

Vicar's Blog:

I must begin this blog by congratulating Irmgard Parrott on the recent award of the British Empire Medal (BEM) in the Queen's 90th Birthday Honours List. Irmgard has served our communities on Cherry Willingham Parish Council, on West Lindsey District Council – twice as Chairman; and was a national representative in the WI. She, and her late husband Len, along with a group of dedicated folk have raised funds and overseen the 'resurrection' of All Saints Greetwell – the beautiful church on the land off Greetwell Road, where she is Churchwarden. She has been a stalwart in this community year after year and we are delighted that her service has been rewarded.

Irmgard's award reminds me that right across our communities there is a whole host of people who are giving their time and energy to voluntary organisations that would not function without unpaid support. Charities founded on selfless giving, where no-one asks for reward; people who give of themselves because they are passionate about their community, or about an issue that has touched their life in some way. As I write this, the Queen's birthday celebrations have just come to an end with a celebration on the Mall involving the 600 charitable organisations of which the Queen is patron – people happy to be there to celebrate the occasion, but also happy to give the gifts they have to serve others. That gives me an opportunity to say thank you to the many who support our communities in volunteering – to those who take part in sponsored activities to raise funds, to support our hospitals and hospices and Nursing Homes, serve on Councils, work with the homeless, produce our Newsletters, work with people young and old, visit neighbours and generally oil the wheels of our communities which are great places to live because of the support we offer to one another. Many go unnoticed – but thank you!

Here is a story about going unnoticed....

There was a town in the Alps that straddled the banks of a beautiful stream. The water in the stream was as clear as crystal. Children played in it, the swans and geese swam on it. You could see the rocks and the sand and the rainbow trout that swarmed in it. High in the hills, lived an old man who served as the Keeper of the Springs. He had volunteered so long ago that no-one could remember a time when he wasn't there. He would travel from one spring to another removing branches or fallen leaves or debris that might pollute the water. The work was unseen. One day, however the man took ill and for weeks he was too ill to do his work. High in the mountains the springs went untended, twigs and branches and worse muddled the water, mud and silt compacted the stream bed; farm waste turned parts of the stream into stagnant bogs. For a time, no-one in the village noticed the man was ill, and no-one noticed that the work was not done. But after a while the water was not the same. The swans flew away to live elsewhere, the water no longer was crisp and clear. All noticed the loss of sparkling beauty that used to flow below between the banks of the streams that fed the town. The life of the village depended on the stream, and the life of the stream depended on the keeper of the stream — who had gone unnoticed..... volunteering oils the wheels of communities

Letter from Bishop Christopher:

One of the many privileges of being Bishop of Lincoln is the joy of travelling round the beautiful counties of the diocese, discovering so many interesting places and meeting more inspirational and humbling people than I could ever number. During the month of July, I will be travelling much further than usual, however: to Fiji, to represent the Church of England at an international consultation. I will be one delegate among many from around the world, all of whom will be representing their part of the Anglican Communion. My fellow delegates and I will gather from dioceses and provinces as diverse as Brazil, The Philippines, Central Africa, The Indian Ocean, Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia, and Jerusalem and the Middle East, as well as from England.

We meet as delegates of USPG, a mission agency that believes that every person and every community should be able to live a full life. I will be travelling right around the world to attend the consultation, and meeting partners who face very different challenges from our own. Many of them face daily struggles with the effects of climate (or climate change), geography, war, poverty or famine. Yet I am struck by how similar USPG's belief is to our own desire here in the diocese of Lincoln to see lives transformed through an encounter with the living God.

As members of the same human family across the world, all of us created and loved by God, we are united by so much more than the things that might divide us. I continue to pledge myself to do my part in the building up of God's kingdom in our diocese, so that all the members of this part of the human family have the opportunity of a full life, and to become the people that God has created them to be.

May God bless all his people, wherever they may be, and may the message of his love for the world continue to inspire us in the work of transformation to which he has called us.

