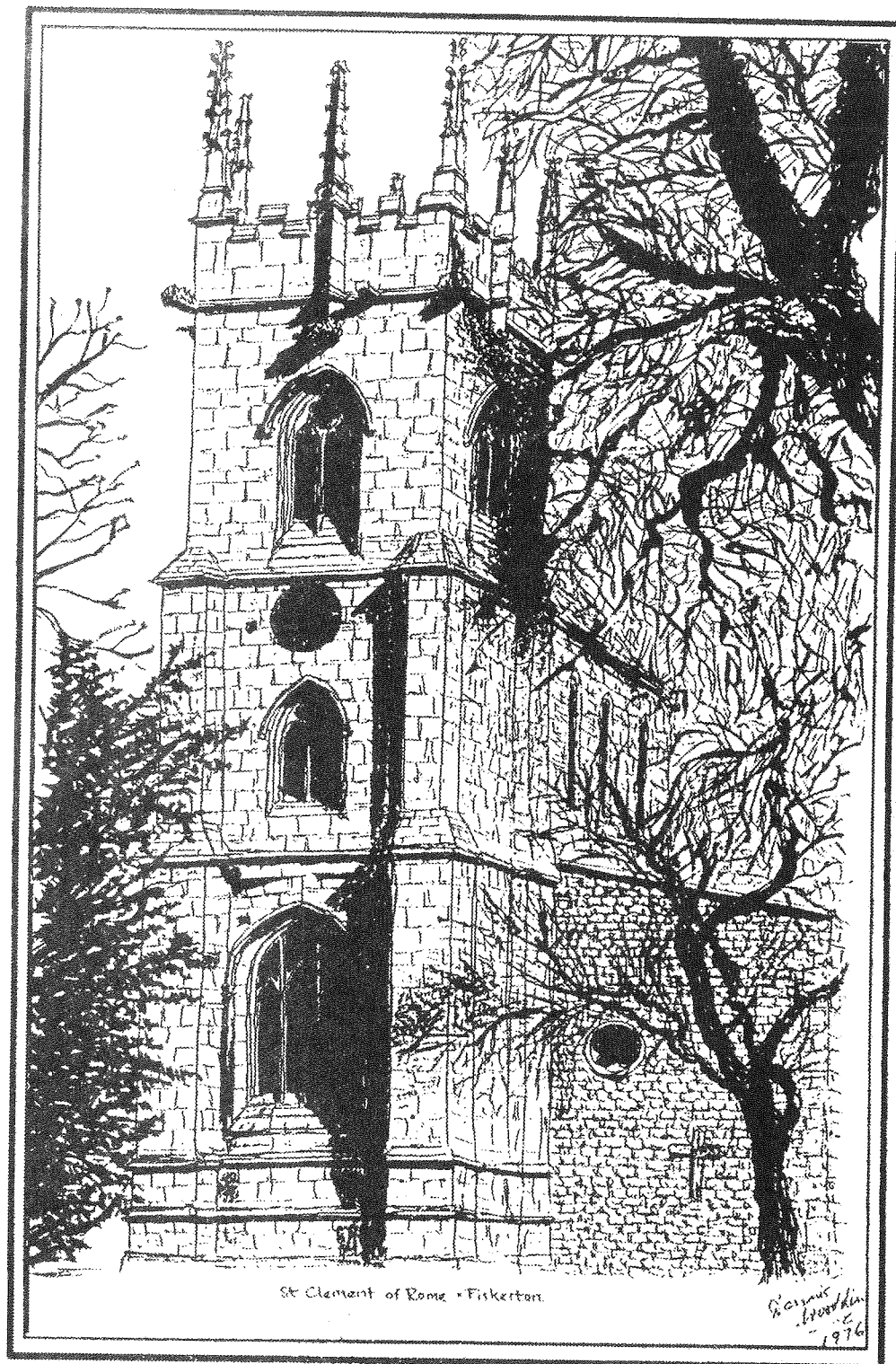
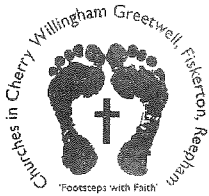

## Vicar's Blog:



I have been in ministry now for 10 years. During that time I guess that the thing I learn again and again, is that Churchyards and the care of them, generate a great deal of emotion. That is probably an obvious statement because of what they represent – for many families they mark a continuing relationship with someone who is no longer with them. I am struck often by the number of people I see who visit a particular churchyard almost daily – at their best they are places of solace and quiet, places of order in what sometimes feels like the chaos of bereavement. I

have eight churchyards in my care: in Fiskerton, the Parish Council kindly pay for the cutting and mowing of the area, however jurisdiction is the task of the Church PCC (Parochial Church Council), along with me as the Vicar.

