

Vicar's Blog:

So I think I should begin this blog with a bit of a 'rant' warning. I am about to sound off – sorry – but maybe you might feel as strongly as I do about this issue....

I have a lot of contact with the Care System. My mother has been in a nursing home (not locally) for 15 months, and I visit twice a week, I visit nursing homes in the course of my work, my mother received care at home prior to becoming too ill to stay at home. I am not a professional in these matters, largely I am a grateful relative who sees what careers have to manage and cope with on shifts lasting twelve hours. Trust me I couldn't do that job – you need the patience of a saint, the energy of a Duracell battery (other brands are available), the ability to multitask, organise, record every detail, spot when someone is low, make sure that people feel loved and valued and generally be a saint. Yes there may be a few out there who don't show the compassion needed, but honestly, most I have come across are amazing people who work really hard and do their best in sometimes trying circumstances but what value do we place on them?

I have just watched a programme on the TV that has described the conditions that some carers have to operate under. As austerity bites, as Local Government funding is cut and as the demands on the Care system grow, it seems to me that we have to begin to make some difficult decisions about the value we place on care and the people who deliver it. We cannot expect people to work for a minimum wage and pay the cost of their travel to go from house to house. We can't continue to put so much pressure on people who work in the care system that they give it up because it is too stressful and there are too many demands. We rely on these folk to look after our loved ones, people who are precious to us, and they look after the vulnerable who have no-one else to care for them. We have to value that highly don't we?

I guess that we have very little control over the big issues. Decisions made at Government level, funding issues, but there is one thing we can all do – if we know a carer, or if we have someone who is cared for by others – then say thank you, often, and tell them how high a value you place on the work they do. That's also making me think about the army of carers out there who are looking after their own loved ones, many of whom give 24 X 7 care and frankly never get a break or have time to themselves..... If you are one of those people I would really like to hear from you – what can we do to support you? What would help? Call me or email me – my details are at the top of this blog.

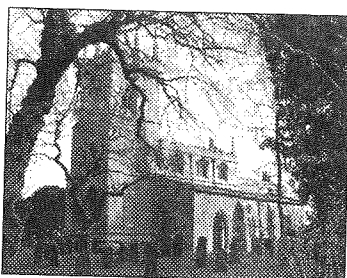

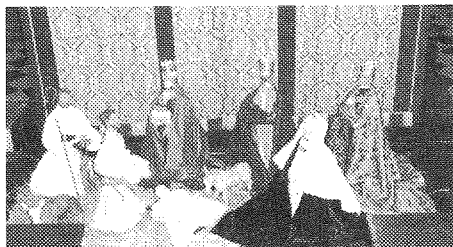

Central Lincolnshire Consultation Event: Local Plan, CIL and Other Documents

I am writing to you on behalf of the Central Lincolnshire Joint Strategic Planning Committee (CLJSPC); West Lindsey District Council (WLDC); City of Lincoln District Council (CoL); and North Kesteven District Council (NKDC). Collectively, these authorities are about to commence consultation on a wide range of important and inter-linked documents. The full list of documents are:

- Local Plan (Further Draft, 2015)*, and associated Policies Map (as would apply, if the Further Draft Local Plan came into effect) and Draft Integrated Impact Assessment (incorporating Sustainability Appraisal) (consultee: CLJSPC)
- Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Preliminary Draft Charging Schedule and Associated Documents** (consultee: WLDC / CoL / NKDC)
- Draft Developer Contributions SPD*** (consultee: CLJSPC)
- Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP) (consultee: WLDC / CoL / NKDC / CLJSPC)
- Draft Housing Growth Delivery Plan and Draft Economic Growth Delivery Plan (consultee: CLJSPC)

All responses will be treated equally. Please note, verbal comments will not be recorded.

May I advise you that comments will not be confidential: every comment received on the Local Plan will be uploaded to our online portal along with the name of the person who made the comment. For all other documents, comments may be uploaded on one or more of the authorities websites. For all documents, full comments and details of the person who made the comment (including address) will be available to view on request.

All comments received will be carefully considered. Where applicable, once the consultation period ends, a summary report of key issues raised will be produced. Please regularly check our website for further updates on all these documents.

We will contact you again at future consultation stages as one or more of the documents progress towards adoption, unless you let us know you no longer want to be informed.

Finally, can I also formally advise you under CIL Regulation 18 that the previously published CIL Preliminary Draft Charging Schedule (consultation July-September 2013) and Draft Charging Schedule (consultation November – December 2013), together with any supporting evidence, have been withdrawn and have been superseded by the CIL documents referred to at the commencement of this letter.

Note ! These are brief notes from the Council. Official minutes of all meetings are available on the website once they have been approved at the following meeting.

The Council are still looking for a **new Clerk** – previous experience is not essential as training is provided. The hours can be very flexible. Please check out the advert above and get in touch if you are interested or if you have any questions.

- PC Nick Prestwich had been in contact to confirm that **SID** (the mobile speed indicator) was checked each day it was out and is moved once the battery was depleted.
- County Councillor Fleetwood reported that both Bardney and Cherry Willingham have vacancies on their **Allotments** and would welcome new applications.
- Councillor Wall reported that the **Draft Neighbourhood plan** is proceeding well and that a grant has been received to enable some necessary professional reports. Consultation events have taken place for both business owners and residents of Short Ferry and further events will be held in the future. If you want any information or clarification about the Neighbourhood Plan then please contact Rob Wall who is Chair of the Neighbourhood Plan Group and will have all the latest up to date and accurate information. If you email clerk@fiskerton-lincs.org.uk your enquiry will be forwarded on.
- The Council committed to further **bus shelters** for the Parish many months ago, plans are still being developed and grant applications have been made but we have been told that the funding allocation may have been used and so other funding streams are being sought.
- Options and costings for **village signs and planters** are being investigated.
- **Litter** around the Village Hall continues to be a problem and will be discussed at the next meeting.

