Vicars Blog:



We are used to our newsreaders readers being their usual calm and professional selves as they deliver the daily round of news to us on whatever channel/s we watch. So it did cause a slight stir recently when Kate Somerville, at the end of a report on the BBC lunch-time news was obviously moved to tears by what she had seen. The reason for her lack of composure was a report on the children of Aleppo, on aid workers who are constantly having to battle against all the odds to save the

lives of children and adults who are caught in the crossfire between warring factions. I guess that Kate Somerville was mirroring the feelings of most of us when we watched that report as we watched the desperation, and sadness and brokenness, the tears and deep trauma.

It is very difficult I think, to imagine living in such traumatic circumstances and to understand how to continue to fight for some kind of 'normal' existence in the midst of such inhumane circumstances, and I guess that like many others I ask questions of God in this – where is God in the suffering? For many this is a key question when they think about God. In many ways there is no intellectual answer to that – read the book of Job, a book about suffering – Job had everything taken from him and everything thrown at him— in the end God appears to him and doesn't answer any of Job's questions – and Job says, 'now I see'. As Christians 'the seeing' is about seeing the crucified God, Jesus on the cross, who became part of the suffering and calls us to live faithful lives, to be loving, hospitable and generous people. The Book of Psalms provides us with examples of people who poured their hearts out to God over various tragedies and difficulties, some who screamed in anger, some who wept, some who cried out for mercy – in the face of the situation in Syria, and in many other parts of the world, that I think is the only response we can make. Our world is messy and there are no neat answers to complex questions, but I do believe that in the midst of the mess, Jesus stands with the poor and the broken and it is my/our task to stand there too, praying.

When I watch all this on the news I am reminded that my petty aggravations over silly things or my quickness to moan when something goes wrong is all very trivial in the scheme of things; that I live in a good and pleasant land, in freedom, with food on the table with a roof over my head – there is much to be thankful for.





Neighbourhood Plans: Second West Lindsey Open Forum: 21st November 7.30pm.

Several of you have been asking Mike Strawson, who chaired the meeting in the Village Hall on 28th July, and myself what is happening? Things are moving forward and West Lindsey are holding the second meeting at the Village Hall, starting at 19.30pm on Monday 21st to give us all an up-date. Mike will again chair the meeting, and Mark, WLDC Director for Planning, will again act as facilitator to help ensure fair play all round. Since the last meeting, Mark had a meeting with the NPG and presented our questions to them. They are now fully aware of the concerns of the residents and have provided answers to most of the questions. Presentation of these answers by the NPG will be on the agenda on 21st November.

The NPG has not been sitting on their hands and have produced a draft plan, taking into account the points from the various meetings and changes in views and perceptions. They will present this to the meeting. After that presentation there will be a Question and Answer session. Mark will again be keeping a record of these discussions. This will then be followed by the NPG explaining the process to take matters forward, and give us an estimated timetable. I understand that the NPG has also organised 2 drop in sessions after this general meeting where any further questions can be asked and further explanations given.

Please do your best to attend on 21st November. This really will be the best opportunity you will have to make your views known and understand the procedures.

The plan will shape the future of the village for years to come, so we might as well get it right!

October has been a busy month.

Street lighting problems, missed green bin collections, the Mayor for Lincolnshire project, speeding along Fiskerton Rd at the Waterford Lane junction in Cherry Willingham and queries regarding the information contained in Police Reports given to Parish Councils and pre teenage vandalism on the Holmfield Estate have all filled my "in box".

Street Lighting is not a West Lindsey matter but the "LCC Help Desk" has proved most helpful. Once the clocks have gone back, LCC lights should go off at midnight and come on again at 6 am. There may be some local exceptions but that is the information I have been given. Three lights have been fixed in Fiskerton Rd, Cherry Willingham, and West Lindsey District Council voted to support the Mayor. I and a number of members voted against. I am not against Unitary Authorities and they do make sense to me, but I would rather the details were sorted out before we signed up, not afterwards as seems to be the case in Lincolnshire.

On Police Reports, as a result of queries raised at Langworth Parish Council, I am having discussions with the police to see if Reports to Parish Councils could be more meaningful. It would seem that such reports might help make the public more aware of local incidents and if implemented could even save the police time and money!

Life is a two way trade. What has pleased me most is the number of residents who have kindly emailed or phoned me to say "Thanks" for following up their queries. It makes my day. At the last Langworth Parish Council I was thanked for supporting the Parish at the Planning Inquiry for a 125 new home development off Barlings Lane. Together with the vice chair, we were able to persuaded the Inspector that the 125 new homes as planned for the village was not a sustainable development. Langworth does not have a Neighbourhood Plan but that was not considered important!

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE

The NPG expect to complete the current draft of the Neighbourhood Plan by the end of October. The Plan will be available for public consultation for 7 weeks during November and December and drop-ins for the village residents have been organised for **Tuesday November 22nd**, **7.00-9.00 pm** and **Saturday November 26th**, **2.00-6.00 pm** both in the Village Hall.

It was with some degree of surprise that members of the Neighbour Plan Group and some Parish Councillors read the recent article in the Parish News (Oct'16), where claims to have had evidence for some fifteen months were made - that the Church Commissioners had changed their stance on building locations. It is difficult to understand why this evidence was not passed onto the Parish Council or Neighbourhood Plan Group as the bodies responsible for drafting the Neighbourhood Plan. Had this information been shared at that time then it is possible a lot of problems and worries could have been avoided.

The information would have been incorporated into the draft plans at that time and the Neighbourhood plan would have been significantly nearer being complete.

Members of the NPG will be available at both of the drop-ins to provide clear explanations and justifications for the current draft plan.

Editor's Note: Paragraph 2 of this piece from the NPG has been included as a minimal "right of reply" to comments made in an article written in the October Newsletter. Whilst we are very keen for the Newsletter to reflect what is happening in Fiskerton, we do not wish it to become a vehicle for disagreements to be aired. It is evident that the neighbourhood plan has provoked strong feelings within the village, but request that these are pursued and resolved by other means.