Churchyards have regulations. Why do we need regulations? Well, the reason is that, like our churches, churchyards form part of our heritage as a community. We are trustees of what we have received from earlier generations. So it is our duty for the sake of generations to come, and for relatives of those who have died and who are buried in a churchyard, to preserve the churchyard's distinctive character as a resting place for the deceased. Some of the regulations are set to make maintenance of the churchyard easier, some are there to provide a uniformity, others are to ensure that nothing is planted which is likely to cause disturbance to the ground, and that one gravespace does not encroach on the next. One common difficulty is that often small objects are left on gravespaces – the difficulty is that these can be damaged (accidentally) when the ground is mown. Imagine the difficulty from the gardener's perspective – no-one wants to offend – but trying to avoid hitting objects with a mower or a strimmer is really difficult. Honestly, one of the things we have not been great at, is communicating what the regulations are and so we are developing a simple leaflet that sets them out – they are set by the Chancellor of the Diocese of Lincoln - so watch this space – I hope that they will be finished by the end of October.

In the meantime I am grateful for all those who keep an eye on these areas and alert us to any difficulties and concerns. These are community spaces, but we have to work within given boundaries and I hope that people feel able to receive what will be set out in our new leaflet. It will not divert from regulations set by our Diocese – but will be put more succinctly.

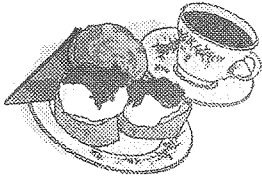

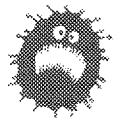

### **FLU CLINICS**

Our Flu Vaccination clinics have now commenced and will continue to run periodically until the middle of November. Influenza is a virus causing a lung or respiratory infection. While for most people it is only an unpleasant illness that should pass in about a week, it can cause serious complications, particularly in young children and older adults. Getting a flu vaccination is the most effective way to stop you catching flu and passing it on to others. Vaccination is available for patients who fit one of the criteria listed below:

- Pregnant (at any stage of the pregnancy)
- Children aged 2, 3 or 4 years of age (the vaccination is delivered via nasal spray rather than injection)
- A Carer (If you are the main carer for an elderly or disabled person, their well-being could be placed at risk should you fall ill)
- Aged 65 years or over
- Aged 6 months and over **and** suffer from any of the following conditions:
  - Chronic respiratory disease
  - Chronic heart disease
  - Chronic kidney disease
  - Chronic liver disease
  - Chronic neurological disease
  - Diabetes
  - Immunosuppression



You can book an appointment either online (if you have registered to use the online system) via the practice website or by contacting the practice by telephone after 10:30am any day.

## Fiskerton Neighbourhood Planning Committee:

### Update:

A series of drop in sessions took place in the Village Hall throughout July and August with the aim of providing residents with information on the various development options available to us and giving people the chance to ask questions of the NPG team. The sessions were very well attended and people were given the opportunity to put their views into a ballot on the various choices.

It was important to everyone that the ballot be open, fair and accurate. To this end, only registered electors could take part in the ballot and once they had made their choice, their ballot papers were placed in a sealed envelope which was then signed across the seal. The papers were opened and counted on Tuesday the 16<sup>th</sup> of August in front of the Chair of Nettleham Parish Council and the Vice chair of the Lincolnshire Association of Local Councils, who kindly acted as independent witnesses.

In all there were 112 responses and 65% voted for Option 1, the east-west option to the north of Ferry Road. Option 2, the L shaped development north of Ferry Road, received 28% of the vote. Options 4 and 5 received 4% and 3% respectively and Options 3 and 6 got no votes.

If you cannot remember all of the details about the various options, the details are still available on the website under the Neighbourhood Plan section ([www.fiskerton-lincs.org.uk](http://www.fiskerton-lincs.org.uk)). They are also on the Facebook page, search for "Fiskerton Neighbourhood Planning Group" and look under Files. The full results are also there.

The Group are aware that District Councillor Darcel also conducted a poll but unfortunately it was not regulated or monitored so we cannot include those numbers in the official results. Also some of the options offered were slightly different and we have seen 3 different sets of results. If we did include them, it would distort the figures and it could no longer be considered a fair ballot, as some people would have had two votes and there is no way of knowing if only residents of the parish had voted or even if they had voted more than once. Out of interest we did try to incorporate the numbers and option 1 was still clearly in front with 35% of the vote.