Cardiac arrest causes thousands of deaths every year and it is said that for every minute that goes by without treatment, the chance of a cardiac arrest patient surviving decreases by 10 per cent. Having taken advice from the East Midlands Ambulance it was felt that obtaining an **Automated External Defibrillator** would be a good use of our limited resources. By the time you are reading this, the Council should have received and installed a public access defibrillator. It will be outside the Village Shop and we would like to thank Steve and Rachel for being kind enough to support the village in this project. The unit is fully automatic and is designed to be used by non medical people and it tells the operator exactly what to do and when. The unit is stored in a locked box which is accessed by a pin code that would be given to someone who contacts the emergency services. Obviously we hope it will never be needed but at least it is there should the need arise.

The Next meeting of the Parish Council is at **7:30 pm on Monday the 16th November**. All welcome.

Last month I mentioned a **Neighbourhood Plan** Consultation meeting but unfortunately, it has proved difficult to find a date when all those who need to be at the meeting and the village hall is free coincide. In the meantime if there are any issues you would like to raise why not contact Cllr Rob Wall who is chairman of the Neighbourhood Plan Committee. I am sure Rob will be pleased to discuss the plan with you.

Both The Parish Council and I have a copy of the latest release of the **(Lincolnshire) Local Plan Draft document** and there is an "open session" at the Church Hall, Cherry Willingham Friday 6th November 2pm till 8pm.

The plan and its accompanying documents cover affordable housing, sheltered homes, warden assisted care homes, sites for self- build homes, spaces for play, sport and recreation, open spaces, the importance of creating sustainable communities and the Community Infrastructure Levy.

As a Cherry Willingham district councillor I feel the document is biased in favour of Lincoln, so it is important we locals get our voice heard. Details can be found on www.central-lincs.org.uk and final responses need to be in by November 25th (Please see above).

My letter last month raised a response! One resident suggested I should have spent my Councillor Initiative Fund on a bus shelter rather than on the **teenagers** and on whom I have spent far too much. If you would like to see how much money I have allocated to various projects the details are on the West Lindsey web site and the reason I decided to support the teen agers is simple, in the 13 years I have lived in the village I have seen very little spent on them. In my opinion Bus Shelters are the responsibility of the Parish Council, to whom we pay a council tax precept every year. I have preferred to support other causes.

With regards to my comments on the teenagers, I was reacting to the rubbish in the shelter and the lack of glass in the windows. On reflection, there is a history of minor vandalism and litter in the village and it is probably better to see both occur in the shelter rather be evenly distributed across the village.

To pee or not to pee. That is a question that has come my several times as a district councillor. Most people do, from time to time, have an urgent need to relieve themselves and in the countryside this is usually not a problem. With plenty of woods and miles of hedges to choose from, finding a quiet, unobserved spot remote from overlooking housing is usually easy. On busy roads it is more of a problem. On the A158 between Wragby and Langworth there is a lay-by where a large number of motorists choose to stop for relief. There is what looks like a convenient hedge, but on the other side are three cottages hidden from view. At the end of a summer day the odour is quite unpleasant and the residents unhappy. It is not a problem unique to the A158, less busy roads have similar popular peeing points, including the road between Fiskerton and Short Ferry, and the nearby residents naturally get quite upset. If you need to go- please find a spot where you will be unseen that will not cause nearby householders offence!

A common aspect of why a property is targeted has been where the owner has **left the property in darkness** when absent. This makes the property very **obviously unoccupied** when neighbouring properties are well lit. It also means that areas such as gardens can be easily accessed without the criminal being seen.

If your lifestyle means that your property is currently left in the dark, invest in timer devices to enable a radio and various lights around your property to be left on when you are absent. A simple action like this could save you the upset of having your house burgled.

Before you leave it - **light it and lock it.**

FLU CLINICS

MENINGITIS ACWY VACCINATIONS

Public Health England has recently launched a new vaccination campaign for the Meningitis ACWY vaccination. The practice is currently inviting teenagers aged 17 and 18 (born between 1 September 1996 and 31 August 1997) for the vaccine. Where possible, it's important that anyone who plans to go to university this year gets vaccinated before they leave.

Please contact the practice to book an appointment for this vaccination if you are in the eligible age group.

NAMED GP UPDATE

As part of the initiative to provide better support to patients the practice provided a named GP for all of our patients back in May 2015. The named GP is, where necessary and appropriate, responsible for coordinating a patient's care with other health professionals. You are able to see any GP you would like at the practice and are not restricted to just this one GP. If you would like to know who your allocated GP is please ask at reception.

Some patients would have been allocated Dr Elmer Molave as their named GP. Dr Molave is sadly leaving the practice at the end of October to take up a partnership position in North Lincolnshire so his patients have all been allocated a new named GP. Please contact reception if you would like to know which GP you have been allocated.

RESEARCH UPDATE

The practice is part of the East Midlands Clinical Research Network which means that from time to time the practice will be asked to take part in national research projects.

Some of you may have received letters from the practice asking you to consider partaking in a research study. The response we get from patients is overwhelmingly positive and the research team wanted to pass on their gratitude as Nettleham is one of the highest recruiters to research studies in the Midlands.

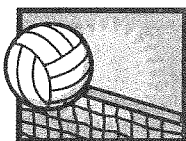

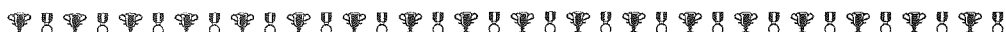


FISKERTON SPORTS CLUB:
