Church Commissioners.

At the Neighbourhood Plan Cheese and Wine consultation evening on the 21st of October, the Church Commissioners came across as insensitive and intransigent to the wishes of the village. They intend to apply for outline planning permission to erect 38 houses on the Manor Farm Paddock, in the centre of the village. This is in spite of the fact that they know that the Parish Council, the Neighbourhood Plan Committee and 80% of the villagers surveyed don't want any development of the paddock.

I want to make it clear, as was said at the meeting, that the Church Commissioners are totally separate from the Church of Saint Clement of Rome in Fiskerton. We get no support from them.

The money to maintain the building and support the activities is mainly raised by the Parochial Church Council and parishioners, together with some generous grants from our patrons, the Mercer's Company in London.

The Church Commissioners own a great deal of property in the country. Some of this is in and around Fiskerton. As well as this land they control a £6 billion investment fund. With this they raise over £200 million a year. They use this money for the benefit of the Church of England.

£120 million on clergy pensions.

£40 million on maintaining Bishops, their houses, staff and cathedrals.

£40 million on Mission and Ministry

One of the ways in which they raise money is by developing some of their land.

The Parochial Church Council (P.C.C.) of St. Clement's Church met on 10th November. The Paddock was on the agenda.

The P.C.C. agrees with the Parish Council that there should be no development on the paddock. We will communicate our opposition to their plan both directly and through the presentation/consultation that they intend to hold in the Village Hall on Monday 24th November.

NETTLEHAM MEDICAL PRACTICE

FRIENDS & FAMILY TEST

From 1st December 2014, the practice will be participating in the NHS Family and Friends patient feedback scheme which asks patients one simple question about the practice. Patients will be able to leave their feedback either via completing a postcard and placing in the boxes which are available in both waiting rooms at Nettleham and Cherry Willingham surgery or by completing the question online via the practice website. We want to encourage patients to complete this survey as the practice values all patient feedback. The results will be collated monthly and displayed in the waiting rooms and on our website.

ONLINE SERVICES

At present the practice offers online repeat prescription ordering and appointment booking. The number of patients signing up to use these services is increasing and this year for the first time the practice has offered online booking of flu vaccination appointments. This has been very well received with in the region of 200 appointments being made in flu vaccination clinics. If you wish to start and use this service, please call into one of the practices with a form of photographic ID and the receptionist will be able to provide you with your unique login details.

From April 2015, the practice will be expand its online services to include patients having access to elements of their clinical records. Our full statement of intent can be found on our website.



<u>POLICE Christmas Information:</u> Christmas is nearly upon us, we all want to have a merry time but we need to be aware of certain things so that this Christmas is a happy time for everyone.

Nationally, 25% of all road death involves the driver being under the influence of alcohol.

That means 1 in 7 of road deaths involved drink drivers over the alcohol limit.

In recent years young drivers, 17 to 29 year olds, have been over represented in drink drive casualty figures, and more drivers prove positive between the hours midnight to midday, we want to remind drivers that they maybe over the limit the morning after a night out.

Drinking even very small amounts of alcohol along with many prescribed medicines and some medicines you can buy over the counter can be dangerous. Alcohol will multiply the adverse effects that some medicines have on your ability to drive safely. Look at the label on your medicine and the leaflet in the package. If you see a phrase such as "Warning: this medicine may make you sleepy", it is not safe to drink even a small amount of alcohol whilst you are taking it before you drive."

So stay safe, think before you drink and drive, where ever possible have a nominated driver, you can

So stay safe, think before you drink and drive, where ever possible have a nominated driver, you can all pitch in and buy their soft drinks for the night, meaning that everyone will arrive home safely and have a great night out.

British families spend an average of £530 on Christmas presents, according to BBC figures. That's partly because the gift of choice for many children (and adults too!) is a shiny new mobile phone or games console. With all that hard-earned money being spent, it's important that you keep the presents safe before and after the 25th of December. It can be hard to keep track of all the gifts, especially if you have a large family to buy for! Our guide is here to help you keep your goodies out of harm's way and make this Christmas another memorable get-together (even if Uncle David accidentally breaks the gravy boat, or Gran burns the pigs in blankets to a crisp!)

PUT PRESENTS IN SAFE STORAGE: If you have bucket loads of presents which will take up lots of space in your home, it might be worth putting them in safe storage before Christmas Day. You might think that this will set you back even further after everything you've bought, but prices start from as little as £15 a week. Make sure that you shop around for the best deal, and also make sure that the storage provider is reputable before you hand your goods over to them. Alternatively, you can store some goodies at home in secure lockers. That way, you can have peace of mind and get on with decorating the house and ordering that juicy turkey!

