





Some of you may have noticed the stirrings in the Rectory at Fiskerton, that's because in July we formally welcome to the ministry team our new full time assistant curate Chris Hewitt. Chris and his family have already moved into the Rectory in preparation and he will be ordained as Deacon on the 5th of July at Lincoln Cathedral a service to which you are all welcome to attend. What's an Assistant Curate? Well, Chris is here to train to take up Parishes of his own in due course, hence he will be learning the 'ropes' and we hope to be able to support him to do that.

Chris hails from Cheshire, the son of dairy farming stock. After serving as an engineer in the RAF, followed by the role of a design engineer at Siemens in Lincoln, and business manager for a small engineering company based out of Birmingham, Chris trained to be a

West Lindsey Open Churches Festival

Fiskerton church will be open for this festival on **Saturday and Sunday May 9th.** / **10th**. The Church will be open from 11am – 4.30pm on both days.

Fiskerton Church is proud to be part of a new Church trail called the **Stephen Langton Trail** that passes through or near six festival churches where you can stop for refreshments or even lunch (at Fiskerton).

<u>Langton</u> open 16/17th May <u>Wragby</u> open 16/17th May <u>Apley</u> open 16/17th May <u>Fiskerton</u> 9/10th May including Lunches! <u>Greetwell</u> open 9/10th May <u>Cherry Willingham</u> open 9/10th May

The trail is a 16.5 mile walking trail from the birthplace of Archbishop Stephen Langton, key in the sealing of Magna Carta, to the historic city of Lincoln. The Stephen Langton Trail starts at the Lincolnshire village of Langton-by-Wragby, birthplace of Archbishop Stephen Langton, and takes a meandering and picturesque 16.5 mile walk to historic Lincoln and Lincoln Castle, home to an original copy of the 1215 Magna Carta.

The trail is split into three sections to allow for all abilities and so the walk can be split up over a space of time:

Section One leads from Langton-by-Wragby to Apley through the Lincolnshire Limewood Nature Reserve (4 miles)

Section Two from Thistle Storr Wood near Apley to Fiskerton along the Viking Way (6¼ miles)

Section Three follows the River Witham Valley from Fiskerton on a delightful riverside walk to Lincoln's Cathedral Quarter (6¼ miles).

As I approach the end of term as district councillor, I am surprised to find myself writing on the importance of Free Speech. Free Speech has been ingrained in me as one of the basic essentials of being British since childhood and the freedom of the press, while unpleasant at times, is our only protection from big brother government, local government blunders, crass financial management and celebrity mal-behaviour. So far we have been lucky in Fiskerton. A phone call by myself to the Church Commissioners and letters from Penny Green and Paul Forman started a dialogue that hopefully will end up being beneficial to the village. The call did avert an imminent planning application. It was the phone call that started the dialogue, but it only worked because both sides were prepared to listen.

With Hawthorn Road the County Council will not listen. In spite of all the public meetings and overwhelming support in Cherry Willingham and Reepham for a "bridge over" solution, Lincolnshire County Council is embarking on the compulsory land purchase procedure for the new road and the building of the unwanted horse bridge. The LCC attitude has not changed since last January and in the documentation to justify the land purchase the County Council yet again rubbishes all objections raised at the Inquiry even though I am now told money is not now the issue.

I have felt the whole process, going back to one of the earliest WLDC meetings I attended as councillor, has been unsatisfactory. The road closure and payment terms were on the books months before I was elected a district councillor. Why did we not know? Fortunately with the help of free local publications like the Cherry News and the Fiskerton Parish News residents will hopefully win the day. In a similar vein, Langworth is under pressure for a development of nearly 100 houses in Barlings Lane. This is on top of the 38 already planned for the George. There is some protection for the village in the old WLDC 2006 local plan but the "5 year land supply" is likely to override this. Whatever happens in May the next Government will be even more eager to smother our cherished countryside with even more houses and both officers and the Conservative administration at West Lindsey have to accept the blame for the current lack of local protection.

On a much happier note, Barry Canner is eager to explore how we can best provide facilities, play areas, recreation and open space in the village for the future. Can you help? Barry and several of us are looking to set up a working group and anyone with specialist knowledge, enthusiasm, and an aptitude for research and hard work would be more than welcome to join.

THE MANOR FARM PADDOCK

Regular readers will know that the Church Commissioners, who own the Paddock, presented a pre planning application proposal to the Village on 24th Nov 2014 for building houses on the Paddock. The Church Commissioners were told by some West Lindsey Officers that building houses on the Paddock was a good idea despite a very clear statement to the contrary in the 2013 Fiskerton Parish Plan. On 22nd Jan 2015 the West Lindsey District Council officers and planners supported the Fiskerton Neighbourhood Draft Plan (Issue 3) and told the CCs that WLDC would not support the planned building application. On 30th March 2015 the CCs told the Fiskerton Neighbourhood Plan Group that they would not pursue their building application "for the moment". This gives the Village time to formulate and act on a plan to secure the Paddock as a Community Asset with open green space and access.

The Neighbourhood Plan Group is working on the 4th draft of the plan which clearly marks the Paddock as an open green space. The Parish Council will be forming a plan to acquire access for the public and to manage the Paddock as a valued asset for the community. For this to happen difficult negotiations will have to take place with the CCs who have said that they do not want to sell the Paddock or allow public access. The Neighbourhood Planning Group and the Parish Council will need as much support from the people of Fiskerton, "people power", as possible if the vision of the Paddock as a place for children to play, relaxation, informal sports activities and interesting wild plants to thrive. Watch this space.

NETTLEHAM MEDICAL PRACTICE

DR BAKER'S RETIREMENT

Dr Simon Baker retired in the middle of April after over 15 years at the practice. He will be sorely missed by staff and patients but we all wish him a happy and healthy retirement.

USUAL GP

Due to Dr Simon Baker's retirement, if Dr Baker was listed as your usual GP, your records will have been updated and Dr Elmer Molave will now be your usual GP.

MISSED APPOINTMENTS

The practice is continuing to experience a high number of appointments which patients do not attend (called "DNAs" for short). During January 2015, 12½ hours of doctor time and 79 hours of nursing time were lost due to DNAs and in February 2015, 14 hours of doctor time and 46 hours of nursing time.

If you are unable to attend an appointment that you have booked, please contact the practice and cancel so that it can be given to someone else.

ELECTRONIC TRANSFER OF PRESCRIPTIONS

From the middle of May 2015, the practice is planning to implement the use of the electronic prescription service. What does this mean for you?

If you collect your repeat prescriptions from a pharmacy you will not have to visit the GP practice to pick up your paper prescription. Instead, your GP will send it electronically to the pharmacy you've chosen, saving you time. You will have more choice about where to get your medicines from because your chosen pharmacy can be near to where you live, work or shop, or even a registered online pharmacy.

You may not have to wait as long at the pharmacy as there will be time for your repeat prescriptions to be made ready before you arrive.


