Note! These are brief informal notes from the Council. The official detailed minutes of all meetings are available on the website once they have been approved at the following meeting.

In the Public Open session residents raised a number of questions:

There were comments on the condition of the **roads and paths on Holmfield** and the poor condition of the road down to Short Ferry, some items had been reported to LCC Highways before but it was decided to ask for an update and to ask if a representative of the Highways Dept would attend a Parish Council meeting early next year.

There was quite a long discussion about the **Neighbourhood plan** – There should be an update from the Neighbourhood plan group elsewhere in the Newsletter. If you want any information or clarification about the Neighbourhood Plan then please contact Rob Wall who is Chair of the Neighbourhood Plan Group and will have all the latest up to date and accurate information. If you email clerk@fiskerton-lincs.org.uk your enquiry will be forwarded on.

The council was asked why the **Speed indicator device** wasn't working. It was explained that the unit operates on a battery. The more the unit is activated by traffic the shorter the battery will last. It is set up so that it will not indicate a speed if it is measured below 28mph or above a certain limit although it still records the speeds on its internal memory for later review. When the battery is flat the unit has to be taken down and recharged, it is then usually put up again in a different location however this work relies on volunteers and when they are available to do the work.

In other **Highways news**, it was decided to look at improving the signage on the entry points to the village with a view to improving road safety and trying to get people to slow down in the village. This would include better speed limit signs and some road markings.

The project to provide more **Bus shelters** continues, we have acquired a small amount of funding and hope to be able to install a new shelter in the first quarter of next year.

In finance, the council looked at its **precept for next year**. The precept is how the Parish Council raises the funds required to perform its duties and it forms part of the Council tax. Fiskerton hasn't raised its precept for a number of years but with the increased number of projects the council is undertaking, it was felt that the precept would have to rise this coming year.

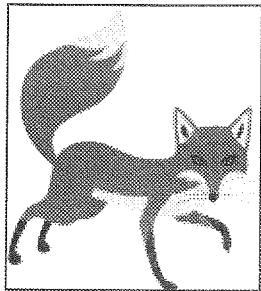
The **play area** has had its annual safety inspection by ROSPA and they had reported a number of things that need attention, most of these are simple wear and tear, for example worn ground surfaces or the occasional loose bolt. The swings, however, have a number of excessively worn components, such as shackles, chains and other fixings and these are quite costly to repair. We are aware that some adults have been using the swings and sometimes for extended periods of time and we would remind people that the play area and its equipment is meant for the younger members of our community. With that in mind it was suggested that some signage is acquired pointing this out and it is hoped that this will give parents the confidence to challenge 'unsuitable' usage

Also included in the **ROSPA report** is the wooden Teen Shelter and its findings were not good news. They have found a number of problems with the shelter, unfortunately given the money we have spent on the shelter in past the council does not feel it can justify constantly spending tax payers' money repairing the shelter just to have it damaged again and again. So it is with great regret and some reluctance that it is felt that the shelter will have to go. That being said, the council will look at purchasing a more suitable, purpose built structure but that is a major project and may take some time to deliver and it may not be in the same location.

Better news is that the Parish council have managed to negotiate some extra **litter picking** from WLDC, we are going to trial it for a couple of months to assess its effectiveness. At first they will concentrate on the area around the Village Hall and play area with the aim of trying to bring that area back up to standard and from there we may look at other areas. WLDC have also kindly provided some litter picking equipment for our own use

The village's **defibrillator machine** was meant to be installed at the Wishing Well Stores but because of some technical issues that was unable to happen. We would like to thank Rachel and Steve for all their help. The unit will now be located at The Carpenters Arms and we would also like to thank Liz and Paul, the new owners of The Carpenters Arms and who are keen to be actively involved in village life. We wish them all the best in their venture and hope they will be there for many years to come.

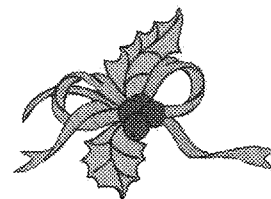
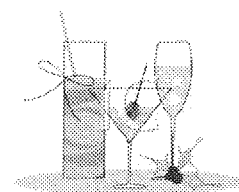
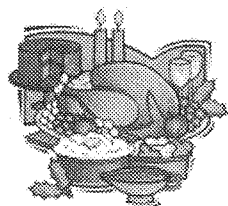

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Since my last update in the Parish News in September we have had meetings with the Church Commissioners and West Lindsey District Council Officers to discuss the current draft of the Neighbourhood Plan and the planning gain that the community might get as a result of approximately 200 houses being built to the North of Ferry Road. The pace of these negotiations and discussions has slowed down and unfortunately one of our key members of the Neighbourhood Planning Group has resigned. The rest of the Group are resolved to continue working on the Plan to ensure that it is fully discussed by residents and that everybody has the opportunity for consultation. A draft of the Plan is on the Village Website. There will be a Village Consultation in the New Year when the various professional reports we have commissioned will be available.

British families spend an average of £530 on Christmas presents, according to BBC figures. That's partly because the gift of choice for many children (and adults too!) is a shiny new mobile phone or games console. With all that hard-earned money being spent, it's important that you keep the presents safe before and after the 25th of December. It can be hard to keep track of all the gifts, especially if you have a large family to buy for!

Our guide is here to help you keep your goodies out of harm's way and make this Christmas another memorable get-together.

PUT PRESENTS IN SAFE STORAGE

If you have bucket loads of presents which will take up lots of space in your home, it might be worth putting them in safe storage before Christmas Day you might think that this will set you back even further after everything you've bought, but prices start from as little as £15 a week. Make sure that you shop around for the best deal, and also make sure that the storage provider is reputable before you hand your goods over to them.

Alternatively, you can store some goodies at home in secure lockers.

DON'T PUT YOUR PRESENTS ON DISPLAY

Thieves who are looking for some quick cash target easily accessible presents. It's nice to have the Christmas tree on display by a window – that way passers-by can enjoy it as well as your family – but don't display your gifts there as well! One useful trick is to wait until Christmas Eve before you put the gifts under the tree. That makes the presents safer, but also cranks up the anticipation for the kids (and maybe some of the adults too!) because they only get to see them the night before.

TELL NEIGHBOURS YOU'RE GOING AWAY

If you're going to a relative's house for Boxing Day, make sure that your neighbors know about it. You'll probably be leaving behind most of the presents you received the day before – apart from the kids' toys which they can't put down – when you head off to Auntie Susan's. That means someone will be keeping an eye on your house even when the mulled wine is flowing all around! It's probably worth testing your burglar alarm to make sure that everything is working properly.

HANG CHRISTMAS BELLS

Hanging Christmas bells or chimes near bushes outside your house will alert you to anyone who brushes past. This will be most effective on quiet winter nights. It also makes quite a pretty sound! We hope you have found this guide to Christmas safety useful. The overall chances of you getting burgled are slim (a lot narrower than a lot of waistlines in January). That means you should focus on making the festivities as jolly as they can be! Above all have a very merry Christmas and a happy new year.

- Meningitis B Vaccinations – If you were born between 1 September 1996 and 31 August 1997 you are eligible to have this new vaccination which is recommended by Public Health England, again please contact reception to book an appointment.
- Shingles Vaccinations – The age criteria for the vaccinations this year are as follows:
 - Born between 02/09/1944 and 01/09/1946
 - Aged 78 on 01/09/2015
 - Aged 70 on or after 01/09/2013

If you fall into one of the age groups above we shall be writing to you personally over the coming months to invite you for this vaccination, however you can contact reception and book an appointment now as you do not have to wait to be invited.
