

Vicar's Blog:

New Year Greetings to everyone – a little late, but hey!

This is a big year for the Diocese of Lincoln (Lincoln Diocese = big area of land covering Lincolnshire, North Lincolnshire and North east Lincolnshire, over 600 church buildings and lots of people looked after by Bishops of Lincoln, Grimsby, other senior staff, clergy and loads of lay people). It's a big year because on 18th January the Diocese launched its year of Discipleship. We were pleased to welcome Revd John Leach, one of the Diocese Discipleship Advisers to preach on that day and to launch us into a project to take a look at where we are going as churches over the next few years. I am trusting that we can switch our emphasis away from the refurbishment and maintenance of buildings, which I think has characterized the last 4 years since I arrived, and move towards what I might call 'the real church' the people. I hope that doesn't mean I am prejudicing the outcome!

But the 'Year of Discipleship' begs a question – what's a disciple? I have borrowed this from the Diocese web-site – I couldn't explain it better myself....

'When Jesus used the term (disciple), he would have done so into a culture which knew the concept well. Jewish rabbis would have 'disciples' who would spend time with them, learn from them, and model their lives on them. Jesus was behaving exactly in the same way: his disciples were called to be with him, to learn from his teaching, and to be transformed as people in the process. But Jesus went further than any rabbi: those who were his disciples in the gospels became his apostles in Acts, as the called ones became the sent ones. And while the rabbis focussed on knowing the Law, Christian disciples are called to something far deeper: becoming more like Christ in character. St Paul wrote to the Galatian Christians 'My dear children ... I am again in the pains of childbirth until Christ is formed in you'. Discipleship isn't about what we know, it's about who we are.

Sometimes it helps to define something by looking at its opposite. So disciples are not those who nod in the direction of faith but don't let it get too serious. It isn't about doing your statutory hour a week in church and then living exactly how you like the rest of the time. It isn't about seeing church as a leisure activity where we can meet friends like us. And neither is it about living uncritically in the consumerist culture of 21st Century Britain without letting the deeply counter-cultural values of Jesus challenge us. Discipleship is a full-time job, which is about knowing Christ, making him known to others, and growing to be more and more like him. It's about becoming faithful, confident and joyful Christians.

Discipleship is an exciting journey, and wherever we are on it, whether newcomers or seasoned believers, we believe that God is calling us to go deeper, to know Jesus more clearly, to love him more dearly, and to follow him more nearly.'

So, I am hoping that many will join me on this journey and that we can learn together!

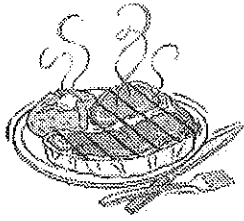

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE

Dear Fiskerton Parish News readers,

Important events and meetings are occurring in our village and I wish to keep you as informed as possible. The Neighbourhood Plan Committee (NPC) has met four times since Dec 1st when those present at the consultation accepted the Plan and agreed that it should be sent to West Lindsey District Council for examination. During this period of examination we need to have more consultation with the village so two open consultation events have been/are to be held in the Village Hall.

The first on Jan 15th was well attended and the second is on Jan 23rd which will have happened by the time you read this. Many of you will know that the Church Commissioners (CC) wish to build houses on the Paddock and that this does not comply with the proposed Neighbourhood Plan. The CC presented their plans in November and stated their intention to apply for planning permission in December which to date (Mid January) they have not done, this may be because of the feedback and letters they have received.

The NPC has met with CC representatives and a further meeting between us and West Lindsey District Council is being arranged to clarify the WLDC position. If WLDC planners decide to support plans to build on the Paddock then we will need your support again. You have probably already signed the petition (see Barry and Stewart Canner), but if a planning application is made we need you to write to WLDC.

