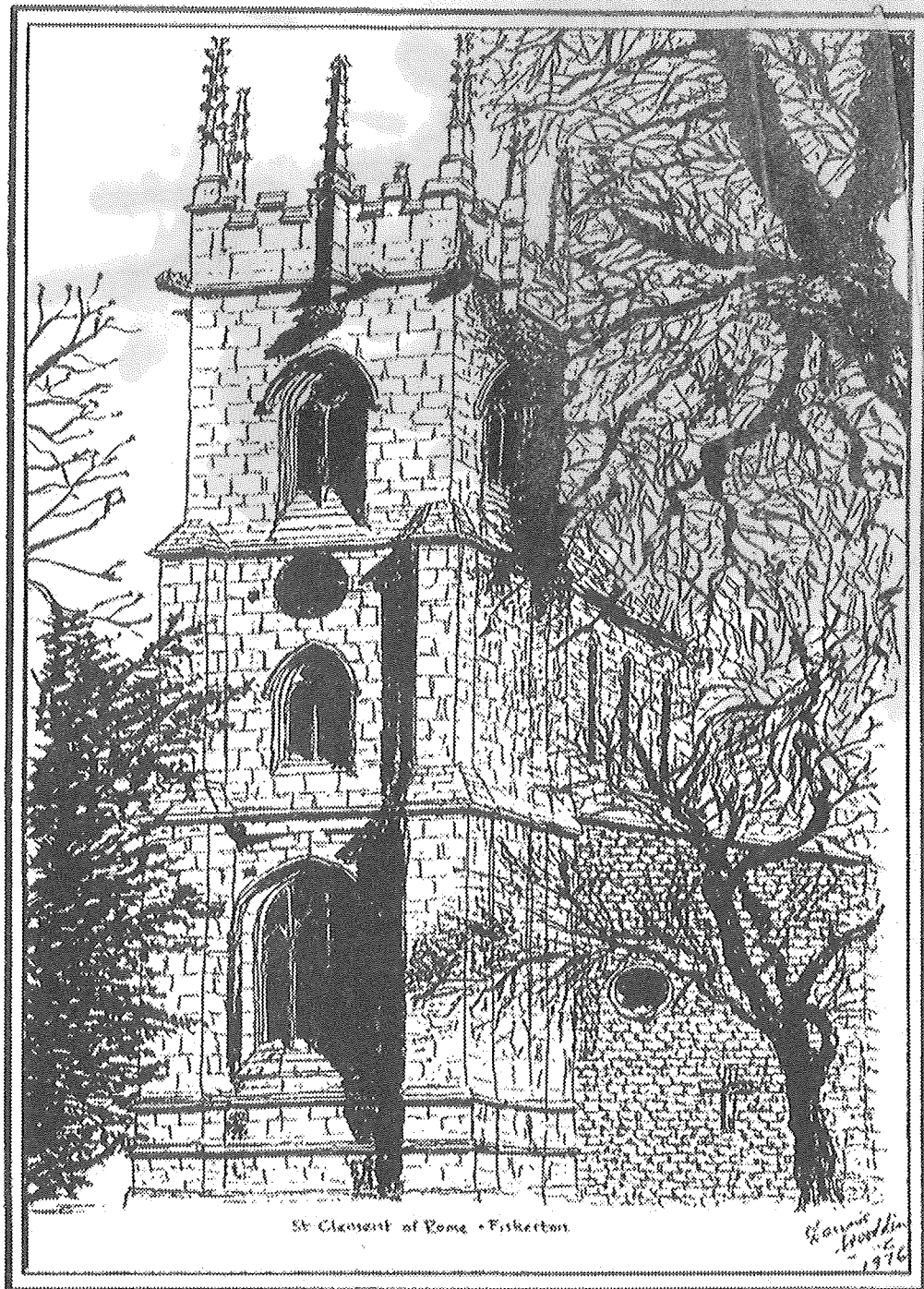

Vicar's Blog:

Do you pray? I guess that most of us have prayed at some point, whether or not we believe in God. I guess in moments of crisis we seek help from wherever we can and crying out to a God in whom we may or may not believe is one way of expressing our need.

