

Vicar's Blog:

This has been an unusual week – through my letterbox this week popped a letter from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York. A joint letter asking all Parish Priests to encourage their congregations and communities to pray for our nation in the week leading up to Pentecost on 15th May 2016. They write this:

'At the heart of our prayers will be the words that Jesus Christ himself taught us — 'Thy Kingdom Come, thy will be done.' It is impossible to overstate the life-transforming power of the Lord's Prayer. It is a prayer that is reassuring enough

to be on the lips of the dying and yet dangerous enough to be banned in cinemas. It is famous enough to be spoken each day by billions in hundreds of languages and yet intimate enough to draw us ever closer into friendship with Jesus Christ. It is simple enough to be memorised by small children and yet profound enough to sustain a whole lifetime of prayer. When we pray it with sincerity and with joy, there is no imagining the new ways in which God can use us to His glory'.

I guess that most of us still know the Lord's Prayer and therefore most of us know how to pray and what to pray. Whether we believe it makes any difference I guess is the key. For Christians, prayer is the powerhouse, without it our ministry is barren and empty. I intend that, as Church of England Churches, we do gather in prayer during that week, perhaps in ways that we have not done before. I am toying with the idea of prayer walking around all eight of our churches in that week – praying as we go, and also stopping for prayer for a while in each church. It seems to me a good way of linking our communities and offering people a stopping place. In each of our churches we will provide some prayer resources, so that folk have some ideas about what to pray and have some different ways of praying. For most of our churches the week-end of 14/15 May also leads into the West Lindsey Open Churches week-end when we are open to visitors from right across the country – how wonderful that we can extend a welcome to visitors and offer them places of great beauty, history and powerhouses of prayer.

So, next month we will advertise what we are doing in each of our churches. If you would like to join in, then please feel free to do so – this is open to all praying people and it would be a delight if you could join us. Every blessing



YOUR FREE SEEDS



Saint Clement's Church invites you to take part in a "FREE TO ENTER" competition to grow the TALLEST giant sunflower.

- You can plant the seeds above straight into the garden in the place where you want them to grow, or
- Start them off in plant pots, on a windowsill or in a greenhouse, and do not plant them out until the risk of frost has passed.

Bus stop Improvements:



Improvements are to be made to bus stops at Short Ferry, Chapel Road and the stop near to Ferryside.

Formalised bus stops will make bus travel more accessible for all users, by providing the following facilities:

- Bus stop poles with timetable boards to identify the stopping locations provide bus running times and raise awareness of the services.
- Sections of specialist raised kerbs to aid access on and off the bus, particularly for wheelchair users, those with prams and people with mobility problems.

These works are carried out in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, under which the County Council has permitted development rights to provide bus stop facilities within the highway boundary. In addition all new bus stops are subject to a rigorous safety audit prior to and following construction.

Details of the improvements are also being sent to the local county councillor and adjacent properties. It is hoped that these improvements will be installed within the next few weeks.

Summer will soon be upon us and it is important that we think about the safety of our homes through the summer months, especially if we have sunny weather, out in the garden, mowing the lawn or just having a Bar B Q, how many of us are guilty of leaving the doors and windows open when we are in the back garden.

Open windows and doors may let the fresh air in but they also allow easy access and provide tempting opportunities for thieves who need just seconds to walk or reach in and take purses and other valuables from tables and worktops. Don't give thieves an open invitation. A determined burglar can get through the smallest of open windows. So, whenever you go out - no matter how long for, make sure you shut all windows and doors.

Firstly, I have used some of the remaining monies left in my Councillor Initiative Fund for the Village Hall to offer new ventures i.e. a couple of hire sessions free, just to see if the idea is viable.

One resident has suggested a breakfast club might be popular and I wonder if a "sitting down exercise" club might be both fun and beneficial. Many of us oldies might enjoy meeting in the hall once a week and doing a simple work out to keep our tickers in good shape. A childrens' club might also be a possibility, who knows? If you have any ideas or might like to be a volunteer, please contact the village hall or and I will mention it on your behalf.

Four of the concerns I have as District Councillor are

The lack of money coming back to the villages as a result of development. This was promised as part of the Localism Act but because we failed to get a Local Plan in place for 2013, parishes are getting the houses but not the money. Greetwell and Sudbrooke are two nearby examples. Greetwell has 500 homes coming its way and a number of residents in Sudbrooke would dearly like to extend the village hall to accommodate increased activity: They are getting no help either from S106 money or the District Council. If we in Fiskerton are to get new houses we need to make sure we get our £1 of flesh.

The Bypass, I am slowly assimilating the Inspectors report. In spite of what we were told about losing the bridge to save money, I do not believe money was the issue and when the sums are done I expect the extra cost of the bridge would be little different to the cost of the enquiries. I will distribute my own news-letter on this shortly. The footbridge will be built to take a horse and cart, so I am expecting to see a new business in Cherry Willingham. Horse and Cart hire!The question I am prompted to ask is "would we have been better supported if we paid our council tax to Lincoln rather than Gainsborough? You should read the Inspector's report.

Green bins. At the WLDC full council meeting on 3rd Mach, several of my fellow councillors suggested charging for green bin collection. It is an easy target. The DC is not obliged to collect garden waste, but as we already provide the service, charging for it would seem to be a price increase. There is a £5 cap on increasing Council Tax so I am not sure how that would be affected.

Many of our residents are totally reliant on their OAPs, and have already seen other price rises more than consume this year's pensions increase. Another £30 or so per year would hurt.

My objection is more practical. Fly tipping would increase and the cost of dealing with that would eat in to the extra revenue raised. I wonder if anyone has any ideas on how WLDC could reduce the cost of green bin collections. I have one- but after you!

Open Spaces. There is almost too much information on the Web highlighting the benefits of open spaces to a community. These include mental and physical health benefits, reducing costs to our National Health Service, delaying the onset of *alzheimers* and *dementia*, creating community spirit and reducing anti-social behaviour. Encouraging school children to take up sports has a big impact on obesity and diabetes in later life. Community allotments provide therapeutic health benefits and the chance for lonely people to meet others socially. Space for cricket and football provides a focus in a community and provides enjoyment for players and spectators alike.

There are statements made that suggest that £1 spent on open space can give a return of £23 in reducing the NHS bill and that savings nationally could be £21B. What would that be worth Lincolnshire? £21M? These are not my figures but I am sure they are right.

Lastly, the Neighbourhood Plan, Consultation Meeting Thursday 19th May 7 PM the Village Hall.

Hopefully The Church Commission will be presenting several different possibilities and inviting you to make your comments known. I would have been much happier if this consultation had happened a while ago, but instigating and collecting reports can take time. I am confident the result will be worth the wait. There are a number of issues that need to be thought through, including access, drainage, medical facilities and school numbers and rate of growth, so please come and have your say.


