

#### Vicars Blog:

#### **Loneliness**



Over January there seems to have been quite a lot on the news and radio about the issue of Loneliness. It does seem particularly acute over the winter months because of the short days, long nights and to some extent the weather drives us back into our homes. For many, loneliness appears to be enforced - it is difficult and maybe impossible to leave the home; for some, circumstances cause loneliness - the loss of a loved one, the isolation of a broken relationship; the responsibilities of caring for another; of course, we can be lonely

in a crowd of people and in a relationship/ However it comes, it is tough to adjust to and to deal with.

I do wonder how many people this affects in Fiskerton and I wonder if there is anything we can do to help? I recently read about an initiative to help with this issue, trying to enable groups of people across the generations to meet together for a tea party. The gathering is normally in a home and is designed to help people build relationships across the generations. It's simple and it seems to work ..... is anyone interested? Would anyone join me in holding a tea party? Is there anyone out there who wants to come to a tea party at the vicarage to break the monotony of their own four walls? If so, please contact me. One of the difficulties I find in trying to contact people is that those who are feeling lonely, don't tend to put themselves forward - I realise it's a bold thing to do, but why not try? Or maybe - ask a neighbour to do it for you!

We are now approaching Lent in the Church year. Our season of preparation for Easter. It is the time when we remember Jesus taking himself away from everyone and everything to prepare for three years of teaching, healing, being with crowds of people and ultimately where He faced the cross and resurrection. He had to face Himself too, with many temptations, and to understand His identity as the Christ, the Son of God. On His own He found solitude – an ability to be Himself in the presence of His Father, to face the future with courage and to resist every distraction that was thrown at Him. He came away from 40 days apart, to a place of assurance and peace and knowing His true identity.... may we all know that strength and that peace. Every blessing,

St. Clement's Church will be open as usual, for both days (as will all the Churches in our Benefice).


#### ST. CLEMENT'S SCARECROW WEEKEND.

#### Annual Parish Meeting - Monday 20th March - 6-45pm

This annual meeting is the opportunity for community groups to report their activities and for residents to put forward ideas and aspirations for improvements for the community. There are usually representatives from Lincolnshire Police, Lincolnshire Highways, The Hodgson's Charity, The Neighbourhood Plan Group, the village hall managers, The Scouts and Fiskerton Primary School. Their reports give residents an insight into local activities. The meeting is followed by a meeting of the parish council which begins at 7:30pm.

#### **Allotment Gardens**

The parish council has number of allotments that are rented out to local people. The allotments are situated on land to the south of High Street. The rent for a small plot is £3:00 for a full year. One of the gardens has been vacated and is available. The plot is reasonably weed free and in fair condition. It is a good time of year to begin gardening. #### **Bus Shelter**

The new bus shelter for Short Ferry is imminent and may even be in place by the time you read this article. The parish council has also committed to the provision of a bus shelter at Ferry Road Fiskerton. The installation of a shelter at Ferry Road is subject to the approval of Lincolnshire County Council in their capacity as the Highway Authority and providing the necessary consents are granted a shelter place could be in place by summer.

#### Grass cutting for 2017

Despite reductions in the county councils contribution toward grass cutting the parish council has committed to maintaining a two weekly cut throughout the 2017 season. This includes highway verges, the airfield memorial, public spaces at The Crescent and Holmfield and the cemetery. **Litter**



First, I watched highlights from a ladies rugby match on Sunday. Normally, I do not watch rugby on TV, I find it difficult to follow. This was different. The game was fast, furious, open and well thought out. To me, a non-expert, it seemed the tries were brilliant and ball control spot on. I am looking forward to the next time England play. I have since been told the English team are all professionals and on top of the world. You might be interested in some of the topics raised in my coffee, cake and chat afternoons.

In Cherry Willingham the Hawthorn Rd closure is still contentious and I am working on a letter to the new Secretary of State to see what might be done. I will need all the support I can get. Would anyone like to set up a Facebook page?

With regards to the health service, a number of residents with expert knowledge raised different aspects of the problems including "Why was money for health and adult social care not ring fenced? Poor hospital planning, financial and man management and that funding should come out of general taxation and not the council tax." I have since been told by someone experienced in the matter that "it is difficult to make care in the community work, and while the previous system may not have been ideal, it did give those requiring treatment a secure environment". Any thoughts?

Several other topics were raised, including the use of LEDs for street lighting. Apparently LEDs give out more blue light than other lights and a quick search on Google reveals why there was concern. Over 50 years ago when I was a student, different lights and light patterns were being experimented with to control growth patterns in glass house crops. Some types of lights and schedules had adverse effects on plant growth and if extrapolated up to humans, we may be saving money by using LEDs for street lighting but putting up our bill somewhere else. We have a senior member of the Institute of Street Lighting in our midst and I look forward to hearing his comments.

Other proposals included:-

A "through" bus route from Bardney, Short Ferry, Fiskerton... My first reaction was all the open space with no passengers but on further thought, it would help protect the service from Fiskerton to Short Ferry and enable residents in Bardney to get to get to the hospital on just one bus. The service would be one more step in building a sustainable community.

That Village Community Hubs could encourage across the age gap communication. The suggestion was much better put on the day, but when Mrs Farrell, Ian Fleetwood and others helped the teenagers build the youth shelter I thought many of the teenagers involved gained found the experience.

Green Corridors for wildlife and Greetwell Parish Council's disappointing response from LCC over a Pelican Crossing were also discussed. As we discovered recently it only takes one pedestrian and one lorry driver for there to be a fatal accident. That only a few pedestrians cross the road at Greetwell is not the issue. Crossing the road there is dangerous for the old and young alike and I would hate to see another accident happen before action is taken.

The Neighbourhood Plan:- In my recent travels round the village I was accused by one acquaintance of dividing the village by supporting residents along Ferry Rd. A number of residents, either side of Ferry Rd and elsewhere, are opposed to NPG's proposal to build north of Ferry Rd. The Ferry Rd residents were accused of NIMBY ism. This is fine by me. I was a NIMBY when the compost site on the old airfield was proposed. I cannot see why anyone who is proud of, and enjoys their home, should have that enjoyment spoilt without very good reason. If one option upsets 200 residents or more then I would seriously look at the alternative options first. Even then I would seek further ways of reducing the impact.

The Neighbourhood Plan legislation and the introduction to the Fiskerton Plan state, or did state, that residents can, if preparing a Neighbourhood Plan, choose where they want development to go. A number of different proposals have been suggested by residents and NPG have given their reasons why they felt these options were not suitable. On several occasions these reasons have been based on comments made by the Church Commission. But the Church Commissioners have, I believe, changed their statement. It is still for the residents to choose in a democratic vote where the new homes should go and how many there should be.


