Vicar's Blog:

I suspect that we have all looked with horror at the recent images of men, women and children fleeing for their lives, crossing borders, placing themselves sometimes in the hands of unscrupulous people and being cast adrift on boats not fit to carry them. So it is with refugees who have come to the end of their capacity to live with uncertainty, violence, war and who no longer wish to live in fear of what will befall them in their next moments. If you are like me, you probably watch these scenes feeling powerless. Now read this story

..... a boy went to the beach one day. In front of him were thousands of star fish that had been washed up on the beach with the tide. The boy looked at the pile, wondered what he could do and then, one by one he picked up a starfish, put them in his small bucket, ran to the edge of the water and put them back into the water. A stranger walked down to the beach and watched him do this a number of times - he was puzzled by the boy's actions and went up to him and said 'you know, that's a huge pile - it won't make any difference'.... The boy took three or four starfish put them in his bucket, took the man's hand and led him to the edge of the water. He took one starfish out of his bucket and placed in in the water, and then another and then another and as he put them back in the water he turned to the man and said and simply said 'it makes a difference to this one, and this one, and this one'.

When we feel powerless to change a situation it paralyses us. Yet we are not powerless, we can make a difference. What has been gratifying however has been to see individuals and groups organizing collections of clothes, food and blankets to take to Calais and Greece; to see people offering homes to refugees. We can talk all we want about the politics, about possible solutions and where the fault lies, but ultimately these are people like you and me who are searching for things we all take for granted freedom, peace, the opportunity to choose and to bring their children up in a place of safety. It is not lost to me that we are about to celebrate harvest, to give thanks for the abundance that we all share, maybe we should spend some time appreciating and giving thanks for freedom, for peace. It's not though, all about giving thanks, it's also about giving and helping to improve the lives of other people. Our harvest gifts this year are going to The Nomad Trust, however, perhaps this year we can go another mile and give to one of the aid organisations that are working with refugees: Oxfam, Save the Children, Red Cross and UNHCR are all working on the ground to alleviate distress, to provide medical aid and to feed people. It is estimated that there are 8million displaced people from the war in Syria and 4 million of them are now refugees. This is a massive humanitarian crisis and we must take an opportunity to do something that will make a difference.



Well what a busy time, first we have the neighbourhood plan to think about, then there is the WLDC budget-setting exercise, the Lincoln bypass, lastly the Local Plan and of course bus shelters and the youth shelter.

Starting with the last first, I am disappointed how this has turned out. It was built with the help of one set of teenagers to give them somewhere better to meet rather than under the village hall porch. But, unfortunately, it was never respected by them. The follow on generation have proved worse.

It is unreasonable to expect all young adolescents to behave as angels all the time. They will drop litter and create acts of mindless vandalism and seek to attract attention, it is a problem that has been with us forever, and seems to get worse with time. Our responses as adults could have been different to the various situations as they arose and hopefully we will learn from the experience.

An out-doors vacuum cleaner would have remedied the litter problem, and quicker repair service for the damage caused by outsiders two years ago would have helped as would consultation with the teenagers for the seating design.

Of course the teenagers have cost the parish council money, it is what the precept is collected for. To be spent on services and facilities in the village for residents of all ages.

Bus shelters, well one is on the way for the stop opposite the Crescent but we still need two more, one for Ferry Rd and one for Short Ferry. I will keep campaigning.

The first **discussion on the Local Plan for WLDC** Councillors took place Monday. Certain items have been missed off the draft and others added in, like a traveller site at Greetwell. Full consultation starts mid-October. I am unhappy about the recreational provision.

The Lincoln Bypass. The more I think about it the more I realise just how bad local government financial and project management is. The Parish Council received a copy letter from the highways manager "that times are hard and there is insufficient money to repair our potholes". Yet LCC must have spent £1.5m on inquiries, hotel bills, barristers and staff time, just to save £200,000 on the difference between the cost of the first footbridge and the wanted road bridge solution. At £100 a pot hole, my arithmetic says 13,000 potholes could have been filled. Unfortunately it gets worse.....

I suspect WLDC will put up its **council tax** by 1.9% next spring. I opted for 1% but really I do not know why we should be paying more. WLDC continues built up its cash mountain of £18m. To me this means the Council has been over charging us for the services provided. Like MPs, WLDC should be forced to give the money back. Unfortunately, it has also been building up a pensions deficit of £34.5m. Something seems wrong to me.

Neighbourhood Plan. In it I would like to see provision for a range of house bands. A to G. Compared to Reepham we have less than 33% the number of F and G band houses and far more A, B, and Cs. Many people aspiring to F & G band houses will have mastered successful careers in the professions and in business, and that experience would be invaluable to us, in monitoring the way in which local government spends our money. So, if there is an accountant in the village please get in touch!

Lastly, the Neighbourhood Plan meeting the Village Hall, 7-9pm Thursday 22nd October. On the agenda will be the N/S option as per the original consultation document or the Church Commissioner's proposed E/W layout which is supported by several members of the NP group. You may already have received a flyer from me promoting the event. Please come and give your thoughts on the future of the village.

Lock your bedroom door, even if you're only going to the kitchen or bathroom.


Check doors and windows are locked at night or when going out, don't assume someone else will do it.