'War: Past, Present to Reconciliation'

An Exhibition in the Morning Chapel and St James Chapel. May - September - FREE Entry

Both March and May's meeting were relatively quiet, however both meetings had a number of highways issues reported in the open public open session, as always these will be passed onto LCC Highways for their consideration, but can we remind people of LCC's own reporting tool. The tool can be found at http://www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/report-highway-defects/41433.article or just search for "Lincolnshire highways report" the sooner they are reported they sooner they will be repaired. Speaking of highways County Councillor Ian Fleetwood would like to know of any incidents where peoples' vehicles have been damaged by the poor roads. It was noted that the problems with bird scarers seem to have diminished. Parking issues seem to be on the increase with people parking very inconsiderately and quite often blocking footpaths - The Clerk has been asked to report these to the PCSO.

The damaged tree on High Meadows has been replaced.

At the beginning of May the Teen shelter had been vandalised again, this time a front panel had been kicked totally off the structure, upon inspection it was decided that the structure was unsound and dangerous . So it was with some degree of sadness that the whole shelter had to be removed. However the council would still like to provide a more suitable structure when funding allows.

The new bus shelter for near The Holt is in place and seems to have been well received. There are also now 2 new raised bus stops in the village. The Council have been investigating the possibility of a bus shelter near Ferryside. Unfortunately, the contractor has been to evaluate the site and reported that primarily, because the way the land falls away from the path, it is not a suitable site for a full size shelter with sides. Due to the width restriction the best they could suggest was a half depth cantilever shelter with no sides which it is felt would be of little benefit to residents.

In the May meeting there was a complaint from a Holmfield resident about parents dropping their children off at school, more specifically there were concerns over the speed at which some people were traveling through the estate and the Clerk was asked to contact the school.

TRAVEL VACCINATIONS

It's the time of year when a lot of patients are thinking about their summer holidays. If you are travelling abroad, you are advised to find out if any vaccinations are recommended prior to travel. If they are, we ask patients to complete a travel vaccination questionnaire which can be obtained by popping into the practice or by downloading from the practice website. Once completed, the questionnaire needs returning to the practice and you need to book a convenient appointment with a nurse to administer the vaccines.

Please do not leave it to the last minute as to get the most benefit from the immunisation it is advisable that they are given at least 4 weeks before travel.

REPEAT PRESCRIPTIONS

Please remember to order your repeat prescriptions in plenty of time if you are going on holiday to make sure that you have adequate supplies whilst away. If you need to order a prescription early due to going on holiday please advise the dispensary so that they know why you have requested the medication early.

Some countries have different laws and regulations around medications so please check the Government website which provides more information about specific medications particularly controlled drugs, https://www.gov.uk/travelling-controlled-drugs.







The EU, by the time you read this we will know if we are in or out, which, either way will be a relief. The next big decision coming our way is whether we are to have a mayor for Greater Lincolnshire, which also has both pros and consultations should start no later than 4th July.

Also, since the Neighbourhood Plan meeting on the 19th May, I have had a complaint made about me to the District Council's Monitoring Officer that I may have failed to maintain the statutory principles of the Parish Council's Code of Conduct. So I will not be saying much on that till the issue is cleared.

The Neighbourhood Plan Group held a further well attended meeting and I would like to pick up on several comments made, both by residents and by a group member which I found most interesting.

The first concerned household insurance problems experienced by some residents in St Clement's Drive and not experienced by a member in Meadow Bank Avenue. A quick look on Google Earth has told me why. The properties at the end of St Clement's are shown as just 5m above sea level, the remainder are 6m and on the south of Meadow Bank the height is 7m. I would never have guessed there was a 2m fall between the two. Corn Close for instance is shown at 9m and the Ridings at 8m. This explains to me why some residents in St Clements are anxious about any development to the north of Ferry Rd.

The other was a comment made by one member of the Committee. In giving the Paddock to the village the Church Commission are achieving a substantial uplift to its value. How?

At the moment the Paddock is protected as open space in the 2006 Local Plan and that protection should be carried forward to the Central Lincolnshire Plan 2016-2036. That gives the 1.7 hectare Paddock the value of agricultural or grazing land of perhaps £10,000-£12,000 per acre or, in my guess just under £50,000.

From the comment it would seem West Lindsey has agreed that if the Church Commission give the Paddock to the village they, the Church Commissioners, can offset that 1.7 hectares against the compulsory 10% green space allocation for developments of over 5 hectares.

For a site with outline planning permission a web search suggests a value of slightly over £3/4m per hectare. So by giving the village the Paddock the Church Commissioners' could see its value to them rise substantially. Complicated? Yes, but no one has said the Church Commissioners are not good businessmen.