DON'T PUT YOUR PRESENTS ON DISPLAY

Thieves who are looking for some quick cash target easily accessible presents. It's nice to have the Christmas tree on display by a window – that way passers-by can enjoy it as well as your family – but don't display your gifts there as well! One useful trick is to wait until Christmas Eve before you put the gifts under the tree. That makes the presents safer, but also cranks up the anticipation for the kids (and maybe some of the adults too!) because they only get to see them the night before.

TELL NEIGHBOURS YOU'RE GOING AWAY

If you're going to a relative's house for Boxing Day, make sure that your neighbours know about it. You'll probably be leaving behind most of the presents you received the day before – apart from the kids' toys which they can't put down – when you head off to Auntie Susan's.

That means someone will be keeping an eye on your house even when the mulled wine is flowing all around! It's probably worth testing your burglar alarm to make sure that everything is working properly. **DON'T FLASH YOUR NEW GADGETS**: New phones and jewellery are a great gift which you can be rightly proud of. Just make sure that when you're on the obligatory Boxing Day jaunt you don't make them too conspicuous. Muggings are rare, but just make sure that you don't become too complacent. Keep jewellery under your clothes and put your phone on silent.

GROW SOME HOLLY

This might seem a bit daft, but a few strategically-placed holly bushes in your garden and near the front door will deter any burglars or loiterers from trying to get at the presents inside your house. They also give you extra privacy so that people won't be able to peer through your windows easily.

KEEP THINGS ICY: It might also be worth keeping a few areas icy underfoot so that any potential burglars can't get away easily. Be careful though: any areas where children are playing or elderly people need to walk should be kept well gritted.

HANG CHRISTMAS BELLS

Hanging Christmas bells or chimes near bushes outside your house will alert you to anyone who brushes past. This will be most effective on quiet winter nights. It also makes quite a pretty sound! We hope you have found this guide to Christmas safety useful. The overall chances of you getting burgled are slim (a lot narrower than a lot of waistlines in January). That means you should focus on making the festivities as jolly as they can be!

Above all have a very merry Christmas and a happy new year.

What a great turnout! But I was a little disappointed that Fiskerton's contributions to a proper bridge over Hawthorn Rd, on going since January, were not mentioned- but I suppose that is politics. Lincolnshire County Council decided on a single lane bypass with no bridge rather than the dual carriage-way in October 2010. Apparently the road planners failed to get their bid in to the Government in time to secure the £112M promised for the whole package. They had been working on the project for years. How can they have missed the deadline? It just does not seem believable. But they did. Even more disappointing is that since the LCC meeting, 4th October 2010, a number of people close to the villages knew of the closure but kept quiet. County and District Councillors and officers chose not to let Fiskerton, Reepham or Cherry Willingham Parish Councils or Cllr Irmgard Parrot, Cllr Anne Welburn or myself know. We have been let down.

The same is true on the Paddock. I have lost track of the number of times I have warned senior executives at WLDC of the risks to the open space being built on. Of course the District Council and others could have taken measures to reduce that risk but Fiskerton is a low priority village and nobody has been bothered. Fortunately, we completed our parish plan eighteen months ago and using the information gained The Neighbourhood Plan Group have some solid proposals to offer to the Church Commissioners as an alternative. We have been very lucky to have Bill Roberts, a planning and heritage expert, working hard on our behalf. which has helped immensely. But we have a serious fight on our hands and need all the help we can get.

The Bronze Age Causeway. If like me you had trained in Agricultural Engineering, you would have been horrified by the sight of the excavator dredging the ditch along the path from Nelson Rd to the North Delph, just 50 yards parallel to the bronze age causeway. Drainage has caused soil levels in that field to drop 50+cm since the field was first excavated in1981. Goodness knows what the new dyke will do. Our 2500 year old causeway will just vanish into fresh air, and together with the famous Fiskerton sword it will be gone forever. We will just be left with half a canoe and a shield.

I am not sure what the outcome will be, but Natural England have asked the new tenant to refill the ditch and have spelt out the rules by which farmers have to manage such "wetlands". It will be up to the farmer to decide if he is better off with the wetlands subsidy or intensely farmed fields. I hope he chooses the former.

Talking of ditches, the ditch on the northern boundary of the Holmfield Estate has not been maintained this year. The environmental expert at WLDC is not too worried. When the ditch and the swales north of the village hall were dug, they were, apparently, planned to receive maintenance every two years! What does worry me is if the ditch is "fly tipped with over the fence rubbish" from our estate the ditch will fail. Already one resident on Water Hill has problems and in spite of contact with the Church Commissioners nothing has been done.