What is prayer? I guess that prayer happens in all sorts of ways, we all express ourselves differently, but at its heart, prayer is about relationship. Think about your closest relationship, the person you can share anything with and then think about how you keep that relationship going. The likelihood is that a strong relationship is based on love, on listening and on sharing. Our relationship with God is just like that – if we are to grow in that relationship and to strengthen it, then we have to listen and share and receive love and give it – we can do all that in prayer. For Christians, prayer is the breath of life, it opens us up to God and offers a place in which we can express our deepest selves in the knowledge that God loves us, accepts us and embraces who we are.

I am raising this because we are about to begin the season of Lent, a time when traditionally we set things aside in order to focus on God. The act of giving something up, is not about doing it just to make us feel better, but to lay aside the things that stop us focusing on God. It may be that what we need to do is not give something up, but *pick* something up. Picking up prayer, centres us and gives us a different perspective on life. In Lent we remember the time that Jesus spent in the wilderness. 40 days set aside after his baptism as a young man, in which He prepared Himself for the next few years of ministry, but we know too that there were times when in the midst of the busy-ness of His life, He took Himself away from the crowds to find some space and to pray. Crucially in His walk toward the cross, in the last few hours of His life, He took Himself and some of His disciples to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray – that was one of the most honest exchanges we hear in prayer as Jesus comes to the point of offering Himself for the sake of humanity.

How do we pray? Well, we can use the prayer that Jesus taught us, we can use our own words, or the words of prayers written down the ages, or we can set aside time to just be quiet in the presence of God and listen to ourselves and to the work of God's Holy Spirit in us. Most of all we need to set ourselves aside for a few moments and be open to the presence of God – that opens up all sorts of possibilities.

So, may this be a prayerful Lent in which we discover again the riches of God's Kingdom.

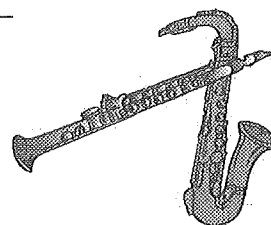

There will be things happening in Church over the weekend - further information is available in this Newsletter under the WI heading.

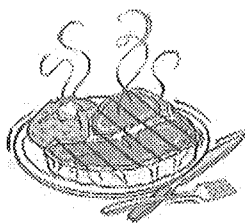
There will be a plant and a cake stall and refreshments available all day, both days. This should be a really good village weekend, so do come and be part of it.

The Centenary of the WI: The Women's Institute (the WI) was formed in Britain in 1915 to encourage women in rural communities to become more involved in producing and preserving food during the First World War. Since then the WI has expanded its aims and activities considerably and is now the largest women's organisation in the UK with approximately 6,600 WIs and 212,000 members and is no longer a purely rural organisation. It provides a way for women of all backgrounds to get together socially, share experiences and learn new skills.

Fiskerton WI held its first meeting in June 1942, we are a small group and meet on the second Thursday of the month at 7.30pm in the Village Hall and would love to welcome new members. We have regular speakers, demonstrations, walks and outings but of course we always end our meetings with a chat, cup of tea and a cake. What is new?

Bus Passes.

Some 50,000 in Lincolnshire are due to expire at the end of May, so please don't get caught like us.

The Paddock,

At last! I have seen confirmation that West Lindsey District Council agrees that the Paddock is a Protected Open Space as stated in the Local Plan of 2006 and this protection should be carried forward to 2036. It is not the end of the matter but it is a useful stepping stone.

In trawling the Web I have come across Oxford's Local Plan. Oxford has a yardstick of 5.75ha of public open space per 1000 population. Open space is an important part of the National Planning Policy Framework, and it would seem that Sport England could be involved with our plans.

The Church Commissioners' Architect Nolan has flair. His two suggested site layouts would both be a credit to the village. Unfortunately, he has been asked to site them in areas that a great many in the village do not want! Nolan's flair has shown just how lucky we have been to have our own Heritage Consultant, Bill Roberts, living in the village. Bill's professional expertise has given us a flying start in getting our Neighbourhood Plan off the ground. It makes a huge difference to have an expert on the team and other less lucky villages have struggled. We should end up with a dream village in which we will all be delighted to live.

There are a lot of "ifs" in the world.

If it wasn't for Primetake I am sure 100 houses would be on the cards for the field north of Holmfield. Many of the original buyers were informed by the site agent that this might happen in the future. The larger of two open spaces would have acted as the gateway. Interesting.

Hawthorn Rd.

Again, I do not know what the final outcome will be, but I have heard that Inquiry will not be till the summer and that the cost of a full dual carriageway installation has risen to £170m. The present Government has guaranteed funding a single carriageway road for several years- but what happens if there is a change of Government in May? Further, with regards funding, I am sure there is nothing in the WLDC Constitution that allows the Joint Planning Unit to underwrite such schemes to the value of some £11m for West Lindsey as it did, so that too will be interesting.

