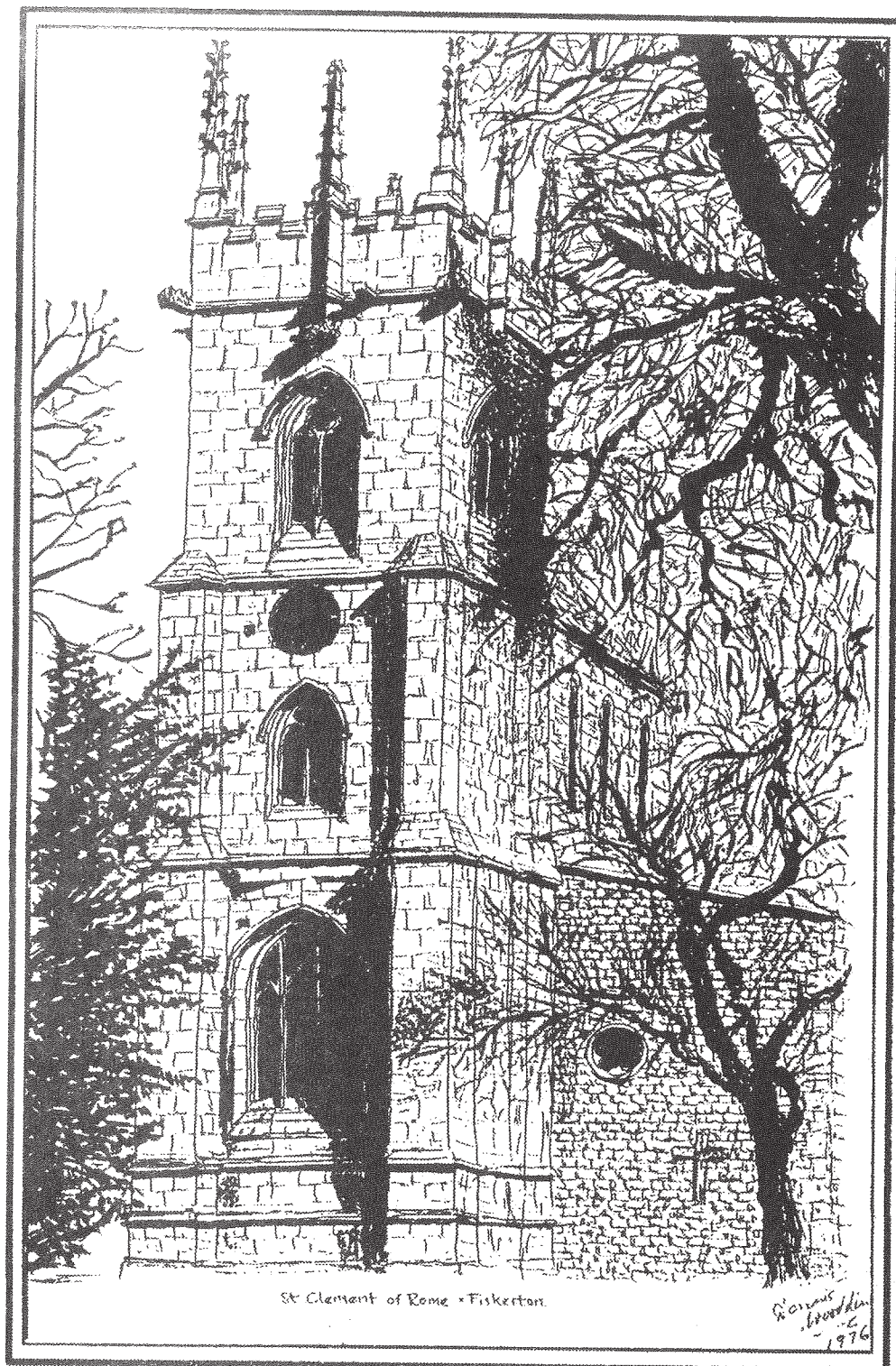

## Vicar's Blog:



I guess like a number of people I have been watching what I can do of the Olympics over the last week or so. Goodness, we are doing amazingly well! As the successful athletes and their families have been interviewed on the news media, I have been struck again by the absolute dedication, the sacrifices made, the attention to detail and the discipline of those who are successful – to someone who doesn't find routine and discipline comes easily, I find that amazing and very, very impressive.

As I was preparing for preaching for this week's Sunday services, the reading of the day said this: *'Let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him, endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of God'.*

I was very struck again by the principles of discipleship i.e. being a 'learner' in the Christian faith and the preparation required by athletes:

- The need to be focussed
- The care over our 'diet'
- Playing the long game

Olympic athletes are so focussed. I have no doubt that there are days when they don't want to get out of bed and train, when they would prefer to hang out with their mates, but their absolute dedication and focus on the end goal means that they resist the distraction and make the sacrifice – I can learn a lot from that – that I need to stay focussed on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith – because only then can I grow in my learning and relationship with God; athletes are very watchful about what they put into their bodies to allow for peak performance – for all of us, I believe that is important – it's not just what we feed our bodies with, but what we feed our minds and spirits and souls with as well – whether or not we are Christians; and we are all in it for the long game – we have a life, we are called to live it well. I am so encouraged by the older folk in our congregations who have lived out their faith year on year for 60, 70, 80, even 90 years. A longevity that means that faith has been at the core of their being whatever their circumstances – however tough it was, they clung on. Like marathon runners they have pushed through pain barriers, overcome injury, done the right things, kept focussed and will inherit all that God has prepared for them – amazing!