However using the official figures, 65% for Option 1 and 28% for Option 2 is a really clear, positive result which will enable the plan to be developed further, there is still work to be done and the plan will continue to evolve, for example the views of the WLDC meeting will need to be taken on board. For now though the NPG would like to thank everyone for their patience and for taking the time to come and express their views.

The next step will be to hold a Design Forum (Drop-in) to ask residents about what they feel is good and bad design in the village. What features you would want to preserve through design and to look at potential options for housing types and design. Shortly after the information from the Design Forum has been assessed, the next version of the Draft Neighbourhood Plan should be published.

Another month gone, and I am sorry I missed last month's copy deadline, so, working backwards this is a quick resume of events over the last couple of months.

Starting Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> September, the Lincolnshire Independents group of Councillors held an open meeting in the village hall. The meeting was well attended and Imogen, the trainee Canine Carer puppy was a hard act to follow, but she was run close by Mrs Henderson of the Nettleham Patient Participation Group, Cllr Mrs Bates from Greetwell Parish Council on the need for a crossing on the A158, and Andy Booth, Town Planner, on the detailed planning going into the Cherry Willingham Neighbourhood Plan and lastly by County Cllr Marianne Overton, MBE, who highlighted the inequity of developers making fortunes out of large developments and putting nothing back into the community. All their talks were most informative and very well presented.

To me there were two different stars of the evening, John Pape, the folk singer. John had everyone tapping their toes and joining in to the chorus of the Lincolnshire Poacher and Mrs Pyecock and her team who, as if by magic, who produced the very tasty steak pie and peas with to the minute timing. Thanks to all who came and contributed to a most enjoyable evening.

The previous Tuesday I attended the Planning Inquiry for 125 new homes in Langworth at Gainsborough. As far as I could see it did not go well. The appellant had a 7 man team of experts, West Lindsey did not. As a member of the public you could see the advantage this gave the developer. It is to late for Langworth but I did learn a serious lesson should this village be forced down the same road.

This brings me on to the Open Forum held 28<sup>th</sup> July. (If you are tired of the Neighbourhood Plan don't read on.) Fifteen months ago the Church Commissioners told me by both phone and by email, that they would rather see a plan similar to Plan A, which at the time had a football field to the north of the village hall, but that they were only "consultees" and would not force the issue. Provided they got the houses they did not mind where the houses went. Apparently the Church Commissioners have now confirmed new homes can be located to the west of the village, if the village so chooses. This is not surprising, under the Neighbourhood Plan process, the Local Authority has the power to use Compulsory Purchase Orders to bring land to the market.

Everyone I have spoken who was at the Open Forum, 28th July, thought the evening was well worth attending. Mark Sturgess, the West Lindsey Director of Planning, led the meeting. Mark enquired of residents their concerns, of which flooding, drainage, traffic and sewage disposal were high on the list. Open spaces and housing mix were discussed and one eagle eyed resident picked up on the proximity of a games area to dwellings. There are yardsticks for good design and whoever finally draws up the plan will need to pay full attention to such matters.

Mark is planning to hold a further joint meeting with both the NPG and residents in the near future to resolve how the village moves forward. The Neighbourhood Plan needs to both meet the legislation requirements, gain the support of the District Council, the Inspector and of course the majority in the village.

There is so much else to talk about, including "Who pays for our grass cutting?" but there is neither time nor space to do so here.

Lincolnshire Police in partnership with Trading Standards are working to raise awareness in the county about Doorstep Crime. This covers Distraction Burglaries and Rogue Traders.

Neighbourhood Policing Teams throughout the county are holding coffee mornings, “meet the street”, lunch clubs and other engagement events throughout the week.

Neighbourhood Watch coordinators across the county have also got involved in raising awareness and are holding their own events and distributing advice.

Although these crimes are infrequent, the impact of them on the victims can have serious consequences as they are often targeted at the elderly and vulnerable members of our communities.

**“I’m from the Water Board, there’s a leak down the road. I need to check your water supply”**  
If someone came to your door and said that – what would you do?

This is one of the most common lies used. Do you know that the term “Water board” is no longer used by legitimate callers?

If this happens for real don’t open the door. Even if they insist it’s an emergency. Contact your water supplier, their number can be found on your water bill. If they continue to insist you open the door, tell them you’re going to call the police on 999 – and do it.

**Other lies they use to convince you to let them in ...**

**“I need to read your meter”**

Check their identity before you let them in. Call your gas, electricity or water company direct using the number from a recent bill.

**We are the Police, we’ve caught a burglar, we think he’s stolen your cash and we need to check your money is safe”**

Genuine Police Officers will never do this. Call the real Police straight away on 999.
