different family members in isolation. This fresh approach looks at meeting the needs of the family as a whole. It has already proven to be a better way of supporting families to meet their needs, and provides a way of making positive changes that last. Families who have benefitted say they can clearly see the advantages of getting involved in this type of project. As well as making great improvements to their lives, they feel they are a stronger family.



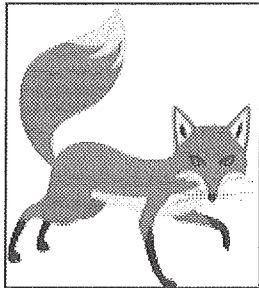

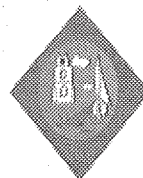