So, by the time you read this it will all be over for another 4 years – when everyone will gather in Tokyo. Rio has brought us immense pleasure and there is still the Paralympics to come – while you are watching more incredible feats – admire it and apply it to your own life and your own walk with God.

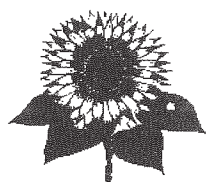

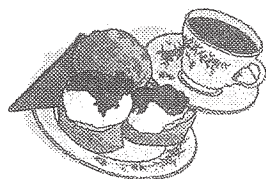

## Fiskerton Parish Council Notes – July's Meeting

*Note: These are brief informal notes from the council. The official detailed minutes of all meetings are available on the website once they have been approved by the following meeting.*

### July Meeting

As usual we commenced with a public open forum for members of the public to raise items for discussion or ask question of the parish council. A member of the public asked "why has the parish council paid £300.00 to have the teen shelter removed"? Unfortunately the shelter was vandalised and in a dangerous condition. A contractor was called in to remove the danger, the remains had timber with nails protruding and was so badly vandalised that it was dismantled and put into store.

### Litter Picking

This has continued around the village hall where there has been a lot of litter. It has been successful and the frequency of litter picking will be reduced after the school holidays.

### Bus Shelter

The clerk is looking into the cost of providing a bus shelter at Short Ferry.

### Footpath behind the Village Hall

It has been noted that equestrians and on off road motor cyclists have been crossing the village hall grounds to access a footpath that leads north towards the old airfield. The path is neither a defined footpath or bridleway. People are advised the path is not maintained and should not be used by horses. Motor vehicles should not drive on land without the land owner's permission. The parish council are investigating the feasibility of installing a gate.

### Local Council Tax Support

West Lindsey District Council is making plans to tackle a deficit in excess of £2 million and is considering removal of the support provided to parishes around the Local Council Tax Support Grant. The effect of this is the equivalent of £5.94 per household. This means that the parish council will need to manage with less funding or reduce services such as grass cutting. Members of the parish council are considering the options.

### Private pumping stations

### Winter Green Bin Collection

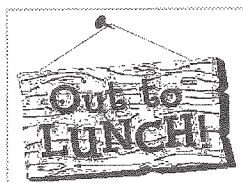
A reminder that West Lindsey District Council operate a paid for green waste collection service through the winter months when the free green bins service is suspended through lack of green waste.

### **Flix In The Stix to Arrive in Fiskerton This September:**

Fiskerton Village Hall committee have partnered with Lincolnshire-based non-profit organisation Blueprint: Film Foundation on their upcoming 'Flix In The Stix' project, bringing monthly cinema screenings to eight rural locations across Lincolnshire.

Beginning in September, **Fiskerton Village Hall** will host a range of fantastic films from a varied programme, including recent releases, award-winning films and classic titles. The film programme has been specially selected by the committee, in partnership with Blueprint: Film Foundation. Films will be screened by a technician on brand-new state-of-the-art equipment, transforming the local hall into a cinema for one evening a month.

There will be food and drink available on site, with proceeds going to the village hall committee. Films will begin at 7.30, but doors will be open from 7pm, so make sure you arrive early to grab your seat! Tickets will be priced at £3, with £1 of all proceeds being donated to the village hall committee for use within the hall and local community. All other box office proceeds are put back into the community cinema, to allow it to continue running each month.

**The programme for the autumn season of Flix In The Stix is as follows:**

#### **Thursday 15th September 2016, 7.30pm - The Lady in the Van (2015)**

Award-Winning actress Maggie Smith stars alongside Jim Broadbent and Alex Jennings in this enjoyable comedy/drama. The Lady in the Van tells the true story of Alan Bennett's strained friendship with Miss Mary Shepherd - played by Maggie Smith - an eccentric, cantankerous homeless woman who forms an unlikely friendship with Bennett after he allows her to temporarily park her van in his driveway. She lives in the van on his driveway for 15 years.

#### **Thursday 20th October 2016, 7.30pm - Spectre (2015)**

Daniel Craig returns as James Bond in this action-packed thriller, directed by Oscar winner Sam Mendes. A cryptic message from Bond's past sends him on a trail to uncover a sinister organisation. Although the camera never leaves Stewart's apartment, Hitchcock uses some clever photography and a wonderfully elaborate set to ratchet as much tension as possible from the situation.

