

Bishop of Lincoln's Letter:

This year's time of remembrance is particularly poignant, given that it is the centenary of the dreadful tragic events of the First World War. By the end of the war a million British men were dead, and two million more had been wounded. There was not a single family unacquainted with grief, nor a corner of life unaffected.

Many of us have become familiar with the story of Amy Beechey, a mother from Lincoln who saw eight sons go to war, and only three return. We can only imagine her grief; but every day of the war, her pain was known and understood by grieving relatives in households all over England.

The horror of the trenches, the scale of the slaughter, the tragic loss of so much human potential –all these things meant that long-held notions of an all-powerful God began to be questioned. Put simply: If God is loving and all-powerful, how could evil be allowed to flourish on this devastating scale? And why would we continue to trust in a God seemingly indifferent to our fate?

One person who wrestled with these questions was Geoffrey Studdert Kennedy, an army chaplain who earned the nickname Woodbine Willie for handing out cigarettes to the troops at the same time as copies of the New Testament.

Woodbine Willie insisted on being on the front line with the troops whenever he could, and those battlefield experiences forced him to confront depths of evil and suffering which few of us will ever see. Having entered the war with a secure faith in God and an abstract notion of evil, he ended it being absolutely certain of the existence of evil as a real and palpable force at work in the world. The challenge, then, was to find a way to reconcile all that he had seen in the trenches with the existence of a God who was worth believing in.

For Woodbine Willie, hope came with an understanding that God was no longer a remote and detached figure at the peak of a great social pyramid. No longer was God the almighty force of his pre-war understanding, able to prevent humans from harming one another if he so chose. Instead, God was present in the heat of battle, suffering along with humanity, in the intolerable conditions of the trenches, in the endless slaughter of young lives, in the agony of Amy Beechey and all those like her back home. God was characterised not by force and power, but by love; no longer remote from all that was going on, but intimately connected with it and suffering through it.


Writing in 1918, he said this:

'God loves us enough to bear our burdens and suffer along with us; the destruction of warwill not have the final word, because Christ's example promises us resurrection from death.'

The first world war brought the horrifying reality of modern warfare to every home in the land; it brought a new awareness that God is not distant and other, but is involved through Jesus Christ in our struggles and sufferings.

Despite all the evil in the world we continue to have faith in this God: the God who brings love out of hate; light out of darkness; justice out of oppression; good out of evil; and life out of death. This is our God: the God of Love and Resurrection.

The Following is an important piece of information for all who live in Fiskerton The Paddock Field

Recently The Church Commissioners approached the Parish council for their opinion on some 'proposals' that they had in mind for the Paddock field.

The Council felt that they were requesting this meeting in response to our announcement that we intended to produce a 'Neighbourhood Plan', which would outline how the village wants to develop over the coming years. Being a legal local planning document it would form part of the local planning strategy and would have to be referred to for any planning, as such it would have a direct impact upon any developments in the village in the future.

The meeting was an informal occasion in which they presented their ideas and asked for our views. Their proposal involved developing approximately three quarters of the paddock, the remainder being recreational space.

There followed some frank discussions and the Council left the Church Commissioners in no doubt of our position. We - and the village - have no desire to see any building on the Paddock field now or in the future and we would oppose most strongly any planning application that may submitted in regard to the Paddock field. We pointed out that we are not against development entirely and suggested to them that they may wish to look toward other land they own around the village.

The representatives of the Church commissioners appeared to be open to suggestions and they left to consider their options.

The Parish Council is also investigating the possibility of protecting the Paddock field as an 'Open Green Space' under WLDC's draft Local Plan but given that the land is owned by the Church Commissioners and the plan is only at the draft stage this may be problematic.

It cannot be stressed enough, that there has been <u>no planning application</u> filed with WLDC in regard to the paddock. As the Church Commissioners are the major land holder in and around Fiskerton, it is imperative that we keep a dialogue going with them. They seemed open to ideas, but only time will tell what their intentions will turn out to be. We will of course keep you informed of any developments. *Andrew Cooke - Chair of Parish Council*

What a glorious summer we have had, but the nights are drawing in and Halloween and Bonfire night will soon be upon us. Most of us like a good bonfire and fireworks display, so check out the fireworks codes below to ensure your party goes well with the right type of flashing lights.

Fireworks Code for adults

- Only buy fireworks marked BS 7114.
- Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box.
- Follow the instructions on each firework.
- Light them at arm's length, using a taper.
- · Stand well back.
- Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode.
- · Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them.
- Always supervise children around fireworks.
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- Never give sparklers to a child under five.
- Keep pets indoors.
- Don't set off noisy fireworks late at night and never after 11pm.

The Paddock. I am writing this before the Neighbourhood Plan meeting on Tuesday 21st but events seem to be overtaking us. The Church Commissioners have ambitious house building plans for the field. Naturally these were rejected by the Parish Council. It is difficult to predict what will happen, the Church Commissioners were requested to come up with alternative plans.

The joint Planning Unit. Since the failure of the WLDC, NKDC and Lincoln City Joint Planning Policy Unit a year ago house builders are piling in the applications for extensive developments. This is because with no Local Plan in place developers will not have to pay CILs (Community Infrastructure Levy) and there are less secure yardsticks for what can be built and where. With no WLDC Local Plan likely till mid 2016 I am not so sure how things will work out. Two defensive routes for the Paddock are being explored, one through "green open spaces" and the other through Community Assets. There is not space here to explain all but I am sure both will be brought up and covered on 21st October. One thing is certain, the threat to our village of losing the Paddock and other open spaces is real.

What else? Falling leaves and conkers on pavements are a problem as is litter, overgrowing hedges, un-cleared ditches and bushes/tress obstructing sight lines on road junctions and cars parking on pavements are still issues. Leaves on pavements are West Lindsey problems and I am sorry I have not been more effective in getting them cleared. Highways matters, such as overgrowing hedges, footpaths and potholes are County Council, and the telephone help desk 01522 552222 has been has been most professional. County Councillor Ian Fleetwood.cllri.fleetwood@lincolnshire.gov.uk will be delighted to take up your Highways concerns.

In the District Council Election next May, Fiskerton and Langworth will not exist. We will be part of the Cherry Willingham Ward and served by three councillors. All three could come from Fiskerton and Langworth or Cherry! If you did wish to stand you could either contact your local political party representative or Ind County Cllr Marianne Overton MBE is giving a short introductory briefing on the Independent route at the Advocat Arms in Market Rasen 19th November at 7.30pm.

Two last items: Fireworks go off with a bang! So please consider your next door neighbours' pets and advise your neighbour if your party is to be on a different day or time to November 5th.

And lastly if you have any community activity you would like to get off the ground and fee use of the village hall would help you get started, please either contact me or Jenny at the Hall.