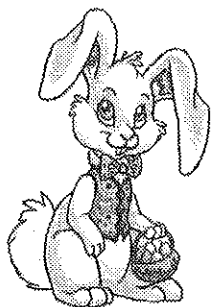
We will provide a specimen letter for you to complete, but you can also write your own if you wish. The letter needs to be sent as soon as it is known that a planning application has been submitted by the Church Commissioners. The Case Officer and ID number will be on both our specimen letter and on the planning application notices displayed around the Paddock and on the WLDC "Application Tracker" at

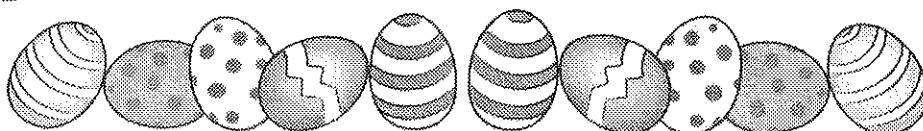

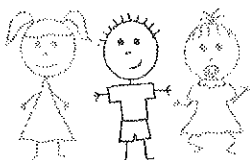

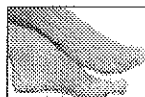

Happy New Year! And I trust a Merry Christmas was enjoyed by all.

First though, two apologies- I got it wrong. The Causeway is Iron Age, not Bronze Age. Some of our famous "finds" date back to the earlier period but the timbers have been dated to 457/456BC and second I missed the cut off date for the Parish News.

Back to business!

Schools and Car Parking. One resident has contacted me over problems regarding parking while collecting a young child from the Junior School in Cherry Willingham and in Fiskerton parking and traffic round the school and traffic speeding through the village cropped up frequently in our Parish Plan survey and in conversations I have round the village. As have cars/vans parking on pavements.

A lady slipped, fell and suffered bruising, while trying to circumnavigate a van totally blocking a pavement. To those concerned these are big issues and if you would like to email me with your experiences I will compile a log so I can put numbers to my argument for remedies.

Some things the village can influence, but these usually come with a cost. We could ask the County Council for "**traffic calming**" work, in front of the school, in Lincoln Rd, on Reephams Rd and on Ferry Rd but the County Council will look for a cash contribution from the village. This would mean an increase to the local Parish Precept. The same is true for bus shelters or other facilities the village might like.

It is money that brings me on to **the Paddock**. Like many others, I would like to see the Paddock returned to village use as an open space. For all ages. If opened up and landscaped it could provide a pleasant open space right in the centre of the village for mums with prams, young children to run about and kick a ball, for teenagers to meet and have a kick about pitch, for fetes and other celebrations and for old wrinklies like me to sit on a park bench and watch the activity.

But it all costs money. To the Church Commissioners building on the Paddock looks like a windfall of £2-3M and the CC will use the best legal brains to secure the deal. For them to think of changing their mind we need to offer them a far more attractive morsel (the Neighbourhood Plan). Should we persuade them to look at alternative sites we can expect on going costs for maintenance and rental for the Paddock. All these will have to be met from the Parish Precept and the council tax bill is likely to rise anyway. Have the sums been done? I can see the Precept will need to rise. Not by much but we should be prepared. At this moment of time it is impossible to predict the outcome on the Paddock but a great number of people are working hard to keep it green and I hope success comes our way.

The Holmfield fence. It is well over two years ago that the fence blew down.

It should have been fixed two years ago. Morris Homes paid The Parish Council a fee or ongoing maintenance as part of the S106 Agreement in 2007. The Holmfield residents deserve better. The Estate is a major contributor to the Parish Council Funds and while I am all for saving money where possible, some jobs need to be tackled with urgency.

That is enough moaning and I have not even mentioned the bridge at Cherry Willingham. Hopefully a proper bridge will be built, and perhaps LCC will find the money to build the original dual carriageway, rather than admit it got it wrong, 3 times.

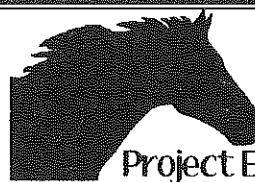

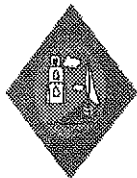