Through Flix In The Stix, Blueprint: Film Foundation aims to provide a low-cost activity for communities around Lincolnshire without the hassle of travelling further afield into surrounding towns and cities. Blueprint: Film Foundation are an innovative community interest group with a passion for film. For almost a decade, they have been delivering a host of film and multimedia projects across Lincolnshire and the East Midlands. This project has been funded in part by the British Film Institute's 'Neighbourhood Cinema' initiative and 'Film Audience Network' (through Film Hub Central East), as well as the 'Awards For All' Big Lottery Fund.

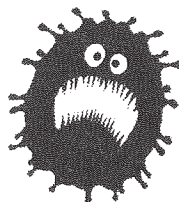
## NETTLEHAM MEDICAL PRACTICE: FLU CLINICS

I am writing this article with sun shining through my window so it seems a little strange to write about flu vaccinations as it always makes me think that summer is over! However, the practice has started to plan the annual flu clinics. We are pleased to announce that our Flu Vaccination clinics will commence at the beginning of October and run periodically until the middle of November. Influenza is a virus causing a lung or respiratory infection. While for most people it is only an unpleasant illness that should pass in about a week, it can cause serious complications, particularly in young children and older adults.

Getting a flu vaccination is the most effective way to stop you catching flu and passing it on to others.

Vaccination is available for patients who fit one of the criteria listed below:

- Pregnant (at any stage of the pregnancy)
- Children aged 2, 3 or 4 years of age (the vaccination is delivered via nasal spray rather than injection)
- A Carer (If you are the main carer for an elderly or disabled person, their well-being could be placed at risk should you fall ill)
- Aged 65 years or over
- Aged 6 months and over and suffer from any of the following conditions:
  - Chronic respiratory disease
  - Chronic heart disease
  - Chronic kidney disease
  - Chronic liver disease
  - Chronic neurological disease
  - Diabetes
  - Immunosuppression



Appointments will be available to book from the beginning of September. You can book an appointment either online (if you have registered to use the online system) via the practice website or by contacting the practice by telephone after 10:30am any day.

## **A Message from United Lincolnshire Hospitals NHS Trust**

United Lincolnshire Hospitals NHS Trust has been briefing staff, stakeholders and the media that due to a severe shortage of doctors in our three A&Es we are looking at reducing the opening hours of our emergency departments.

There is a national shortage of appropriately trained doctors to work in A&Es and along with other trusts in the east midlands ULHT is seriously affected by this. We don't have enough doctors to fill shifts in three departments 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

ULHT emergency departments normally work based on having 15 consultants and 28 registrar or middle grade doctors. At present, we are now down to 14 consultants, of whom 10 are locums, and just 12 middle grades. This means we have only 43% of middle grades we need. We have reached a crisis point and we may put patients at risk if we don't act.

We are now in a situation where we are unable to recruit locums, so our consultant doctors have filled the gaps by doing extra shifts. Our staff are under enormous pressure and the situation is now unsustainable.

Our A&E staff are concerned that if we don't act, patients could be put at risk if we continue as we are. To ensure that we run safe services, we have looked at a number of options. These include reducing the opening hours of our A&Es. We have ruled out reducing the opening hours at Lincoln County Hospital and Pilgrim Hospital, Boston. This is because they both take patients more seriously ill patients and have a higher number of patients attending A&E and being admitted than Grantham and District Hospital does. Our safest option for the people of Lincolnshire is to look at reducing the opening hours at Grantham A&E.

We haven't made a final decision yet, and we hope to avoid this, but the reality is we will need to temporarily reduce the opening hours of A&E at Grantham.

The quality and safety of patient care is the Trust's number one priority and we haven't rested on our laurels. We have tried to recruit in the UK and internationally, and we have offered premium rates to attract agency doctors whilst investing £4 million in urgent care services. Despite this, we have reached crisis point.

We are working with other A&E providers, East Midlands Ambulance Service and the CCGs to find a solution to this crisis to avoid changing A&E services.

We will be working closely with ULHT, local GPs and our community services to develop a range of services to ensure that those people who have less serious illnesses but might currently use A&E can get a service locally during the temporary closure. We will be sharing these plans with the public in the next week.

To help our hospitals, we would always urge everyone to think twice before they go to A&E – if it's not serious or life threatening you shouldn't be there. Many illnesses can be better treated by visiting your local pharmacy, calling 111, visiting your local GP, GP out of hours services, or attending a walk in centre or a minor injuries unit. If you are concerned and need medical advice please contact NHS 111.

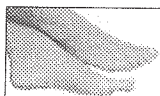

You will be empathetic with good listening skills and understand the sensitive and deeply personal nature of being a victim of certain types of crime especially in relation to Hate crime, scams and doorstep crime.

Dates and times are flexible and can be arranged to fit around the individual volunteer, but the role will require a regular minimum commitment of 4 hours per week. All volunteers receive a local induction and a Volunteer handbook with all the information needed to support you in your role.