All £112m of the original build costs would have been available if the County Council had submitted its business plan to the Department for Transport in time in 2010/2011, and the single carriageway bypass could have been started by now if the Highways Team had only listened to the residents at Reepham Village Hall a year ago.

If the bypass does not get built will the Church Commissioners be more eager than ever to build even more houses in villages like Fiskerton and Langworth to make up for the loss?- who knows?

The local elections in May, all district and parish councillors in West Lindsey come up for election. If you are interested in local government, at parish or district level, why not put your name forward to be a councillor: it is an excellent way of putting something back into your community.

Parish Council News:

The date of the next Parish Council meeting is the 23rd of March. There are two meetings on this evening. There is the ordinary Council meeting at 19:30 and there is the Annual Parish Meeting at 18:45. Both take place in the village hall. The Annual Parish Meeting is not a council meeting as such but it is an opportunity for the Parish council and other organisations and charities within the village to report on their activities during the year. It is also an opportunity for residents to ask questions and provide feedback to all those groups.

Parking on Pavements

There have been a number of complaints about people parking on pavements made to both the Parish Council and the District councillor. Parking on the pavement may not be illegal but obstructing the path is. The police have asked that people report incidences to them via their 101 number. If more instances are reported to the police then they will allocate more resources to deal with the issue. Alternatively you could take a photo and let the Parish Clerk, Sarah know and she will forward it on for you. You can email her on clerk@fiskerton-lincs.org.uk. Please take a moment when parking. Consider if a mother with a pushchair or someone wheelchair can pass your vehicle easily, if not move your car. Please don't put people at risk by forcing them to step into the road. How would you feel if someone was hurt because you blocked a path?

Become a Councillor

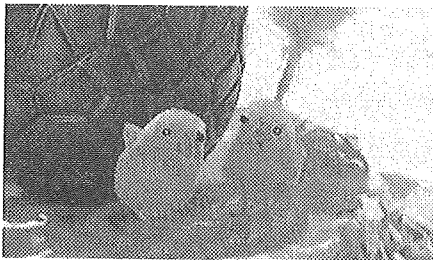
The general election is in May, and this applies to the Parish council too. The Parish Council is the lowest tier of local government. Despite its name it has nothing to do with the Church. The Parish council exists to improve the quality of life for the whole community.

Some services, such as maintenance of the play area or grass cutting are delivered by the Parish council itself. For many others, such as planning and highways, the Council represent the views of the local community so that they can be taken into account by other decision makers.

By becoming a Parish Councillor you are serving your local community and helping shape the future. The council meets roughly once every 6 weeks and it does not take a huge amount of time and things are shared out so as not to over burden people. The best way to find out what it's like to be a parish councillor is to come along to a parish council meeting and see what happens, or speak to one of our councillors and find out what they think of the job.

If you did decide to become a councillor at the May elections then you will need to complete a nomination paper. These can be obtained from the Elections Team at West Lindsey, just call 01427 676628. Completed nomination papers must be delivered by hand to the Returning Officer at the Guildhall in Gainsborough before 4pm on Thursday 9th April 2015 although it recommended that they be submitted some weeks before that.

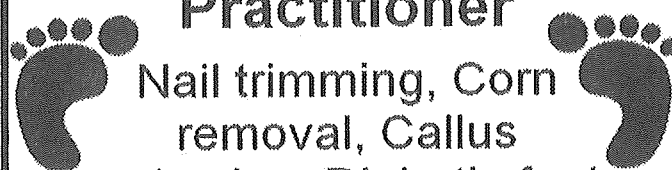

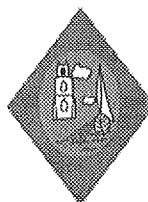

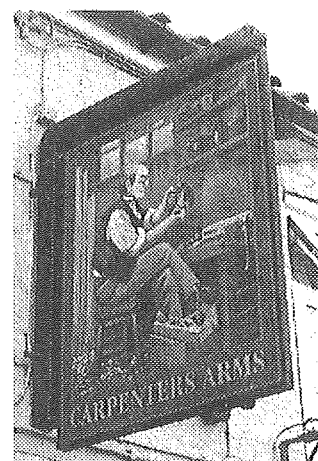
